### Is it Kosher for Passover? Rabbi Nancy Myers

April 2017



"And you shall observe the Feast of Unleavened Bread; for in this same day have I brought your ranks out of the land of Egypt; therefore shall you observe this day in your generations by an ordinance forever. In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at evening, <u>you shall eat unleavened bread</u>, until the twenty first day of the month at evening. <u>Seven days shall there be no leaven</u>

<u>found in your houses; for whoever eats that which is leav-</u> <u>ened</u>, that soul shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he is a stranger, or born in the land. <u>You shall eat</u> <u>nothing leavened</u>; in all your habitations shall you eat unleavened bread." Exodus 12:17-20

Passover is one the most widely observed Jewish holidays. Sitting with family and friends enjoying the Passover seder, hearing the four questions, eating matza ball soup, and looking for the afikoman captivates children as well as adults. It is at this time of year, surprisingly, I get the most questions about foods that are kosher for Passover. Within our own community people keep Passover in differing ways. Some only eat matzah at the seder while others try to keep the Passover laws during the entire week. Some eat corn, rice, and beans during Passover while others avoid these things along with all their derivatives such as corn starch, oils, and syrups. As a Reform rabbi, I don't normally get many questions about kashrut but they seem to come up more at this time of year.

The Torah tells us to eat unleavened bread during Passover and to avoid eating and having anything that is *hametz*, i.e. leavened, in our homes. But what is leaven? In Mishneh Pesachim 2:5 (a 3<sup>rd</sup> century CE rabbinical work), we are told that in order to fulfill our obligation on Passover we must eat unleavened wheat, barley, spelt, rye and oats. This is because these are the very same products that have the potential to become *hametz* if not scrupulously watched in their initial preparation. What makes our matzah kosher for Passover is that it has been carefully timed from the moment water came into contact with the wheat to prevent any 'leavening' from occurring. So any food without a Kosher for Passover symbol containing wheat, barley, spelt, rye and oats is considered *hametz* and is strictly forbidden during Passover.

I have to say that it's fairly easy to avoid spelt. What is spelt anyway? Barley is not found in many products. Abstaining from rye bread isn't much of an imposition. Oats can be more difficult but most of us can forgo oatmeal for breakfast. It is wheat though that makes things challenging. What this means is no wheat pasta, bread, crackers, cereals, soy sauce (yes, I was seriously bummed to learn that it contains wheat), snacks, and etc.

What about corn, peanuts, peas, millet, lentils, and rice? Now, this gets to be a bit more complicated but it all comes down to whether you are or want to observe Ashkenazi (East European) or Sephardic (Spanish) customs.

The Ashkenazi rabbis beginning in the 13th century decided to add legumes and seeds to the list of prohibitions while the Sephardic rabbis did not. What is the reason given for the additional stringency of our Eastern European ancestors? Firstly, rice and legumes could be cooked in such as way as to resemble the five forbidden grains so that if one eats a rice cake, for example, they may accidentally eat a wheat one. Secondly, the five grains could get mixed up with rice or legumes in the fields or packaging, especially in a pre-modern setting and therefore, we should avoid them. The last reason is "keeping the traditions of our ancestors", namely, because our grandparents observed Passover in this way, we should continue with the practice.

On other hand, our Mishneh states quite clearly that **only** wheat, rye, oat, spelt, and barely can become *hametz*, i.e. leavened. In the Talmud Pesachim 35a, we learn that rice and millet cannot become leavened, they can only decay or spoil, therefore they are not considered *hametz*. Maimonides, in the Middle Ages, also emphasized that only the five grains are prohibited. "Rice, millet, beans, lentils and the like, though, cannot become *hametz*; even if one kneads rice flour or the like in boiling water and covers it with a cloth until it swells up like dough which has fermented, this is permitted for eating on Passover." (See Chametz Umatzah 5:1 and Artscroll "The Festivals in Halachah") Since corn, beans, and legumes are not considered *hametz* then of course their oils and by products would be considered suitable for Passover.

So what will it be? A Sephardic Passover or Ashkenazi? Hmmm, the decision of course is yours alone. And remember it's only for 7 days anyway.... Chag Sameach!

During March, Israel's ruling coalition continued to show signs of stress. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Finance Minister Moshe Kahlon came into direct conflict over the replacement of the existing public broadcasting authority with an entirely new one. While it lasted only 24 hours it raised the issue of early elections. At this point no party leader in the coalition is willing to take that step, least of all the far right parties. However they are staking out positions to put themselves in a favorable light when the time comes. Regular elections are not scheduled until November 2019. According to the Jerusalem Post Moshe Kahlon, leader of the Kulanu party that he founded as a breakaway from the Netanyahu led Likud party, does want to make his mark as a leader in finance. Former Foreign Minister Lieberman is staking out his position as a pragmatic mainstream right leader, while Bennett's Jewish Home Party in recent polls shows that it could gain 3 new seats if the election were held now.

One of the reasons that Netanyahu might consider a new election is that it could delay, or eliminate the possibility of his criminal indictment, anticipated shortly, on charges of receipt of significant gifts from businessmen, and for limiting competition in the press in exchange for positive coverage. The other reason is that the US administration is giving off signals in ongoing discussions that it may not be as far from past US positions than was proclaimed during the campaign. The moving of the US Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem is on hold, and there are now indications of ongoing discussions on the US not opposing a plan for building in the short term on the West Bank in return for a freeze on future construction; a major shift in the administration's position. A new election would delay any negotiations. The two state solution may yet come out of hibernation. The Jerusalem Post also reports that Palestinian Authority President, Mahmoud Abbas, said on Monday in Brussels that the new initiative by US President Donald Trump to attempt to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict holds promise. He said, "We are hoping the people of Israel will not miss this opportunity to make

peace." Abbas will attend the Arab League meeting in Jordan. President Trump's Special Representative for International Negotiations Jason Greenblatt, who has spent the last two weeks meeting with Israelis and Palestinians, will attend as an observer.

On March 7, 2017, the Israeli Knesset approved legislation aimed at barring supporters of the BDS (boycott, divestment, and sanctions) movement from entering the country. It applies to anyone who knowingly issues a public call to boycott Israel that has a reasonable possibility of leading to a boycott. In addition to applying to those who call for boycotts against Israel, the bill also prohibits entry to those who support boycotts against Israeli institutions as well as settlements. The bill was roundly criticized by organizations inside and beyond Israel. The US Anti-Defamation League expressed that the law violates basic democratic rules of an open society. American Jewish Committee, a staunch friend of Israel, said the law hurts rather than helps the Anti-BDS efforts. One special note is that Anat Hoffman, founding member and Director of the Women of the Wall, and the Executive Director of the Israel Religious Action Center (IRAC) of Israel's Reform Movement visited Southern California in March. She attended Chapman University's Rodgers Center for Holocaust Education's Annual Art and Writing award ceremony as the guest of our own Frieda Caplan. Frieda invited Cathy and me to join them. Anat was witty and bright and willing to discuss her role in Israeli Society. Under her leadership IRAC has become a leader in challenging and winning court cases to promote pluralism, fight sex discrimination, and achieve democratic treatment for all Israel's residents. Possibly one day we can have her speak at Temple Beth David






