

What a great joy it was to celebrate Charlie Niederman's Bar Mitzvah on March 24, 2018 or 8th day of Nisan 5778 on Shabbat Hagadol. Some of you are aware that Jews can have second Bar or Bat Mitzvah at the age of eighty three. This is because Psalms 90:10 states, "The span of our life is seventy years." For those who live

beyond seventy, it is as though they have second start on life and therefore thirteen years later one can have a Bar/Bat Mitzyah.

Larry Davidoff said afterwards that thankfully at 70 years and 8 days there isn't a second Brit Milah, i.e., circumcision.

It felt especially nice doing it at the Lay Led Minyan. Every Saturday morning, a group of people come together to pray, debate, laugh, and celebrate Shabbat together at 9:00 a.m. It is very warm and welcoming. Some there are very knowledgeable and others are just at the beginning of their exploration into Judaism. 
Along with the above, the Junior Choir will be singing to you and for you during the brunch session. A true song delight for every mom!!

There have been a few references in the media to the yet to be announced U. S. administration's Israeli and Palestinian peace plan that was covered in last month's article. We await the plan, though we know that there will be problems in negotiating it.

The article this month was intended to cover the Israeli election system because it is good to understand how small minority parties can carry so much sway. It was timely because the current governing coalition recently avoided a problem that would have triggered a motion of no confidence. It may face another problem because the police recently presented to Israel's Attorney General a recommendation that Prime Minister Netanyahu be indicted for back room dealing for favorable press in a very popular newspaper and for accepting nearly \$300,000 in gifts over 10 years. He is also being investigated for potentially a far more explosive scandal involving, a \$2 billion deal for the purchase of submarines and missile ships from a German Company. Critics have described that episode as perhaps the biggest corruption case in Israeli history, touching on deep conflicts of interest and national security. But the investigation that could precipitate a government crisis will take months. However a new event that cannot be ignored arose Friday.

Thousands of Gazans marched to the border with Israel on Friday in the largest such demonstration in recent memory, calling for Palestinians to be allowed cross the border to return to land that their ancestors fled from in the 1948 War of Independence and to remove the border fence. It was dubbed the "March of Return." I saw the organizer interviewed on BBC News. He described the march as passive resistance, but he would not explain why young boys were encouraged to go to the front to use sling shots and by some reports Molotov cocktails against the Israeli troops. That seems to fit the Israel Defense Force (IDF) description that Hamas, who organized the march, specifically placed civilians at the front of what became a riot. It does not really explain why the troops fired live ammunition against the rioters. The IDF claimed that they killed 10 Hamas military wing gunmen of the total of 16 deaths. Hamas acknowledged the death of their military wing members in their passive demonstration. It also appears that Iran has decided not to continue its financial support for Hamas, so some see the riot as an attempt to impress their former major sponsor to continue support.

The IDF considers its handling of the "March of Return" border riots on Friday to have been effective and legitimate. The security fence was not breached or badly damaged. Border security was maintained and Hamas was rebuffed. The military called their response "a success."

Now Israel must face the diplomatic and political reactions. The political opposition was split on the use of force against the Gazan protesters, Avi Gabbay's Zionist Union and Yair Lapid's Yesh Atid minority parties backed the military on Saturday. Gabbay said he had "no doubt our soldiers did everything to reduce the number of casualties" and Lapid maintained he was "proud" of the troops. Israeli Arab lawmakers voiced support for the Palestinian protesters on the Gaza border and joined leftwing Meretz in a call for an investigation.

Diplomatically, the US blocked a draft UN Security Council resolution condemning Israel's actions. Deputy Minister for Diplomacy Michael Oren Twittered "Israel regrets civilian casualties but all were caused by Hamas... that is recognized as a terror group by the US and Europe. Hamas murders hundreds of innocent Israelis while using Palestinians as shields.

It is using them still while trying to destroy Israel. We must defend ourselves."

"The EU mourns the loss of life. Our thoughts are with the families of the victims," the Union's foreign policy chief, Federica Mogherini, said in a Saturday <u>statement</u>. She continued that Israel's use of live ammunition should be subjected to an "independent and transparent investigation. While Israel has the right to protect its borders, the use of force must be proportionate at all times," She added that freedom of expression and freedom of assembly "are fundamental rights that must be respected."

Defense Minister Avigdor Liberman, a noted hawk, declared that "I don't understand the choir of hypocrites who call for a commission of inquiry. They got confused and thought that Hamas organized the Woodstock Festival yesterday and that we should give them flowers."

For all the aggrieved cynicism, the fact remains that incidents in which Israeli forces kill groups of Palestinians prompt a difficult diplomatic aftermath. The coming days will determine how difficult.

Much of the reporting above, about the clash at the Gazan border was paraphrased or excerpted from the Times of Israel.






