

President's Message

Earlier this month, seven of our TBD high schoolers went to Washington D.C. to participate in the L'Taken Seminar, which is a social action seminar hosted by the Religious Action Center and the Union for Reform



Judaism. The goal of the seminar is to have the youth learn about, and make presentations regarding, different social action initiatives about which they feel passionate. This was the first time TBD has ever participated in this seminar, and as one of the six chaperones who accompanied our youth on this trip, I can tell you it was an amazing time. During our weekend (which was one of six different weekends when the seminar is held each year), there were about 300 kids from 30 Reform Congregations around the U.S. Sure it might have been a brisk 10 degrees outside (the bomb cyclone hit D.C. the day before we got there), but the frigid air did not slow anyone down. In addition to researching topics involving the environment, gun control, and immigration reform, the kids toured the Holocaust Memorial, the Smithsonian, the Martin Luther King and Jefferson Memorials, the Supreme Court, and more. The trip culminated with the kids presenting the speeches they prepared to staffers at Congressman Alan Lowenthal, Senator Kamala Harris, and Senator Dianne Feinstein's offices. A special thank you goes out to the Temple Beth David Foundation, the Long Beach Jewish Federation, and the Religious Action Center for their generosity in sponsoring our congregation's first trip. I hope that this will be the first of many such trips to come for our TBD youth. The passion and the excitement was palpable.

The on again, off again peace negotiations between Israelis and Palestinians that have run so long with very little to show have clearly taken a new turn. In the past the US position on the negotiations by both Republican and Democratic administrations has been generally to take an even handed leadership role. The moving of the US embassy to Jerusalem appeared to indicate a more sympathetic attitude to the Israelis. The President's comments in Davos, threatening to stop aid to Palestinians if they do not negotiate, seems to make it clear that the approach toward the Palestinians has moved from the carrot to the stick. The administration still has negotiators pushing both publicly and privately for some kind of agreement. It seems unlikely that a two state solution is possible, but stranger things have been created by the current administration.

In mid January Israel's Defense Minister, Avigdor Lieberman, banned the Sephardic Chief Rabbi and two others from participating in Israeli Defense Force events because of their comments and strong opposition to the long standing integration of women in the IDF. Lieberman's action has not improved his relationship with the religious right members of the governing coalition and his relationship with Prime Minister Netanyahu has often been strained, but there will probably be no strong push back.

On the international scene relations between Israel and Poland have become severely strained after the Lower House of the Polish Parliament passed a bill that says making mention of terms like Polish Death Camps will be punishable by up to three years imprisonment. The response from Israel spoke strongly about restricting accurate historic research and included outcries by Holocaust survivors. It was passed very publicly to Polish officials. The bill has yet to pass the Polish Senate and can be amended before it goes to President Andrjez Duda for signature.

When starting this column the goal was to make Temple members more aware of ARZA and the Reform movement in Israel and the news which explains our own movement's attitude and reaction to Israel and its governing coalitions. There have been articles explaining Israel's election process, the roles of the Knesset, the Supreme Court, and others. To add perspective to the picture also requires historic background. I'll add historic thumbnails about leading figures and documents that played a role in the reality and dreams that formed the modern Jewish state.

Here is a look at Ahad Ha'am, the penname of Asher Ginsberg (1856-1927) that translates as "one of the people" (based on Genesis 26:10). Born to pious affluent Hasidic parents in what is now Ukraine, he was

an early Zionist thinker and is considered the founder of cultural Zionism. He wrote prophetically, and with a perceptive honesty about those who inhabited the land before the arrival of the Zionists. He believed that Zionism must bring Jews to Palestine gradually, while turning it into a cultural center. At the same time, he felt it was incumbent upon Zionism to inspire a revival of Jewish national life in the <u>Diaspora</u>. Only then would the Jewish people be strong enough to assume the mantle of building a nation state. The Holocaust obviously preempted this vision

In 1891 he wrote about his perceptions: "We who live abroad are accustomed to believe that almost all Eretz Yisrael is now uninhabited desert and whoever wishes can buy land there as he pleases. But this is not true. It is very difficult to find in the land [ha'aretz] cultivated fields that are not used for planting. Only those sand fields or stone mountains ...remain uncultivated... It is very difficult to find good land for cattle. And not only peasants, but also rich landowners, are not selling good land so easily...We... are accustomed to believing that the Arabs are all wild desert people who, like donkeys, neither see nor understand what is happening around them. But this is a grave mistake... All the townships of Syria and Eretz Yisrael are full of Arab merchants who know how to exploit the masses and keep track of everyone with whom they deal – the same as in Europe. The Arabs, especially the urban elite, see and understand what we are doing and what we wish to do on the land, but they keep guiet and pretend not to notice anything. For now, they do not consider our actions as presenting a future danger to them. ... But, if the time comes that our people's life in Eretz Yisrael will develop to a point where we are taking their place, either slightly or significantly, the natives are not going to just step aside so easily".




