BROTHERHOOD AND ITS MEMBER PROVIDES TBD WITH A TRULY HEARTFUL NEED



BROTHERHOOD'S SCOTT TELFORD: *Working in a very concise manner, he provided our Temple with an Automated External Defibrillator.*

A few years back, one of our congregants, Michael Alkov, donated an AED machine that he had in his dental practice office. It was an older model though and there were problems with the ease of switching out the pads so that it could be used for both adults and children.

As a Registered Nurse, former Brotherhood board president Scott Telford, was also concerned about it's ease of use and whether it would be functional if we ever needed it. With the approval of the Brotherhood Board, he began to educate on the function of this type of machine and what would be needed to ensure that if the time ever came where we needed to use it, that it would work and perhaps save someone's life. He learned that AED is an abbreviation for Automated External Defibrillator. He became aware that it is designed specifically for the lay person and that the best machines are sturdy, simple, and easy to use.

An AED machine is designed to verbally tell the rescuer exactly what to do when encountering a person who may be in ventricular fibrillation or full cardiac arrest. The first assessment the machine does is to determine what is going on with the person and then directs the rescuer on how to proceed. It will tell the rescuer whether a CPR is necessary and once initiated, if it needs to be continued. Scott found this particular machine by researching several web sites for needed support.

The model he chose would serve our Temple for many years. It is very easy to use and there is an excellent video on Youtube.com which describes this particular model and then walks you through on how to use it step by step. It is set up for use on an adult but pads for a child are stored within the machine and can be switched out in less than a minute. There is also a light in the upper right hand corner of the machine that glows green to let you know that the battery is fully charged and the machine is ready for use. The light glows amber when it's time to replace the battery. If unused, the battery should last for up to five years. This machine also periodically runs system checks to ensure everything is functioning optimally.

When you're in the temple, by the social hall entrance, take a moment to view the machine. Then you can go online at Youtube to view the video. The time you spend doing this could save a life. Plus, commend Scott Telford for his focus on our members' health needs!!

Israel's relations with Turkey continue to improve, although it may be a long time before they are as cooperative as they were before the ill fated attempt to break the Gaza blockade by a flotilla led by the Turkish operated ship, Mavi Marmara, in 2010. The Israeli navy warned the ships to reverse course and eventually intercepted the flotilla. During the intercept and onboard resistance ten Turkish citizens were killed.

After months of formal and informal negotiations a reconciliation agreement has been initialed by the negotiators, subject to approval by the Turkish Parliament and the Israel Diplomatic-Security Cabinet. The effort to rebuild ties has been driven by both countries' security concerns as Syria and other Middle Eastern nations fight protracted civil wars.

A senior Turkish official called the agreement a "diplomatic victory" for Turkey and said that "representatives of the Palestinian government and Hamas have voiced their support" for the deal. "Relations with Israel have normalized," Turkey's prime minister, Binali Yildirim, said. Turkish officials added that it allows for increased Turkish investment and aid deliveries to the Gaza Strip, where access is tightly controlled by Israel. The shipments will go through the Israeli port of Ashdod. An initial shipment of 10,000 tons of aid will be dispatched as early as Friday. Turkey will transfer materials to build residential buildings as well as a 200-bed hospital, a senior Turkish official reported. Turkey will work to invest in Gaza's energy and water sectors, which have collapsed after years of Israeli blockades and sporadic conflicts.

Under the deal, Israel will provide a "humanitarian fund" of \$20 million to family members of the activists killed on Mavi Marmara. Turkey has added a letter stating that they will discuss with Hamas the release of two Israelis believed held in the Gaza Strip, as well

as the return of the bodies to Israel of two soldiers killed during the 2014 conflict.

Netanyahu said that the agreement creates stability in the face of Mideast turmoil; the Gaza blockade will remain, but Turkish aid to Gaza will be permitted only through Israel. He told reporters in Rome after meetings with Secretary of State John F. Kerry on Monday that it has "immense implications for the Israeli economy." Israel also hopes the agreement will curb the rising power of its arch-enemy, Iran, which recently struck a landmark nuclear deal with the West.

The principal anticipated economic benefit is based on Israel's offshore gas field that will provide enough gas to meet the demands of Israel and can supply much needed fuel to Turkey and Egypt.

The agreement is expected to be approved by Israel, but Defense Minister Avigdor Lieberman has already voiced his displeasure with the payment to Turkey and may not vote to approve it. The agreement appears to be a win-win and can provide future benefits to both sides. Neither party has allies in the Middle East and this will at least assure that they will no longer be adversaries.
