Looking back to last month, on the Gazan border things are quieter after a spate of Hamas fire balloons and some rockets attacks. Just how long it will last before Hamas tries to stage riots and get on the world news again remains unknown because there has been no formal cease fire.

J Street, an organization that strongly supports a two state solution to the Israeli Palestinian conflict, offered some insight into the US Administration's peace efforts. We have heard little about those efforts recently. J Street reported that last week Jared Kushner again traveled to the Middle East to talk with Prime Minister Netanyahu and with Arab leaders. While there, he gave a rare interview to a prominent Palestinian newspaper. The aim was presumably to convince the Palestinian people to embrace his soon-to-bereleased US proposal, but he spent the interview lambasting President Abbas and the Palestinian Authority's leadership. Kushner while purportedly working toward full Palestinian statehood has not made any partnerships on the Palestinian side.

Prince William's recent "nonpolitical" visit to Israel in contrast broke with 70 years of royal tradition of no official visits to the Jewish state. The reason was primarily to avoid hurting relations with the Middle Eastern countries from which the UK draws most of their oil and also with the Palestinians. If Kushner's attitude appeared to strongly support Israel, while the Prince seemed to follow the more bilateral UK line. He did declare that ties between Israel and the UK "have never been stronger." He met with Israel's President Reuven Rivlin and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. Rivlin asked him to convey a message of peace to

Palestinian Authority (PA) President Mahmoud Abbas.

While in the Palestinian Territories visiting President Mahmoud Abbas in a diplomatic slip he referred to the PA as a country. There was so much good will created on both sides of the conflict that there was no strong reaction to the errant comment. He told PA President Abbas that the Palestinians "are not forgotten".

As the prince neared the end of this first official visit by a British royal to Israel and the Palestinian territories he said to both sides "My sentiments are the same as yours in hoping that there is a lasting peace in the region."

A thing to watch over the next few weeks will be the advance of Syrian government forces with Russian support as they attack the rebel area that adjoins Israel. So far Israel has sent 300 tents. 28 tons of food and 30 tons of shoes and clothing to the thousands fleeing the conflict. Israel has said it will take in no refugees, and Jordan has said they can take no more. Whether or not an answer can be found to the humanitarian crisis, there will also be the issues that can arise as the Syrian.

"My sentiments are the same as yours in hoping that there is a lasting peace in the region, "government forces approach the Golan border with Israel.

'Summertime and the prayin' is easy'.


