

#### Stressed? Come and Laugh **Rabbi Nancy Myers**



Many of us are under a lot of stress. There are always personal challenges. We have to deal with difficult members of our family, bosses, employees, friends, and students. It's hard to go very long without unwanted

drama. Even if our personal relationships calm down, there are financial challenges with surprise costs associated with our homes, children, and health. And of course, many of us find the political climate in our country disheartening. I hear frequently of your concerns about our current administration and the direction of our nation.

Sigh. So I have to say, we need Purim this year more than ever. We need to celebrate the triumph of good over evil. We need to laugh, drink, and be merry. This is because of Esther's courage and Mordecai's leadership that the Jews of Persia were not only saved but were able to defend them- deliver Shlach Manot, "portions of food" to selves against their enemies. Bravery and initiative can counter many evil plans and our people have survived for millennia because we adhered to our values. One of them is remembering our past. This month we should focus on the new US administration and how it formalizes its diplomatic relationship and policy to Israel and the Middle East peace process. In order to ensure Israel's security and future as a Jewish and democratic state, the Reform Movement has long supported a negotiated two-state solution as the only viable means of resolving the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Currently the administration has put forward David Friedman to become the next Ambassador to Israel. The Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism (RAC) and the Association of Reform Zionists of America (ARZA) as well as our Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) are all concerned by statements that indicate that the new administration is moving away from the two state solution as the basis for an agreement and lasting peace between Israelis and the Palestinians. During the election the Republican Party platform endorsed "the vision of two democratic states living in peace and security: Israel, with Jerusalem as its capital, and Palestine." Similarly the Democrats called for lasting agreement with "a democratic, viable Palestinian state dedicated to living in peace and security side by side with the Jewish State of Israel." The policy is clearly bipartisan.

In a reply to a letter to the Trump campaign the URJ asked questions about its position on the two state solution. David Friedman made clear that he is open to a single state and that he believes that the overwhelming demographic data showing that Jews in a single state would become a minority is incorrect. The position of the administration puts them at odds with many in Israel that are promoting the two state solution to Netanyahu's coalition government. Most influential of Israel's supporters of the two state solution is the Commanders for Israel's Security, a non-partisan movement of more than 100 former senior security officials at the level of general or equivalent from the IDF, Mossad, Israel Security Agency and Police. They state on their web site that, "The IDF can provide an optimal response to any security challenge... The question of whether Israel has a negotiating partner at any point in time should not serve as an excuse for resigning ourselves to a deteriorating security and political situation. Political and security arrangements with the Arab world, together with progress towards an agreement with the Palestinians based on two states for two peoples, will contribute to Israel's security and preserve its identity for generations to come. Reaching such agreements is, therefore, a top national priority. Until such agreements can be reached, however, Israel must take independent measures to defend itself, to provide its citizens with a feeling of personal security, to maintain and improve conditions for dialogue with neighboring countries and for negotiations with the Palestinians, and to enhance its own international status."






