

## Save a Life-Prevent Gun Violence

My heart is broken with the shooting in Florida on February 14. The voices of the teens who survived this terrible shooting has shamed me. I am scared that its just a matter of time before there is a shooting in one of our lo-

cal schools. It is just a matter of time before I have to do a funeral for a member of your family. My heart cannot bear the thought. And I know that I am guilty for not taking action and everything in my power to reduce the deaths due to gun violence.

In our Mishneh, we are taught, "To save a life is to save the world." For me, this instructs us that even one life has incredible value and even if efforts are not sufficient to eliminate all deaths, perhaps we can save one life or hopefully many. I believe it is a moral imperative for all us, regardless of what you believe the cause of gun violence is, to take real action. It is no longer permissible, in my mind, to say that this is the price of living and growing up in America. It is no longer okay to say that things will never change. Prayer and heart felt messages will not prevent the next mass shooting, homicide, or suicide. All of us who have a conscious, I believe, must act to save lives and strive to create a better country for our children, the next generation, and for our families and friends.

#### I believe the following steps must be taken:

1. Screening/background/training before a person can purchase a firearm or ammunition:

To drive a vehicle, one must demonthat he/she is not a danger to othstrate to get a license or keep ers in order driving into old age. They have to learn the rules of the road, how to drive, and then pass a test. I believe a person must demonstrate that they know how to store their weapon, understand the ramifications of their gun getting into someone's hands, are screened for violent behaviors such as expulsion from school, domestic violence, and etc. This is because life takes priority over all. God's law tell us, "You shall not commit murder." We have an obligation to prevent killing and senseless loss of life.

#### 2. Shaming any politician that accepts money from the NRA- no matter their political affiliation.

I want the NRA out of our politician's checkbooks so they can independently assess the needs of our nation. The NRA has consistently fought against universal background checks, any common sense restrictions on who gets a firearm, and even congressional funding for research to prevent gun deaths.

3. Ban weapons that can be used in mass shootings- automatics/ semi-automatic/devices that can easily convert them.

5. Identity ways to recognize potential shooters, resources for violent mental health challenges, and better follow up for FBI and police when there is a concern.

In many mass shootings, AR15 has been the gun of choice.

4. Demand that congress authorizes and funds credible studies of how to prevent gun deaths.

If you disagree with these steps and believe the causes of gun violence are due to violence in movies and video games, media, values, or other. I want to challenge you to take action based on your beliefs. What can you do to save lives? How can you prevent deaths due to gun violence?

#### For those of you who agree with any of my points, consider doing the following:

- The **National School Walkout**, planned by Women's March organizers, will be on March 14 at 10 am in each time zone. It calls for students, faculty, parents, and others to walk out of school for 17 minutes.
- The March for Our Lives is scheduled for March 24. One in Long Beach is at 10:00 a.m. at Bixby Park and the O.C will likely at 2:00 p.m. location to be determined.
- All of us need to advocate to save liveswrite representatives even if they are not your own!



Reports from Arab sources indicate the Trump Palestinian-Israeli Peace plan now under development would change the status quo and require concession from both Palestinians and Israelis. Arab sources in Paris report that it will be presented, at a yet to be scheduled international conference, probably in Cairo with Israel in attendance.

The reports primarily come from unnamed Arab Foreign Ministers who met in Brussels earlier this week with their European counterparts to prepare in advance for the release of the US plan. They describe the yet to be completed plan as cancelling any Palestinians' rights to return to their former homes in Israel. In the West Bank far flung small Israeli settlements would be relocated and razed, but larger and older ones would be preserved, and construction of new settlements probably would be banned. The Old City of Jerusalem would be placed under international protection. A Saudi English newspaper in London reported that the plan includes US and international recognition of the Palestinian state and acceptance of East Jerusalem as its capital. Other reported provisions include Israeli responsibility for the Palestinian West Bank security and Israeli control of a Jordan River corridor. Egypt would control the security for Gaza.

Since the formation of a Palestinian state and governmental institutions will be expensive, the US would collect \$40 billion from yet to be identified sources.

The preceding information was taken from the Times of Israel, February 28, 2018.

The proposals in the new plan have been discussed as part of past negotiations. The

timing now may be fortuitous because of the instability in the region. The Saudis are tied up in fighting in Yemen to make sure that Shiite rebels friendly to Iran do not control one of their borders. Syria is deeply involved in their civil war, and Iraq is still a barely united country. Egypt has problems with the Arab Brotherhood and Jordan's ruling family is under duress. The fact that the yet to be completed plan has similarities to a plan proposed by Arab states in recent years may also help reduce resistance by Arab states and could possibly lead to recognition of Israel by its neighbors. The Palestinians may find their position receiving sympathy, but little support from Arab states.. In the past neighboring states could use the Israel-Palestinian conflict as a uniting force in their population, so they had minimal interest in settling the conflict. But now, their own instability and external battles keeps them preoccupied. Their neighbors have accepted few Palestinians over the decades, preferring them to be housed by the UN in refugee camps where they have now survived for more than two generations. The return of those refugees to Israel has long been a Palestinian demand and they surely will resist the loss of a bargaining chip in the negations to end the conflict with Israel.

So, now we will see if the rumored plan becomes a reality and can win the support of the UK, Europeans, and Arab states and finally the Israelis and Palestinians. At least Peace, no matter how farfetched, still remains the goal.




