What would it be like to be an Israelite newly freed from Egypt traversing the desert? Have you ever wanted to meet Moses, Miriam, or Moses?

Well, you will have this opportunity on Tuesday night, May 30, starting at 7:00

p.m. Just by showing up, you will instantly become one of the Israelites newly freed from Egypt. Crossing the sea of Reeds, you will rejoice Come as you are or in biblical attire. We have with Miriam, Aaron, and Moses as you begin your forty years of history to walk through! If want a trek through the wilderness. It will not be easy though for there will be challenges of hunger and a need to forage for food. As a descendant of the ancient Israelites, you know that Jews like to complain a lot so be prepared to voice your doubts to the leaders of our people. Complain loudly about the lack of food and water and when Moses takes too long at Sinai, build a golden calf with Aaron. Repent as a people and receive a new set of laws. Wander the wilderness, send out spies, and have hope of making it to the Promised Land!

The evening of Shavuot will be an engaging and interactive journey. We will literally reenact the Israelites trek through the wilderness by walking through the park next to the Temple. There will be a map and different stations where we will experience elements of the Israelites' long trek through the wilderness. The trek will be about 45 minutes long. With the sad death of Moses, the Israelites will return to the sanctuary (the Promised land) and hear Aaron's son chant the Ten Commandments. Immediately thereafter, we will enjoy cheesecake in the social hall.

Shavuot, one of the three main pilgrimage festivals, celebrates the revelation of Torah at Sinai. Jews traditionally eat diary on this holiday as a reminder of the Garden of Eden where we lived in harmony with the animals, of Israel as a land of milk and honey, and because some of the laws given at Sinai taught us about keeping kosher. As a conclusion, we will have cheesecake and other goodies to celebrate Shavuot and Torah.

## **<u>President's Message</u>** <u>Mr. Schiffer Goes to President School</u>

A couple of months ago I was fortunate enough to attend a four-day seminar put on by the Union for Reform Judaism ("URJ") called the Scheidt Seminar. This Seminar is geared for new congregational presidents (and presidents-elect) of URJ Reform congregations from around the country. This year, for the first time I believe, the Seminar was held on the west coast and on the east coast in two separate sessions. The idea was to make the Seminar more accessible to west coast presidents (since it has traditionally been an east coast event). Judging by the number of east coast attendees at our west coast Seminar, however, I think some opportunistic snow birds decided to "do the Scheidt" in Southern California. There were roughly 100 attendees ranging from large congregations in New York, Chicago, and the Bay Area to small congregations in New Mexico and Hawaii- and everybody in between. Besides me, there were about six or seven other Orange County reform temple presidents in attendance as well. The Seminar was a great opportunity to network, compare ideas, discuss what has been successful (or maybe not so successful), and to think about strategies bearing upon engagement, financial stability, programming (and the list goes on and on). What I really appreciated the most, however, was seeing how the issues we face here at TBD are really no different from issues other synagogues face around the country.

After the Seminar, I shared a lot of the specific ideas I took away from the Seminar with the Rabbi, the Board, and whomever else couldn't walk away



from me fast enough. My goal is to implement some of these ideas into realities over the next few months. And that process is already under way. For instance, we will be rolling out a congregational survey in the next few weeks. We have developed a new logo which I believe captures the essence of who we are and what we do at TBD ("We remember, we celebrate, we grow- Together"). You have already gotten a sneak peek at our modified membership commitment model, which will be implemented during our next membership campaign. I am also in the process of trying to get some of our TBD youth to participate in the L'Taken Seminar next year, which is an amazing social action seminar geared for high school -aged students, which the URJ and the Religious Action Center (RAC) host in Washington DC each year. More on that later

I am genuinely grateful for those four days I spent at the Scheidt Seminar, and look forward to working with the Board, the Rabbi, and all of you, to help TBD maintain its reputation as a great congregation.
