Welcoming Guests - Ushipizin Rabbi Nancy Myers

October 2017



The word "Ushipizin" is translated as guests in Aramaic. In the Zohar, our Jewish kabbalistic medieval work, we are told to invite 2 kinds of *Ushpizin* into our sukkah, our temporary huts, during the 7 days of Sukkot.

Here is an excerpt from the

Zohar III 103-104a:

"Come and see. When a man dwells in this sukkah (dwelling), the shade of faith, the Shechinah spreads her wings over him from above, and Abraham and five other righteous ones....and King David... make their dwelling with him...Rabbi Abba also said: It is written "You shall dwell in sukkot seven days" and subsequently "[they] shall dwell in sukkot": first of all "you" and then "they." The first refers to the guests and the second to human beings.

The first refers to the guests, as was the custom of Rav Hamnuna Sava. After he had entered the sukkah he would rejoice and stand just inside the door of the sukkah, and say "Let us invite our guests. Let us prepare the table." He would then stand and pronounce the benediction and say "You shall dwell in sukkot seven days.' Be seated, guests from on high, be seated! Be seated, guests of faith, be seated!"

The second refers to human beings. Whoever has a portion in the people and in the Holy Land dwells in the shade of faith and welcomes the celestial guests, so that he may rejoice both in this world and the next. In addition, however, he must help the poor to rejoice."

There is a beautiful custom of inviting our spiritual ancestors into our sukkot. According to the Kabbala it is traditionally the seven patriarchs: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Aaron, Joseph, and David. Seven, of course, being the days of creation but also the number of mystical lower sefirot that connect us with God. In modern times, we invite our matriarchs as well such as Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, Leah, Ruth, Miriam, and Deborah. There's something mystical about sitting outside looking up through the leaves and branches into the sky. In peering at the same moon our ancestors watched thousands of years ago is deeply humbling and yet powerful. Communing with our past, connects us with our spiritual ancestors' experience and wisdom. But spiritual beings are not enough according to the Zohar; we must invite human guests as well. This is a time of hospitality and friendship. It's a time to look out for the poor and needy. And so we base ourselves spiritually while being grounded in this world.

Sukkot is such a beautiful, beautiful holiday. Sukkot begins Wednesday night, Oct. 4, and lasts a whole week. Come bring your dinner at 6:00 p.m. and enjoy a brief Sukkot worship experience. Join me to study Ecclesiastes on Saturday morning, Oct. 7. And don't forget Simchat Torah on Wednesday night, Oct. 11, where we will dance with the Torahs, consecrate our children, and have ice cream.

May you feel surrounded by celestial and human guests as you enjoy one of the most spiritual Jewish holidays.



This month we as Reform/progressive Jews have had to face some hard facts when we consider the possibility of a two state solution, or even an egalitarian prayer space where men and women can pray together at the Kotel (Western Temple Wall).

The new U.S. Ambassador to Israel, David Freeman, in a recent interview reported in the Times of Israel, when asked to speculate about the Trump administration's yet to be announced plans to end the Israel Palestinian hostilities is quoted as saying that the two-state solution "is not a helpful term" and "has largely lost its meaning." He also said the West Bank settlements are a part of Israel and always have been. The Ambassador's view of the Palestinian territories is that at the end of the 1967 war the UN resolved that when Israel withdrew its forces from occupied territories Israel would retain a meaningful portion of the West Bank, and it would return that which it didn't need for peace and security. "There was always supposed to be some notion of expansion into the West Bank, but not necessarily expansion into the entire West Bank; and I think that's exactly what Israel has done." Asked if some of the settlements would have to "go down" in a future peace deal with the Palestinians, Friedman responded, "Wait and see "

This is in contradiction to long standing U.S. policy of both Republican and Democratic administrations, but it should be no surprise. During his ratification hearings Friedman was a controversial pick for ambassador, largely due to his views on the settlements and derogatory comments he made about left-wing Jewish groups for which he subsequently apologized. Friedman was a major donor to the settlement of Beit El and had said that Israel can annex the West Bank and still retain its Jewish character.

In meeting with a settler group, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said Washington will tolerate limited construction, won't distinguish between blocs and isolated settlements. He said that US officials told his chief of staff to not be a "pig" on new settlement construction and that the Trump administration is prepared to tolerate limited settlement building, a senior settler present at the meeting said. With regard to the egalitarian prayer at the Kotel, ARZA has quoted Prime Minister Netanyahu's comment,

"There's a struggle for the recognition of the Reform movement in Israel and to limit the power of the Chief Rabbinate. This struggle we won't solve." ARZA continued that at least he was honest—for a change. Netanyahu confirmed what so many of us suspected was the case for so long, that he will continue to devalue our Reform movement and capitulate to extremist factions in his coalition government. He is willing to sell the rights of millions of Jews both in the Diaspora and Israel for political gain, to undermine Israel's identity as the Homeland for all Jews, to jeopardize the strength of Israel's democracy. Also, Netanyahu's comments have not gone over well with Israel's President Rivlin who does not agree.

On September 26 at the settlement of Har Adar in the Palestinian territories near Jerusalem an attack took place as a gunman approached the guarded entrance. He killed two civilian security guards and a border policeman, and injured the head security guard before he was shot and killed. The Times of Israel reported that the accusations issued by several Israeli politicians charged the Palestinian Authority and its head Mahmoud Abbas with responsibility for murder. However, Israel's security service, the Shin Bet, stated that the terrorist Nimer Mahmoud Ahmed Jamal, a 37-year old father of four, had "significant" personal and family problems "including a problem of violence in the family. It also turns out that the assailant's wife fled to Jordan several weeks ago and left him with the children."

That is to say, this was not the case of another young Palestinian who had imbibed hatred and anti-Israel incitement via Palestinian media and social media, like hundreds Israelis have seen in the past two years, but rather a different kind of terrorist, older, a father of children, who had undergone a major personal crisis and ultimately combusted and carried out an attack. It resembles what is often called suicide by cop and is not the first case, and sadly won't be the last, in which grave personal circumstances have led Palestinians to carry out attacks.


