

### The Blast of the Ram's Horn Rabbi Nancy Myers

September 2017



I'm running my fingers along the smooth polished ram's horn. I can feel its ridges and see the shades of onyx, sand, and specks of amber. Raising the narrow aperture to my pursed lips, I take a deep breath and then struggle to make

a sound. After some false starts, a high pitched shriek echoes from its tusk.

How do you feel when you hear the shofar sounded at Rosh Hashanah? One the one hand, it is joyously primal. Seeing a man or woman standing in front of a crowded sanctuary, blowing the ram's horn, feels exciting. However, when its screech pierces the sanctuary, everyone falls silent. The Baal Tekiah, calls out, "Tekiah," and a single uninterrupted sound ensues, "Shevarim," followed by three broken sounds, "Teruah," nine short blasts, and then at the end of it all, "Tekiah Gedolah," a long, enduring blast that resonates throughout the sanctuary.

While the New Year is a celebration of new beginnings, it is also very solemn. The Talmud describes that the sounding of the shofar mimics the sounds of crying. Debating whether the Teruah is a whimpering or Teruah is a moaning sound, our ancient text imbues a seriousness to these blasts. We know that Rosh Hashanah is a time of judgement on the past year, and we are called to account for our acts, words, and the choices we have made. Some of our decisions were good ones but others maybe not. And even if we have

done everything to the best of our ability, there can still be hardships, challenges, and sadness.

Have you experienced loss this past year? Did your bodies show signs of age or illness? Did loved ones disappoint you? None of us gets to escape hard times and even as we hope that these are as fleeting like the sound of the shofar, we still feel the painful echo within us.

The choice we always have is how to respond to such challenges. We can decide how to react, what to say, and what we can do even under the worst of situations. As long as there is life, there are moments of decision and every single one of us can choose our attitude, perspective, and subsequent response. There can be empowerment even at times of limited choices. There can be strength even at weak moments. And even in grief, there can be a deepening of faith and relationships with people around us.

Interestingly, the shofar is never blown in isolation but rather in a sanctuary filled with people. As Jews, we are never alone. We are part of a community. We are part of history. Whether you hear the shofar in joy or in sadness, may your year be a good one, a better one, and one filled with meaning.

While things appear somewhat calm in Israel there is news that can be classed as the good, the bad and the ugly. Some of the good was reported by the Jerusalem Post about the arrival of Jason Greenblatt, the US Special Representative for International Negotiations. He said that the world needs to hear about some 3,500 wounded Syrians treated in Israel's hospitals. He visited the Ziv Hospital in Tzfat where more than 1,000 have been treated. On our visit to Israel in May we heard first hand from a hospital volunteer about the many treated and being treated at the Western Galilee Medical Center, in Nahariah. Goldblatt also spoke hopefully about the possibility of the development of a railroad from Jordan and Saudi Arabia to Haifa; so that those Arab states would have access to a Mediterranean port. It is an appealing idea, but the odds against it are staggering for a multitude of reasons, not the least of which is the relations between the nations involved

There is news that a house in Hebron claimed by 15 settlers, who moved in without completing the purchase from the Palestinian owners, will be evacuated by order of the High Court of Justice. Hebron is a city well within the borders of the Palestinian West Bank. It is also the location of the graves of the Patriachs: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, who are sacred to Judaism, Christianity, and

Islam. Tensions run high there because of the presence of several Jewish urban settlements, and local history including a 1929 massacre of 69 Jews by Arab rioters and a shooting massacre at the Ibrahim Mosque of 29 Muslims and the wounding of 125 by American Israeli Baruch Goldstein on February 25, 1994, during Purim and Ramadan. He was disarmed and killed by survivors.

In the bad and also ugly category is the report by the Israel Religious Action Center of body searches carried out on women who wore tallit at the entrance to the Kotel (Western wall complex) on Rosh Hodesh Elul, August 23. They were ordered to lift their shirts and raise their the skirts as police searched for Torah scrolls. Other women also destined for the prayer area were not searched. The actions brought strong condemnation from our movement's Union for Reform Judaism and ARZA. Israel's Supreme Court is holding an historic hearing on August 31about freedom, equality, pluralism and tolerance at the Kotel. The pending hearing seems to have effect, as Prime Minister Netanyahu has called off the searches and declared that such incidents are unacceptable and will be addressed in accordance with the law and the instructions of the court.

On a final note of things to watch, the Associated Press reported that Hamas, the Muslim militant group that controls Gaza and has never accepted Israel's existence, is under new leadership. Yehiyeh Sinwar, the elected leader, in a four-hour meeting with Journalists announced that Hamas and Iran have repaired their relations after a break in 2007 over Hamas' refusal to support Syrian President Bashar Assad. Iran had been Hamas strongest supporter and arms supplier. The announcement came at the time Prime Minister Netanyahu complained to UN Secretary General Guterres during his visit to Israel about rising anti-Israel activity in the region by Iran.

While things are not always as we hope them to be in Israel, it is a democracy and the world's only Jewish majority country.






