

The status of relations between Israel and Turkey, discussed last month have taken a back seat to the purges going on in Turkey since the failure the short lived coup. One interesting item indirectly related is that there is threatened legal action by Cyprus against Israel over the planned route of the natural gas pipeline between Israel and Turkey. The future exporting of natural gas was an incentive for the improved relations with Turkey.

On an item important to Reform Jews, there has been no progress by Israel's governing coalition on the development of the egalitarian prayer area that was proposed and approved in January. Jerusalem Online reported that Rabbi Rick Jacobs, President of the Union for Reform Judaism, the movement to which our Temple belongs, led a group of 200 men and women that prayed, and sang at the kotel, the Western Wall of the Temple. A similar prayer service last month at the kotel generated fierce opposition from haredi and national-religious protesters. This month's rally elicited only a few whistles and shouts from half a dozen veshiva students. Rabbi Jacobs said that it would be the first of many prayer sessions this summer. Hundreds of groups from the Reform and Conservative movements will visit Israel this year and conduct egalitarian prayer sessions.

Leaders of the progressive Jewish denominations from the US and in Israel, including Jacobs, met with Netanyahu in June to reiterate the importance of implementing the agreement to Diaspora Jews. Asked by *The Jerusalem Post* about the way forward following the meeting with the prime minister, Jacobs said that it was time for the government to implement the agreement.

A surprising item that Jerusalem Online reported was that the government issued a report on the discrimination against the Arab citizens in Israel. It reveals a bleak status quo, but it is impressive

that the current right wing coalition government is the first to take any action on the situation. According to the report the assistance program for the Arab sector in Israel. Only 23% of Arab Israelis (not Palestinians) are eligible for quality high school diplomas, as opposed to 47% of all the Israeli population. Meanwhile, only 13% of university and college students in Israel are Arab, despite the fact that they constitute 22% of the relevant population. At least 60 Israeli Arab towns have intercity roads crossing through them as opposed to a small number of Jewish towns that do, and that Israeli authorities invest \$1507 in every Arab citizen, as opposed to \$2607 invested in every Jewish citizen. The gaps are also evident in the field of employment, as only 33.2% of Arab women are employed, as opposed to 71.4% of Jewish women. Among the reasons for this disparity is the small number of daycare services provided for Arab children: only 6% of the children who stay in daycare centers in Israel are from the Arab sector, and until 2012 barely any daycare centers were built for the Arab community.

The government is implementing an assistance program for the Arab sector.. Around \$3.7 billion in total will be invested in the Arab sector throughout the next five years, thanks to the effective cooperation between the Finance Ministry, the Prime Minister's Office and the Social Equality Ministry.






