Remembering the Holocaust with Auschwitz survivor Bernard Sayone

As Jews, we can never let ourselves forget the tragedies that occurred during the Holocaust. These darkest days in human history witnessed the loss of 6 million Jews, 5 million others, and entire families devastated. At Temple Beth David, we have had a number of people who either survived the Holocaust or who have family members who did. Sadly, with every year, we lose another survivor. It is imperative that we hear the live testimony of those who can recount their personal experiences. As a synagogue, we are committed to ensuring that our stories are told, our loved ones are not forgotten, and that the younger generation understands the impact of the Holocaust on our people and history. It is on Sunday morning, April 27 at 10:00 a.m., we will commemorate Yom Hashoa, the day set aside for remembering the Holocaust.

Bernard Sayone, member of Temple Beth David, will be our featured speaker. Bernard was born in Poland in 1922 and as a teenager witnessed Hitler's specially trained military invade his hometown of Kelce. The Nazis burned down the town's synagogue even as it was filled with Jews. Bernard and his family fought every day for survival. Even as they were forced into a ghetto with severe restrictions, they worked and tried to live. One day, Bernard and his family were sent to Auschwitz. This is where Bernard faced daily horrors, death, and tragedies. He even came face to face with Dr. Joseph Mengele and his horrific experiments. As an eyewitness and victim, Bernard has personally seen and experienced the great evil that man can do to man. It was only his desire to live that gave him the strength to obey orders and try to stay as healthy as possible. With hope still in his heart and the sign of a rainbow in the sky, Bernard miraculously survived Auschwitz.

Bernard Sayone married in Germany and moved to the United States. As the proud father of a son and daughter, Bernard made a life here in America. Living for 55 years in Colorado, Bernard Sayone has been speaking for 40 years about the Holocaust. He wants to counter anti-Semitism by making people aware of what happened under the Nazis. Bernard was a leader in Denver and throughout the state of Colorado. He was a friend of the governor, instructor for teachers, and admired by many who see him as a man of incredible courage, resiliency, and strength.

Bernard will share the story of his life at our Yom HaShoa commemoration on Sunday morning April 27 along with our choir and youth leading the service at 10:00 a.m. Feel free to invite your neighbors, teachers, classmates, and friends to this very, very important morning.

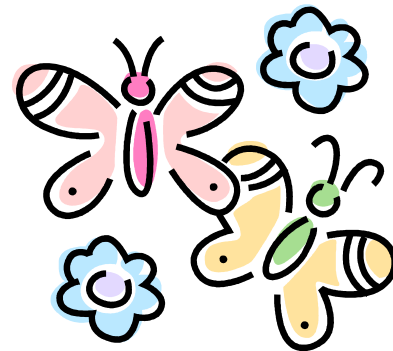


We are now immersed in Passover preparation. The children are learning the story of Passover through stories,

SPOTLIGHT: Lois Gold

Lois Ellen Gold is no stranger to diversity. Whether it pertains to her heritage, residence, or career, she has an entire spectrum worth of experience. Despite all the changes she faced, there has always been a constant that has tied the various threads of her together – education.

From both sides, Lois Ellen comes from a Jewish family. Her father's family originated from Russia – near Finland. They emigrated from Russia to Boston. Her mother's family came from Poland. They wanted to immigrate to the United States, but did not have enough funds to cover the journey. Instead, they traveled to England where her grandpa worked as a tailor and they stayed there until they could afford the passage to the United States. During their time in England, Lois Ellen's grandparents had seven children – her mother was the youngest. Eventually, her mother did make the move to the United States. This resulted in Lois Ellen being born in New York, New York, yet she spent her childhood in South America. Though appreciative of the opportunity to live in several countries and be exposed to different cultures and languages, it was a lonely childhood being an only child with extended family far away in the states. While she learned a lot in South America, she definitely did not receive a Jewish education. With no synagogues around, she had no choice but to attend a Catholic school.

The few times in her childhood she was able to experience Judaism were fleeting but remain vivid. One time her maternal grandma arrived in Panama to visit and arrived with trunks filled with kosher pots and pans. During Passovers when visits back to the states were possible, there would always be a delicious Seder. That remained the extent of Lois Ellen's Jewish experience until the time came to return to the states and attend college. It was during her time there she met Bob, a practicing Jew. They got married and had four wonderful children (all who have gone on to successful careers and remain true to their mom's teachings about the virtue of family connections).

Becoming a mother kindled Lois Ellen's interest in Judaism. She took classes on Jewish customs, literature, and more at the University of Judaism. She read everything she could on the subject. Most of all, she learned from her husband and children.

During this time she also attained professional success becoming a professional writer, a lawyer, and a judge. Throughout all this, she continued to live in a variety of places: Los Angeles, Malibu, and Washington State.

While in Washington, Lois became an active member of a Reconstructionist synagogue and developed such a strong connection with them, she was certain she would never feel that again when she relocated to Orange County.

But then she discovered Temple Beth David. What first enticed Lois Ellen was a lecture at the temple. Then she started attending lunch & learn and Sunday

study sessions with the rabbi. She became very impressed with Rabbi Myers' knowledge, and it was because of the Rabbi that she found herself doing something she had never consider possible – forming an attachment to another synagogue and certifying it by becoming a member of Temple Beth David this past December. She also is impressed by the many congregants she has already met. Everyone she encounters has been unique, energetic, friendly, and helpful. Lois Ellen has been especially appreciative of members offering her rides to and from the synagogue that allow her to attend evening events.

When Lois Ellen is not learning she is a teacher. She trains dogs to become therapy dogs. Animals have always been a part of life. Currently, she owns a collie.

Lois Ellen has put a lot of effort into her education, and her effort has been rewarded. She learned to be appreciative of life. She learned that religion is very personal, but it is also about forging connections. And in the short amount of time she has been a member of Temple Beth David, she has learned Temple Beth David is a very good place for her. ☆

Last month it was announced that the Israeli government drafted an agreement to grant control of the egalitarian prayer area at the Western Wall to the ultra-Orthodox City of David Foundation contrary to the announced basis for prayer area negotiations and the expectations of the Conservative and Reform negotiators. After strong joint objection by the Diaspora Conservative and Reform movements, it appears that the draft agreement with the City of David Foundation has been withdrawn. Just who will govern the area remains to be determined, but those of us on the Israel trip will get to see the area they are arguing over where we all may someday wish to pray.

Lately there is much more to report than in the last few months. The Knesset passed the law that makes the majority of Haredi yeshiva students eligible for the draft like other Israelis. The vote was 67 to 1 in the 120-member Knesset, because the opposition members boycotted the vote. The law goes into effect immediately and will phase in the full draft over three years.

The Knesset also passed landmark legislation amending Israel's Basic Law, making significant changes in governance. It ups the percentage of votes that a political party must receive to get representation in the Knesset. Israel's national elections allocate the 120 seats in the Knesset by party based on the number of votes each party receives. To be included in the allocation of seats a party must now receive a minimum 3.25% of the vote. The previous requirement was 2%, so some smaller parties may not get representation in the future. Just what effect this will have remains to be seen. In addition the law streamlined the number of cabinet ministers to 18, each with a specific portfolio unless it is expanded by a super majority vote of 70. The law is also intended to reduce the number of no confidence votes by requiring that any no confidence vote include the

naming of a new prime minister and all ministers. Just after last month's article there was a case of serious vandalism at the Reform Synagogue in Raanana, a suburb north of Tel Aviv. The graffiti included quotes from Maimonides about nonbelievers. It was the second vandalism of the synagogue since 2011. Rabbi Gilad Kariv, head of the Israel Movement for Progressive Judaism, called the vandalism a price tag incident, a term to describe actions by Orthodox extremist groups, against synagogues, mosques and a monastery. By the time you read this Cathy and I will still be in Israel, so best wishes from the Jewish Homeland.

Please keep in mind that Professor David Barzali, of UC San Diego who is the West Coast Regional Director of ARZA will speak at our Shabbat service on April 11; hope to see you there.

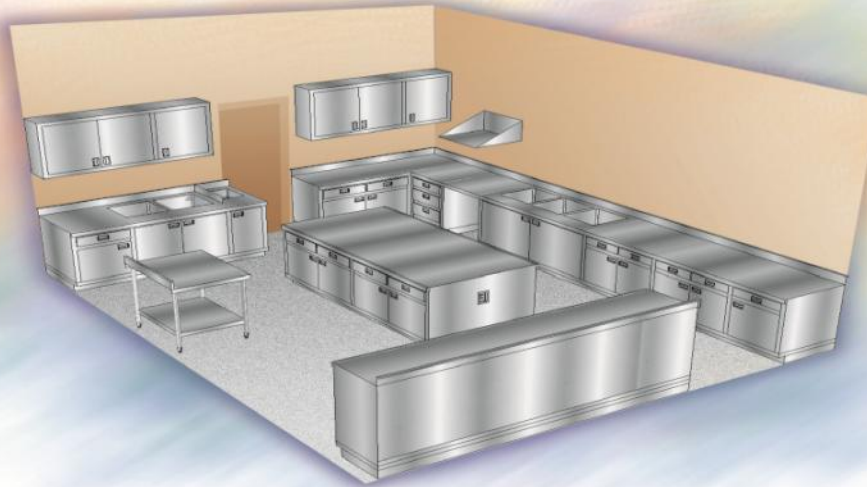



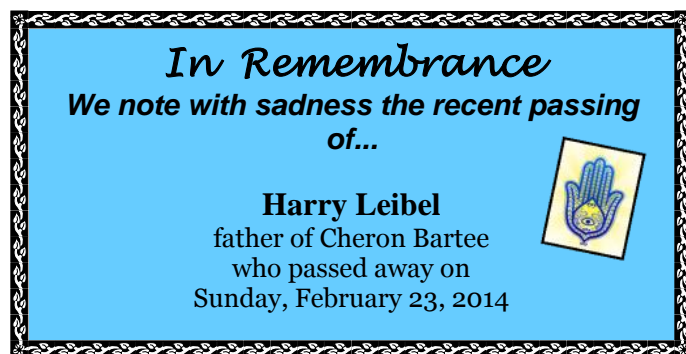
