So, I survived my two weeks working at Camp Newman in Northern California. I have to say first and foremost that I was impressed with the Jewish learning and teen bonding that occurs up there. From the first moment a new camper is welcomed into his/her bunk, there is the singing of "Haveinu Shalom Aleichem, we are so glad to see you!" Seeing the smile on a newcomer's face is heartening. Then every day in the morning, there's an outdoor assembly with morning prayers, songs, and some silliness. Meals in the dining hall have motzi and the birkat hamazon. There are services, Judaic programming, and lots of great energy.

Shabbat evening at Camp Newman is special. Everyone wears white as we gather outdoors for a beautiful and spirited service. Dinner is roast chicken, eggplant and tofu, rice, green beans, and brownies. And then after dinner, the fun really begins. Each unit comes dancing out of the dining hall with the CIT's singing full force. Everyone meets up at the basketball courts and joins in traditional Israeli dancing followed by more current dances to "Golden Boy" and other favorite songs. Seeing over 500 hundred people dance with all their might including staff and faculty to these songs was exciting. I almost forgot about my injured ankle! Thank God for my boot.

I loved seeing our Temple Beth David youth there! I hosted two TBD parties in my room. Our kids told me how nice it was for them to catch up with one another. I also liked "spying" on our kids and sending a few photos to their parents. With the exception of my own daughter, they didn't seem to mind.

So the two weeks were an amazing experience for me. I worked hard with my 83 eighth and ninth graders in leading morning services and running programming on God and what it means to be perfect and holy. I was challenged and had to learn fast about camp culture but I honed my skills while there.



All in all, I left feeling that this is a very worthwhile experience for our youth. I am grateful for the Lynn Front Memorial URJ Campership Fund managed by the Foundation to support our youth who want to attend Camp Newman. So next year, who wants to go? I do.

For the next 60 days any discussion about Israel will center on the Iran Nuclear Agreement negotiated with the P5+1. Our Reform Movement Issued the following statement on July 14.

REFORM MOVEMENT LEADERSHIP STATEMENT

This morning, after extensive negotiations conducted under intense international scrutiny, P5+1 negotiators, led by Secretary of State John Kerry, announced that they have reached an agreement with Iran over that country's nuclear program. We in the Reform Jewish Movement remain committed to our belief that the United States and its allies must do all that is possible to prevent a nuclear-armed Iran, as well as to protect and enhance U.S. security and the security of our allies—particularly Israel—and promote stability in the entire Middle East.

We deeply appreciate the intense efforts of the multinational negotiators, especially the U.S. administration, for having worked so hard to try to come to a diplomatic resolution with Iran on containment of its nuclear program. As the U.S. Congress, other world leaders, and the American public, including the Jewish community, evaluate the details of the proposed agreement, we recognize that thoughtful people can and do hold strongly different opinions as to whether this agreement is the best obtainable result in securing our shared goals and upholding the ideal that solutions should be found through the negotiating process rather than a military confrontation.

During the last several months, leaders of our Reform Movement have consulted with experts and heard from advocates who both oppose and favor the framework outlined in March by the P5 +1 and Iran. We have conferred with our fellow Jewish organizations and met privately with the White House, the Secretary of State, and representatives of the State of Israel. Right now, we are continuing our ongoing dialogue with the U.S. administration, key members of Congress, Prime Minister Netanyahu, and other prominent Israeli leaders including leaders of the opposition. One helpful touchstone for our analysis of this agreement is the Washington Institute for Near East Policy's Public Statement on U.S. Policy Toward the Iran Nuclear Negotiations, which was endorsed by a panel of bipartisan diplomats and calls for a five-point program ensuring that Iran will not become a nuclear threshold

In the coming days and weeks, we will go back to our trusted experts and continue to consult with our constituencies

to better understand the consequences of this proposed agreement. We urge all committed parties to take similar, carefully considered approaches before rushing to conclusions.

As the Congress moves forward, we will share our opinion on the viability of this agreement to achieve our goals: that the final agreement will put the optimal standard for restraints on Iran, preventing a nuclear-armed Iran, protecting the security of the United States, Israel and our allies around the world. Eger, President RELIGIOUS ACTION CENTER OF REFORM JUDAISM: Rabbi Jonah Dov Pesner, Director, and Jennifer Kaufman, Chair, Commission on Social Action of Reform Judaism UNION FOR REFORM JUDAISM, Rabbi Rick Jacobs, President, and Steve Sacks, Chair of the Board While there have been comments that the Reform statement should have taken a defined position, making a thorough study of the document and the impact it will have also has merit. We cannot really put ourselves in the position of the Israelis who are wary of the agreement, because we are not in easy range of Iranian missiles.

As we do form an opinion about the agreement we need to acknowledge that the agreement was intended only to reduce the chance for Iran gaining a nuclear weapon. Iran is still the principal supporter of Israel's enemies, Hamas and Hezbollah. Beside their announced goal to destroy Israel, they are attempting to become the dominant power in the Middle East. Ultimately the agreement was negotiated with a nation that is a current enemy on many fronts, so are we better off with this nuclear deal than with the status quo? Is it realistic to believe that we could negotiate a better deal? There already is heavy TV lobbying against the agreement and there will be partisan pressure from both sides. So, if you have not already decided whether or not to support the agreement I hope you will be able to make an informed decision.
