In Pirkei Avot, chapters of our fathers, Rabbi Elazar ben Azaryah said, "Ein Kemach, *Ein Torah.*" This translates literally as "Without flour, there is no Torah." We understand this verse to mean that without sustenance, there can be no study, no learning, and no Torah. We need food and drink to live and only when we live without fear of hunger or thirst, can we devote ourselves to higher pursuits such as study. Our rabbis two thousand years ago recognized this and we know today that for Judaism to flourish, we need resources to meet our basic human needs. It is through donations today, that we have a building to shelter us from the sun, funds to run our air conditioning in summer, heat in winter, and for some time, we have been hoping to have a kitchen in good working order.

Did I say kitchen? Well, as many of you know, this past year, there has been a major fundraising effort to remodel our aging kitchen. Anne Farber initiated a dream to fix up our kitchen. She ended up chairing our very successful kitchen committee. Ruth Kramer, with the support of the amazing women in our Sisterhood, embarked on raising money to make this dream a reality. And under the leadership of Garry Plotkin and his countless hours managing this project, along with many volunteers, the kitchen has been torn down to its cement walls, and brand new plumbing, electrical wires, flooring, and stainless steel cabinets and appliances have been installed. Most significantly, though, over half of our congregation has donated to our kitchen! Through your help, we have raised almost all the funds necessary for a complete remodel.

On Friday night August 15, we hope to celebrate our new kitchen with a ribbon cutting ceremony during our summer synaplex evening celebration. It is through your generosity, that no one will go hungry at Temple Beth David. We'll have delicious latkes at Chanukah, hamantaschen at Purim, wonderful brunch at the Sisterhood Fashion Show, delicious Brotherhood BBQ on Shabbat, and delectable onegs on Friday nights. It is with your support, your donation of 'kemach,' we will all be nourished and able to sing, pray, and study for years to come.

President's Report - August 2014

The Temple Beth David Board of Trustees held a retreat on Sunday July 13 led by Rabbi Janet Offel from the Union of Reform Judaism (URJ). The attendance was excellent. We began by "celebrating" our successes – what have we accomplished in the last few years. We identified the principal goals of the Board moving ahead and then broke into subgroups to identify <u>specific and measurable</u> ways in which these goals could be achieved. After a short break, we then assessed the function of the Board itself and began to analyze how Board function might be improved. So, what have been the achievements at Temple Beth David over the past few years?

- We have improved the <u>PHYSICAL PLANT</u> with ENHANCED SECURITY and have almost completed a NEW KITCHEN.
- We have placed great emphasis on our <u>YOUTH</u> <u>PROGRAMMING</u> and have hired a RABBINIC INTERN TO LEAD THE 9TH GRADE CLASSES AND YOUTH GROUPS.
- We have improved <u>MEMBERSHIP</u> through ENHANCED PUBLICITY, GREETER PROGRAMS and AN IMPROVED WEBSITE.
- We have achieved <u>FINANCIAL STABILITY</u> through development of the LASTING LEGACY program and more enrollment in the Early Childhood Learning Center.
- As a <u>CONGREGATION</u>, we have expanded the number of people involved in CHAVURAHS and held a TRIP TO ISRAEL. Our MUSICAL TRADITION continues to grow with increasing participation in the choir. We have STABILITY of staff and are encouraging new leaders to participate to keep things "fresh."

In summary, TBD remains a vibrant and successful community. The members of the Board continue to work diligently and remain dedicated to further improving the TBD community. The three principal areas of focus remain:

- 1) Enhance membership
- 2) Enhance financial stability
- 3) Promote greater youth programming and participation

Our work has just begun but I hope it will not be long before you see the fruits of our efforts. Please do not hesitate to contact me or any member of the Board if you have questions or suggestions.

Life Cycle Events

One of the main benefits we receive as Temple Beth David members is support for our life cycle events. The support is summarized here. In addition to this support, rabbinic counseling is available to members in time of need.

Often the first life cycle event is a baby naming. The namings are provided to our members and open to unaffiliated families in the community who are willing to raise their children Jewishly. If you know families who would like a naming for their child, please have them contact the Rabbi. Namings often lead to membership.

A reason that families join Temple Beth David is to have their children or grandchildren become a bar or bat mitzvah in our program that gears the ceremony to the individual ability and dedication to study of each child. We are justly proud of our program and we provide an adult b'nei mitzvah program.

Members and their children may hold their wedding ceremony at Temple Beth David under clergy guidance. In her recent Megillah article Rabbi Myers discussed her willingness to conduct weddings for interfaith couples who demonstrate their dedication to Judaism and to raising their children solely as Jews. For funerals our temple offers clergy for the service and for support in the family's time of need and offers the use of the sanctuary to members and their immediate family. Sisterhood, when possible offers families assistance in setting up and serving the meal of condolence and shiva minyan. In this era of nontraditional families, immediate family needs to be defined on a case by case basis since it might include others beyond parents and children. For such families it is important that the situation be discussed and defined with the Rabbi.

ARZA By Charlie Niederman Association of Reform Zionists of America





As the rockets are fired into Israel and the IDF is engaged in deadly urban warfare in Gaza resulting in high casualties on both sides, especially among the civilians caught in the cross fire, the discussion is of survival and not of peace. Perhaps in a week when you read this, Hamas will have finally agreed to a cease fire. Israel is under attack by a weakened Hamas that is attempting to reassert itself by trying to create terror in Israel and provoking ground action by the Israel Defense Force in Gaza. They callously use civilian areas to fire their rockets from the midst of the population in one of the world's most densely populated areas.

The rocket attacks create both physical and psychological problems for Israelis and their families. Here is a description of the response in their own words by the Israel Movement for Progressive Judaism. "From the moment that missiles began falling on Israel's south and center, the IMPJ, the umbrella organization of all Reform congregations and institutions in Israel, responded immediately using experience and infrastructure built during the Pillar of Cloud Operation less than two years ago. Lead by our humanitarian relief organization, Keren BeKavod (Fund for Dignity) IMPJ teams visited Ashkelon, Ashdod, Gedera, Sderot, Beer Sheva, and all the regional councils in the south and mapped needs and began organizing a response. A call for volunteers went out to all the congregations and communities of the IMPJ... and there has been an immediate response.

Based on our mapping of need ... the most urgent need is for activities for "weak" families with a special focus on children. It is important to note that our "hosen" group of Ethiopian women in Gedera... has already set up a "home day camp" for Ethiopian children ... In the south day camps have been cancelled. We are supporting both individual families and home day camps by preparing and distributing 2000 emergency activity packages. The packages... include games, interactive modules, and supplies that help productively occupy families and children. The packages are being prepared and distributed by our volunteers under the professional guidance of Keren BeKavod. Yesterday the campers at the IMPJ youth summer camp, packed hundreds of these packages. Very much connected with the need to occupy

children in the shelters is the need to give children and their families days of "relaxation and rest" from the bombings and life in the shelter. The following are programs that will take place over the next few days. Next week the Havaya Summer Camp of Noar Telem (the IMPJ youth movement) will open its doors and add to its existing campers another 50 youth from the south of Israel (between ages 9-14). A special "fun" program will be developed for the youth who will be completely integrated with the existing participants in the camp and participate in Educational field trips and visit special attractions.

Our congregations and communities in the North along with the Leo Baeck Academic Campus and Community Center in Haifa, and Kibbutz Yahel and Lotan in the arava have agreed to host families and children in homes of members (in the case of Kibbutz Yahel and Lotan in their guest house facilities) ... The congregations and communities in addition to hosting will arrange cultural, touring, and recreational activities for the families.

These are just a few of the steps that the IMPJ is immediately implementing as a response to the emergency situation. Additionally the IMPJ will carry out a set of mid and long term responses to the situation. There has been an outpouring of volunteers from IMPJ congregations including those living with sirens.

We all pray for an end to the conflict, for minimal suffering on all sides, and for peace.

We also pray for the same.


