Rabbi Nancy Rita Myers January 2016

Many of you are already aware that I'll be taking a sabbatical starting February 1, 2016. A rabbi's sabbatical is used for study, special projects, study in Israel, and/or to recharge one's rabbinate. Rabbis generally take a sabbatical every seven years. I've been a rabbi for just about 19 years and this is my first one. I am excited to work on a dream project of mine, writing a historical fictional novel on the judge, Deborah. This is something I started over fifteen years ago and had to put it on the back burner due to work and having children. I also know that it's important for me to take time to rejuvenate so that I can continue to serve as a congregational rabbi for many years to come. I want to thank you for your support and understanding of my time away. Thank you for giving me time to work on my book.

There are many questions about how things will work during my absence. I, along with our lay leaders and staff, have been planning for my sabbatical for at least half a year. Here's how the bigger events/areas will be covered in my absence.

Pastoral: Cantor Nancy Linder will be taking care of pastoral emergencies such as maintaining the *Mi Sheberach* list, phone calls, hospital visits, and funerals. When she is out of town, she will arrange for an area rabbi (like I would do). Please let her know if you or another congregant is in need of pastoral care.

Festival service will be led by Larry Matalon and Cantor Linder. Holocaust service will be led by Cantor Linder, our 9th graders, and will have organizational support of Charlie Niederman.

As we begin our secular new year, here is a look at Israel and its neighborhood. It is not a prediction for the year, and I have not seen or heard any that seem plausible. The Middle East is even less settled than it was a year ago, with new and more sophisticated extremists. Although there is new a coalition of Arab states pledged to fight the extremists, they have yet to fully engage them and it is not clear what it will all mean for Israel.

Within Israel itself, the governing right of center coalition has moved to consolidate its position and weaken the opposition. Currently a bill passed by the cabinet, made up of coalition members, was sent to the Knesset that would require nongovernment organizations (NGOs) to be more transparent about their funding, specifically funds from foreign nations. While it sounds benign and balanced, and a way to reduce foreign influence, it turns out to be aimed against the left opposition groups, because it spells out a threshold of foreign government funding that primarily affects them. There is no requirement to disclose private funding, such as that by the American Dr. Irving Moskowitz who has contributed more than \$85 million for construction on the West Bank and in East Jerusalem, primarily from the earnings of his casino and bingo hall in nearby Hawaiian Gardens.

Another less political but far sadder issue that was denounced by Prime Minister Netanyahu, and all but one of the ruling coalition members, was the video of the actions at a Jewish wedding reception in Jerusalem. It shows guests celebrating the killing of a Palestinian family in a dance brandishing guns and knives and repeatedly stabbing the picture of the 18 month old child victim. The groom and his family said they were unaware of what the dance was about and had they known would have stopped it. The arson in July that killed the Palestinian parents and their child has

sparked the current wave of Palestinian street violence that has resulted in the deaths of twenty Israelis, one American and one hundred twenty-one Palestinians. Jewish settler arson suspects are being questioned. Prime Minister Netanyahu said, "The shocking pictures that were broadcast... show the true face of a group that constitutes a danger to Israeli society and to the security of Israel."

To close on a promising note, the Israeli government has agreed to a deal with the developers to begin construction of the facilities that will bring in natural gas from its offshore natural gas field. They had hoped to sell to Egypt and Jordan, but a new Egyptian offshore gas field has eliminated that. However, relations appear to be improving with Turkey which is an energy consumer with a tenuous supply from the Russians whom they recently alienated by shooting down one of their aircraft. Nothing about such a deal has been publicized, but there are reports of preliminary discussions.

Despite the predominantly negative events ARZA and its partners in Israel have stood against the rising hatred and supported gender equality at the Western Wall, creating Arab-Jewish coexistence, and religious pluralism. The Israel Reform Movement continues to stand for a progressive vision of a Jewish democracy.



Dalia Taft: Celebrating 159 Years of Jewish Orange County: The Early Years




Dalia Taft is the archivist for the Orange County Jewish Historical Society. In that role she is responsible for increasing the awareness of the role Jews have played in the development of Orange County from 1857, when the first Jew settled in Anaheim, to now. She maintains the Society's archives and is currently in the process of digitizing their entire collection. She helped organize the organization's website and created their logo, and lectures regularly about the different significant periods in Orange County's Jewish History. Ms. Taft also writes a monthly column in JLife, Orange County's monthly Jewish magazine, highlighting

images from the society's archives, and she wrote and directed the documentary California Orange Jews, on the history of the Orange County Jewish community. In 2012 she published the book "Jewish Pioneers of Orange County" and in 2013 she created the Israel EXPO entrance banner, celebrating 65 years of Orange County Jewish history and the state of Israel.

Ms. Taft graduated from the University of California at Los Angeles with a degree in art, summa cum laude, Phi Beta Kappa, and her professional experience includes work as educator at the Simon Wiesenthal Museum of Tolerance in Los Angeles and public relations manager with the Easter Seals organization. She lives in Irvine with her husband Noah and their two children, Nathan and Kayla.

Jews have been in Orange County since 1857, when it was still a part of Los Angeles County, and have made significant contributions ever since. Ms. Taft will show how many of Orange County's early Jewish pioneers were actively involved in local commerce and politics while still maintaining their Jewish identity. The lecture includes a montage of old photos, period newspaper announcements and vintage advertisements.

I have learned so much from all of you over the years. I learned right away when I started at TBD that kindness was appreciated here. You can only truly understand the importance of being able to work where kindness counts after you have worked where it does not. I continue to learn new things from you each day. You have all shown me new ways to see things, taught me to appreciate the day to day ordinariness of life, made me realize how precious that feeling of community is and how important it is to belong and contribute to it. Even though I could not understand the Hebrew, over the years I learned every song, every chant, the pattern of every ceremony and celebration. I would find myself humming the music for days after the HHD's, and I am here to tell you that you do not have to officially be Jewish to experience the joy and peace from those services. I am grateful for all of the ways that you have allowed myself and my family to feel that we did belong here, that we were part of the TBD family. I can never thank the Sisterhood enough for that awesome Baby Shower that they gave us after Noelle was placed with us. That was so over the top that words cannot even touch it. It was wonderful that Noelle was able to come here to the Early Childhood Learning Center where she got the best schooling start that anyone could hope for. I still miss being able to spy on her while they were playing, and to know that she was safe and close by. We have been very blessed that Noelle has been able to grow up knowing so many "Temple Aunties". That has been priceless.

I have also learned a lot of things from many who are no longer with us. From Fred Wolff, I learned that honesty and a sense of humor can go together well, and that a quirky smile in a picture frame on a memorial table can make the loss a reality like nothing else can. There are still some hanging file folder labels in my office that have his hand writing on them. From Mark and Bobbie Bennett, and especially from Mort Wedner, I learned that height has no correlation to feistiness. During one of the phone calls that Mort made to my office regarding Foundation business, he taught me how to handle someone who was making unreasonable demands. He said, "Just ask them what they want you to do. Then shut up. Don't say a word. Let them come up with the solution." He also ended every call by asking me to let him know if there was anyone who was giving me a hard time, that he would come over here and adjust their attitude. From Dorothy Wiener, I learned the power of choosing to care and that service never stops. As a retired nurse, even near 90, she never said no to the Red Cross when they called her, no matter where they needed her help. From Gary Prince, I learned what a real Mitzvah is – that it is done because you see a need that you can fill, without fanfare or recognition or even acknowledgement; that you give because it's the right thing to do. All of those who have passed while I have been here, long ago or just recently, have touched my heart and I will carry their blessed memories with me always.

So much has changed in these past 20 years. I have watched sweet babies grow into wonderful adults, I have watched these very buildings go through a marvelous renovation, I have watched Board Presidents and Board members come and go, as well as staff and clergy. Temple Beth David remains, always.

Many years ago, Rabbi Mayersohn tried to make everyone here at TBD understand that it was O.K. to schedule more than one event or meeting or whatever on any given day, that different things would appeal to different people. Now there is so much on the calendar that it is hard to keep up with it. That alone is proof that TBD has grown into a strong and vital community. There's <u>always</u> something going on to interest you, <u>always</u> a reason to be HERE, <u>always</u> a way to be involved.
