ARZA By Charlie Niederman Association of Reform Zionists of America

Before discussing the election to determine who will represent the United States at the World Zionist Congress, here is some information about the upcoming Israeli election. The coalition that governed for less than two years was noted much more for its disagreements than its accomplishments. It was the shortest lived government in Israel's history. When the coalition government was dissolved in December the polls showed Prime Minister Netanyahu's right wing combination of parties and their allies with a comfortable lead, but a recent poll shows a virtual dead heat between them and the Labor Party combination and their allies. It will be an exciting campaign before the vote on March 17.

One other item of note, on Friday, October 24th, Women of the Wall managed to sneak a tiny Torah up to the Kotel Western Wall of the Temple, to help celebrate the first Bat Mitzvah at the Western Wall in modern Jewish history. There is a compromise under negotiation to establish an egalitarian prayer area at the Temple wall. Whether negotiations will continue under a new government will depend on the election results.

With regard to the World Zionist Congress, during 2015, the American Zionist Movement will hold elections to determine the US delegation to the Congress, the highest legislative body of the World Zionist Organization, that will convene in October. The Congress provides a forum for all the world's Jews to come together and deliberate about issues affecting both Diaspora Jews and the state of affairs in Israel. There are 145 seats in the Congress dedicated to the American Zionist Movement out of the total of 525. The composition of the Congress has both financial and policy implications in Israel, because resources are directed to recipients primarily in Israel based on the voting power and the policies of each party within the Congress.

ARZA has announced that we have the opportunity to achieve our vision of a just, equal, pluralistic future for Israel by voting to support Reform Judaism in the 2015 world Zionist organization election. These elections are the strongest way for American Reform Jews to promote and encourage the ideals of justice, equality, and democracy in Israel and to help build the kind of pluralistic Jewish state we all know is possible.

Voting begins on January 13, 2015, and ends on April 30, 2015. You can register and vote at the same time. Every Jewish man and woman over 18 is entitled to vote for the slate of his or her choice. The web address for voting is not yet available. You can pledge to vote for the ARZA slate at www.arza.org and be notified of the link, or just go to the ARZA site after January 13 to get the link. To cover the election cost the American Zionist Movement charges a \$5 fee for persons under age 30, and \$10 for those over age 30. (In Herzl's time, the fee was one shekel.) Now for the price of a latte, you can help Jews around the world and promote pluralism in Israel. Please make your vote for the ARZA slate.




