“Your son is at five your master, at ten your servant, at fifteen your double, and after that, your friend or foe, depending on his bringing up.” Hasdai ibn Crescas (1230 c.e.)

As we approach Father's day, some of us are blessed to have or had wonderful fathers and some of us were less so. For those with fathers who lacked presence, love, or mental health, sometimes we can say, “they did the best they knew how.” We know the limitations of parents based on generational expectations and the upbringing they lived through. I've come to learn that people can only give what they have. If they didn't experience love and support from their own parents, they may not know how when it is their turn. The consolation for those with fathers who 'weren't the best' can be that when it's our turn, we strive to improve and make a better life for our children and grandchildren.

I consider myself lucky. I am blessed to have a wonderful father. My dad was always able to express affection not only to me but also openly with my brothers. My brother Bennett, as a boy, came to be embarrassed by my father's hugs so my dad had to sneak them in the car as he was dropped off at baseball practice. My youngest brother, Nathan, recounts telling my dad not to call him sweetheart anymore. My dad said without thinking, “Okay, honey.” I, for my part, always appreciated my father's gentle personality, his willingness to look for the best in others, his intellect, love of life and people, and his athletic ability. He would impress us kids with throwing a baseball higher than our two story house and catch it behind his back. He was also always there at every major event and family gathering. He just didn't want to miss out on family fun. When I'm frustrated, I think of his saying, “*There is more than one way to skin a cat,*” meaning there may be other ways to accomplish what I want. He also taught me that our weakness can be a strength. I find myself pondering that from time to time.

I am also blessed to have a wonderful father for my two children. In my younger years, it was hard to find a man who was willing to truly share children rearing with me. Especially as I was getting closer to ordination, I didn't want it automatically assumed that I would be the one to stop working. A few years back, I asked Paul if his dream job came up, would he take it? He told me that he has his dream job. He is raising our children and that he can't think of anything more important. Paul has many stories of watching our babies and his adventures as the only male at the “Mommy and Me” groups. I was lucky to meet Paul and he has proved to be a very involved, loving father for both Gabriel and Shane.

Parenthood isn't easy but fortunately perfection isn't required. May our love, presence, and support of our children raise up another generation of good fathers and mothers.

And may all our fathers have a relaxing and joyful Father's day.

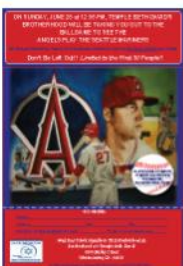
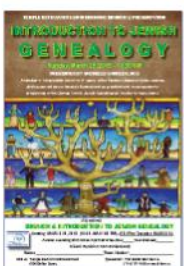

ARZA

As you probably know, a half hour before the allotted time ran out, Israel's Prime Minister Netanyahu established a coalition government that controls the narrowest of majorities, 61 seats in the 120 seat Knesset. The narrow majority makes it difficult for the new government to achieve its objectives that include rolling back recent reforms that sought to end an unpopular system that granted the ultra-Orthodox exemptions from compulsory military service, welfare subsidies to study full-time instead of entering the work force, and generous budgets for a religious school system that largely ignores key subjects like math, English and computer studies. The inclusion of the Jewish Home party in the coalition means that there will be pressure to expand the settlements in the West Bank. It will be interesting to see how long this government can last.

From all reports that I have heard, the election turnout for the American delegation to the World Zionist Congress was very low. The results have yet to be announced, so we do not know how well the ARZA slated did. Thank you to all who voted for the ARZA slate.

For the last two weeks Cathy and I have been visiting the Progressive Jewish community in Buenos Aires, Argentina and the World Union for Progressive Judaism (WUPJ) biennial convention called "Connections" in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The WUPJ is the international umbrella organization of the Reform, Liberal, Progressive, and Reconstructionist movements. It supports 1,200 congregations with 1.8 million members in more than 45 countries with special emphasis on the Israel Movement for Progressive and Reform Judaism. Our visit to Buenos Aires was part of a WUPJ mission to show support to the local Jewish community. Anti-Semitism is not a serious

problem there, but the terror bombings that destroyed the Jewish Community Center in 1994 killing 85 and injuring 300 and the 1992 destruction of the Israeli Embassy remain unsolved. The recent death under suspicious circumstances in January of the late prosecutor, Alberto Nisman, has sparked renewed national controversy there. We witnessed the ground breaking for a new Jewish Community Center and attended services at three synagogues concluding with havdalah at Mishkan Congregation, the only Reform congregation. The WUPJ convention celebrated the selection of a new President, Rabbi Daniel Freeland, a former Vice President of North America's Union for Reform Judaism. The tone of the convention was much more upbeat than 2 years ago with the improvement of the Union's financial status and the addition of the Latin Jewish music. Progressive Judaism in Europe and the Former Soviet Union is experiencing anti-Semitism, but the congregations are stable and they have scheduled a convention this fall. A Torah scroll was presented to the congregation in Hong Kong at the convention and there has been some expansion in the Australia and Eastern Asia region. The next WUPJ convention will be in Jerusalem in 2017.

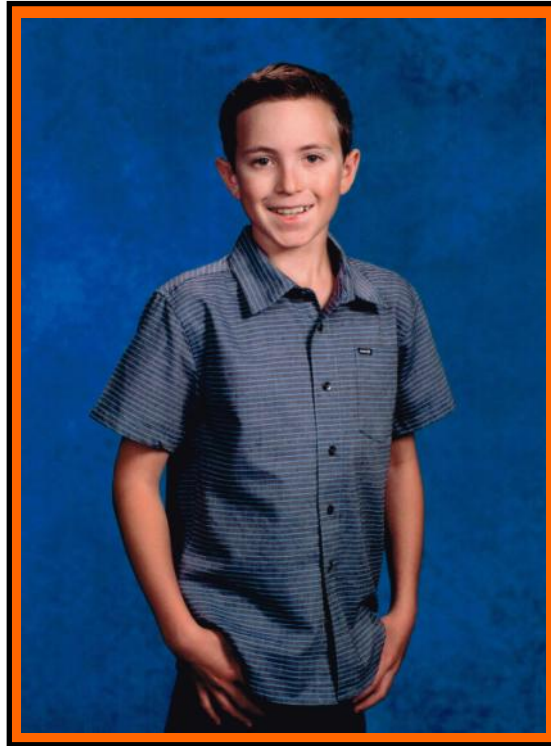

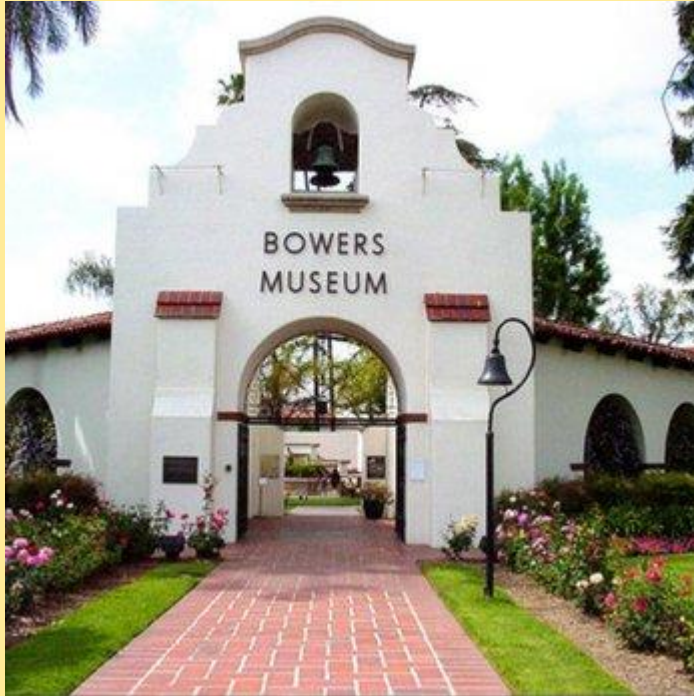

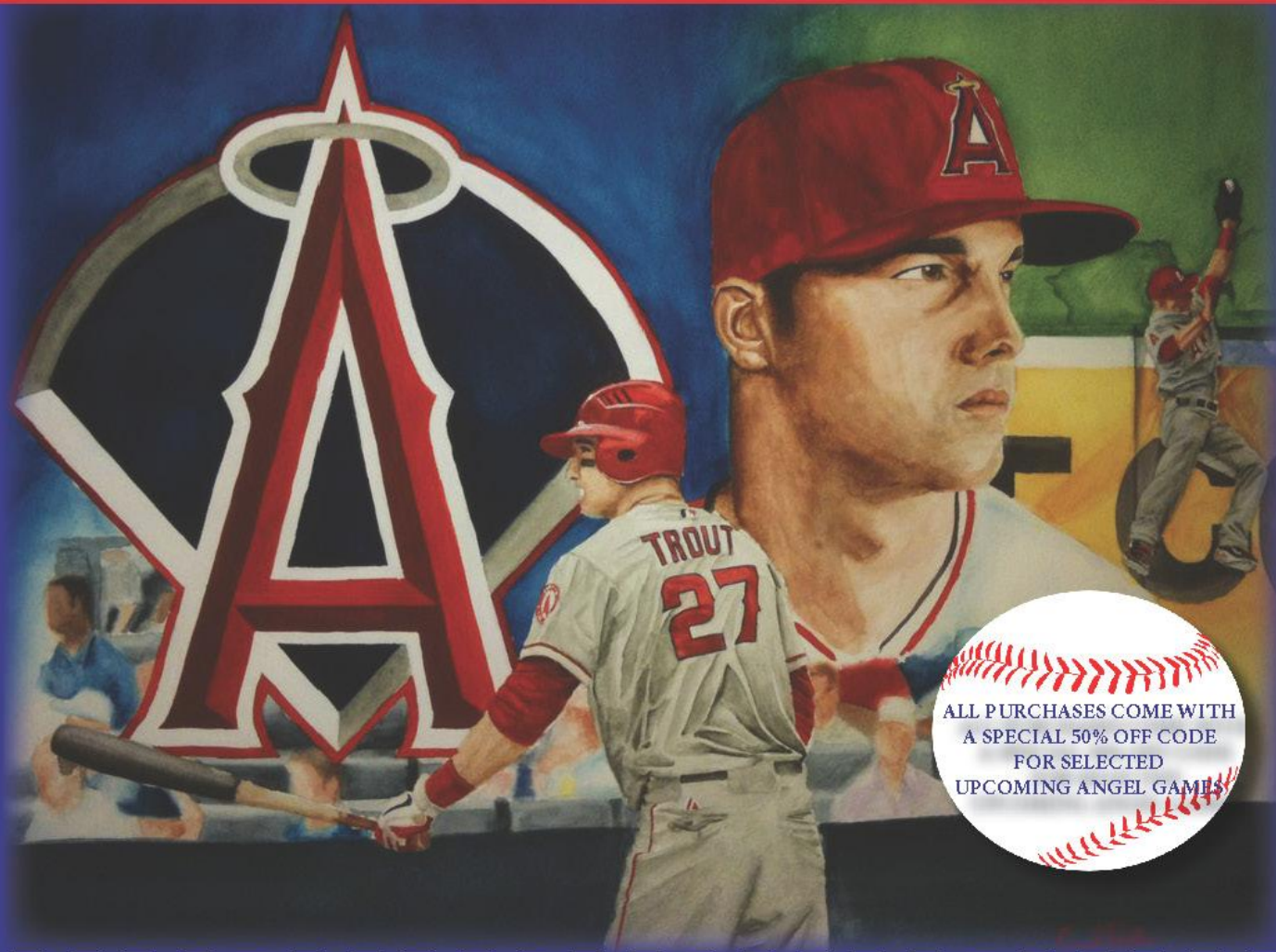
