To follow up on the report last month, there has been little change or action on the Temple Mount.

Israel's coalition government changed last week to include Avigdor Lieberman's Yisrael Beitenu party, and Liberman succeeded Moshe Yaalon as defense Minister. Lieberman is a tough, right-wing politician known for both his tense relationship with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his aggressive attitude toward Israel's neighbors.

Yaalon's departure was precipitated by an incident in which an Israeli soldier shot and killed a Palestinian captured after an knife attack, who was lying severely wounded on the ground.. The incident divided the Israeli public and its leaders, with some expressing outrage over the killing of an incapacitated man, and others supporting even the most extreme response to a stabbing attack Yaalon sharply criticized .the soldier, saying anyone who supported what he did " is damaging the values of the

Israel Defense Forces."

Yaalon decided to resign after finding out that Netanyahu was openly offering his job to other parties. He is a Likud party stalwart, as is Netanyhu. Yaalon also resigned from the Knesset saying that he was

"taking time out from political life" due to his "lack of faith" in Netanyahu and that he was "fearful for Israel's future" under the current leadership.

If that wasn't enough, the Environment Minister, Avi Gabby, left the coalition government in protest of Lieberman's appointment saying that Netanyahu should wake up, Israel doesn't want an extremist government. Gabby was not a Knesset member, so the coalition lost no seat, but how long this new coalition will last, given Lieberman's prior bad relationship with Netanyahu, is anyone's guess. On a more positive note for progressive Jews,

the Israel Supreme Court provided the Reform

and Conservative movements a ray of hope in

their ongoing struggle to have Jews converted by their rabbis in Israel recognized as Jews by the state.

Responding to a request submitted by the Israel Religious Action Center (IRAC), the advocacy arm of the Reform Movement in Israel, the court ordered the state to explain within 60 days why individuals who are converted by Reform and Conservative rabbis in Israel are not entitled to benefits provided by the Law of Return.

The Law of Return grants automatic citizenship and other financial incentives to Jews who make aliva to Israel. Individuals who move to Israel and are converted by state-sanctioned Orthodox rabbinical courts, operated by the Chief Rabbinate, are entitled to benefits under the Law of Return.

Responding to the decision, Rabbi Gilad Kariv, executive director of the Reform movement in Israel, called on Attorney General Avichai Mendelblit to "take a bold but necessary step" and announce that in light of the court's decision, the state withdraws its opposition to Reform conversions."



In Times of Need PREPARING FOR A FUNERAL

The death of a loved one is so often a painful and confusing time for members of the family and dear friends. This guide will assist you in planning the funeral as well as offer helpful information.

- Contact Temple office (714) 892-6623
- Contact Mount Olive (714) 361-9631 or Mortuary of Choice regarding Burial/ Funeral Arrangements/Casket
- If your loved one was a veteran, the mortuary can arrange for a military funeral.
- Order food for Meal of Condolence.
  - Dairy or Meat platters can be ordered from: Katella Deli (Los Alamitos) (562) 594-8611 Kosher Deli (Tustin) (714)838-3108 Benji's (Tustin) (714) 541-6263 Lucci's (Huntington Beach) (714) 962-7998 or place of choice.
- Meal of Condolence: The Mitzvah Corps will coordinate the date, time whether at the Temple or home. (\*\*see note)
- Shiva The Mitzvah Corps will also provide the same services for the first night of Shiva at either the Temple or at the home.

\*\*The Mitzvah Corps is not responsible for ordering food for the Meal of Condolence. Role of Temple Beth David and Mortuary

Coordinate with the Rabbi and mortuary as to time and date. If necessary, allow for out-ofstate family to arrive.

#### ++4

Mortuary will order the Death Certificates and place the family prepared Obituary Notice in the local paper/s. They will also arrange for a Military funeral if requested.

#### +++

Temple Beth David office will send out an Email Blast with information as to the time and place of the funeral.

#### +++

<u>Meal of Condolence</u>: The Mitzvah Corps will set up and clean up at the Temple or home of mourning. The Mitzvah Corps <u>only</u> provides paper goods, coffee, tea, water and desserts. However, they can suggest the amount of deli/dairy food to be ordered based on the number of mourners expected.

#### ++

<u>Shiva</u>: The Mitzvah Corps will provide the same service as above on the first night of Shiva at either the Temple or the home.

#### +++

 It is customary to send an honorarium to the Rabbi and Cantor (Discretionary Fund) and Mitzvah Corps (Sisterhood) for their services.

#### **Customs and Jewish Traditions**

• <u>Sitting Shiva</u>: The practice of sitting shiva provides a time for mourning. A time where the mourners may dwell together and have friends and loved ones come to support them with short visits when they "make a *shiva call*." It is considered a great mitzvah (act of kindness) to visit someone "*sitting shiva*."

It is up to the family as to how many days they choose to "*sit shiva*."

#### +++

•<u>Meal of Condolence</u>: Traditionally, the meal is dairy and would include such foods such as hard boiled eggs and bagels, which sy mbolize the cycle of life. Today, many families choose to have the Meal of Condolence catered by a local Deli.

#### +++

#### FAQ:

A \*benefit of Temple Beth David Membership is the use of the sanctuary and social hall in time of need. Funeral services may be conducted in the sanctuary before proceeding to the burial site. The social hall may be used for the Meal of Condolence. Shiva may also be held at the Temple.

\*Please note that these benefits are only available to Temple members and their immediate family: ie Parents, Spouse, Children.

#### Unveiling

Unveiling is the formal dedication of the monument/tombstone. At an unveiling, a veil, cloth, or even a handkerchief draped over the stone is removed. This serves as a completion of the erection of the stone.

While many families wait until almost a full year has passed, others schedule the unveiling sooner, at a time when family members are available. This provides another opportunity for family and friends to gather and remember their loved one.

Choosing a headstone is a very personal choice. The mortuary (Mount Olive) handles all details and has many designs and styles from which to choose.

The headstone/plaque should be ordered well in advance of the scheduled unveiling date.

Unveiling Ceremony: The unveiling ceremony can be officiated by the Rabbi, family member or close friend. The ceremony consists of the recitation of Psalms, a very brief eulogy encapsulating the most salient characteristics of the deceased, removing the cloth covering the headstone, the El Maleh Rahamim, and the Mourner's Kaddish

#### Immortality

#### IN Remembrance We note with sadness the recent passing of...




