The March article was somehow lost on my computer in the final draft. All that remained was a letter used for background material that unwittingly ended up being published instead of deleted. So, below is a reconstruction of the original article.

Continuing from last month, the Turkey and Israel negotiations to normalize relations appear to have received no coverage, and neither Turkey nor Israel officially confirm that there are talks.

Another continuation from last month's article is an update on the narrative about Elsa, the Russian woman who came to Israel to adopt her nephews after her sister's death and planned to return to Russia. She was persuaded by Israeli social workers to remain in Israel and raise the children. Now that the oldest is in the Israel Defense Force, the government decided to deport her. The Israel Religious Action Center, a part of Israel's Reform movement, intervened on her behalf and the good news is that Elsa has been granted permanent resident status.

The day the February article was submitted there was a major step to a more pluralistic Israel. After months of wrangling an agreement was announced by Israel's cabinet for the development of an egalitarian prayer area at the Western Wall, the Kotel in Hebrew, a remnant of the retaining wall that supports the Temple Mount. This is in addition to the men's and women's areas. There will be an area where men, women. and families will be allowed to pray together. Prime Minister Netanyahu described it as "a fair and creative solution" and "a compromise on this delicate issue in a place that is supposed to unite the lewish people." The decision was hailed as historic by American Jewish leaders. Rabbi Rick Jacobs,

the president of the Union of Reform Judaism, described it as "obviously the result of years and years of advocacy and agitation."

It will be governed by a committee chaired by the head of the Jewish Agency, a quasigovernmental organization that works with the Jewish Diaspora, and will include representatives from the Reform and Conservative movements, the Jewish Federations of North America, the Israeli government and Women of the Wall. The cabinet was not unanimous and some members denounced the decision and the Reform and Conservative movements, questioning the authenticity of Judaism that those movements practice. The group included Deputy Education Minister Meir Porush, MK Moshe Gafni, and Tourism Minister Yariy Levin, Prime Minister Netanyahu swiftly condemned the offensive statements that threaten Jewish unity, and have no place in civil discourse. I joined other Reform Jews in sending him a thank vou email, which is only fair, since we are prompt in criticizing other actions of his coalition government.



- Meal of Condolence: The Mitzvah Corps will coordinate the date, time whether at the Temple or home. (**see note)
- Shiva The Mitzvah Corps will also provide the same services for the first night of Shiva at either the Temple or at the home.

**The Mitzvah Corps is not responsible for ordering food for the Meal of Condolence. Role of Temple Beth David and Mortuary

Coordinate with the Rabbi and mortuary as to time and date. If necessary, allow for out-ofstate family to arrive.

Mortuary will order the Death Certificates and place the family prepared Obituary Notice in the local paper/s. They will also arrange for a Military funeral if requested.

Temple Beth David office will send out an Email Blast with information as to the time and place of the funeral.

<u>Meal of Condolence</u>: The Mitzvah Corps will set up and clean up at the Temple or home of mourning. The Mitzvah Corps <u>only</u> provides paper goods, coffee, tea, water and desserts. However, they can suggest the amount of deli/dairy food to be ordered based on the number of mourners expected.

++

<u>Shiva</u>: The Mitzvah Corps will provide the same service as above on the first night of Shiva at either the Temple or the home.

+++

 It is customary to send an honorarium to the Rabbi and Cantor (Discretionary Fund) and Mitzvah Corps (Sisterhood) for their services.

Customs and Jewish Traditions

• <u>Sitting Shiva</u>: The practice of sitting shiva provides a time for mourning. A time where the mourners may dwell together and have friends and loved ones come to support them with short visits when they "make a *shiva call*." It is considered a great mitzvah (act of kindness) to visit someone "*sitting shiva*."

It is up to the family as to how many days they choose to "*sit shiva*."

•<u>Meal of Condolence</u>: Traditionally, the meal is dairy and would include such foods such as hard boiled eggs and bagels, which sy mbolize the cycle of life. Today, many families choose to have the Meal of Condolence catered by a local Deli.

+++

FAQ:

A *benefit of Temple Beth David Membership is the use of the sanctuary and social hall in time of need. Funeral services may be conducted in the sanctuary before proceeding to the burial site. The social hall may be used for the Meal of Condolence. Shiva may also be held at the Temple.

*Please note that these benefits are only available to Temple members and their immediate family: ie Parents, Spouse, Children.

Unveiling

Unveiling is the formal dedication of the monument/tombstone. At an unveiling, a veil, cloth, or even a handkerchief draped over the stone is removed. This serves as a completion of the erection of the stone.

While many families wait until almost a full year has passed, others schedule the unveiling sooner, at a time when family members are available. This provides another opportunity for family and friends to gather and remember their loved one.

Choosing a headstone is a very personal choice. The mortuary (Mount Olive) handles all details and has many designs and styles from which to choose.

The headstone/plaque should be ordered well in advance of the scheduled unveiling date.

Unveiling Ceremony: The unveiling ceremony can be officiated by the Rabbi, family member or close friend. The ceremony consists of the recitation of Psalms, a very brief eulogy encapsulating the most salient characteristics of the deceased, removing the cloth covering the headstone, the El Maleh Rahamim, and the Mourner's Kaddish


