

Currently Jerusalem and all of Israel is experiencing what may be a new Intifada (wave of Palestinian violence). This one is marked primarily by the stabbing of Israelis by Palestinians, mostly in their teens and twenties. One important and continuing source of tension is the control of the Temple Mount and its visitors.

Since the end of the 1967 Six Days War when Israel captured the entirety of Jerusalem, the Mount itself has been under the custodianship of Jordan's Wakf Islamic trust, even though Israel provides security and enforces the law there. The mount is Islam's third most holy site after Mecca, and Medina. Both are pilgrimage sites in Saudi Arabia. To Muslims it is the place where Mohammed ascended to visit heaven on a steed provide him by the angel Gabriel. To Jews it is the site of the two Temples making it Judaism's most holy site. Relinquishing control was an important part of achieving an end to the 1967 conflict.

Visitors are allowed on the Temple Mount, but only Muslims are allowed to pray there. The site serves as a propaganda source for the Palestinian leadership and their media often enflame violent reactions to events on the Mount. The basic theme is that Jews plan to destroy the Al-Aksa Mosque that sits atop the Mount. One such incident occurred when the Israelis tried to replace temporary wooden steps to the Mount with more permanent access. Rioting occurred when rumors spread that access was being eliminated. The security forces closed down the area for several hours until order was restored and those caught on the Mount could leave. I was in Israel at the time and it was reported by the local and international press. About three months later, after giving a brief speech at a local peace conference, I heard a description of the event by a Muslim acquaintance who was also in Jerusalem and claimed that the worshippers on the mount were held hostage without cause until international pressure was put on Israel to release them. Recently, police have removed more than a dozen Jews from the site for praying, or ignoring clear police orders to preserve the delicate status quo. Muslim extremists visited the Mount last September and ultimately had to be forcibly removed because they were attacking visitors. That event and the ensuing publicity further fueled the current wave of violence.

In the last two days the Jordanian government has decided to suspend a controversial plan to install cameras on the Temple Mount due to Palestinian protests, particularly in Jerusalem. Jordanian Prime Minister Abdullah Ensour said the installation of TV cameras had the express purpose of documenting Israeli infractions

and entrances to the area. According to Ensour, such documentation would have served the legal and public diplomacy of both Jordan and the Palestinians, because Israel "always denies responsibility for its infractions." The cameras would also strengthen ties between the Mount and believers throughout the Muslim and the Arab world, he said.

Prime Minister Netanyahu also spoke about his agreement with the Jordanians to place cameras on the Temple Mount. They would have broadcast a live feed from the compound. "Israel has an interest in placing cameras at all parts of the Temple Mount," he said. "First, to refute the claim that Israel is changing the status quo; second, to show where the provocations really come from, and to thwart them in advance." Even when the parties have their own good reasons to agree it does not happen on the Temple Mount where emotions rule.

Susanne "Sue" Wolff, a temple member since 1982, had quite a unique childhood. At 10 months old right after Kristallnacht in 1938, her family fled from Berlin, Germany to Shanghai, China where they lived for nearly a decade. Her dad worked for a Portuguese import/export firm and her mother for a clothing manufacturer. After Pearl Harbor, she recalls being forced by the Japanese to move into a tiny home with many other Jews within a 12 block ghetto surrounded by barbed wire.







- If your loved one was a veteran, the mortuary can arrange for a military funeral.
- Order food for Meal of Condolence.

 Benji's (Tustin) (714) 541-6263
 Lucci's (Huntington Beach) (714) 962-7998 or place of choice.
- Meal of Condolence: The Mitzvah Corps will coordinate the date, time whether at the Temple or home. (**see note)
- Shiva The Mitzvah Corps will also provide the same services for the first night of Shiva at either the Temple or at the home.
- **The Mitzvah Corps is not responsible for ordering food for the Meal of Condolence.

Role of Temple Beth David and Mortuary

Coordinate with the Rabbi and mortuary as to time and date. If necessary, allow for out-of-state family to arrive.



Mortuary will order the Death Certificates and place the family prepared Obituary Notice in the local paper/s. They will also arrange for a Military funeral if requested.



Temple Beth David office will send out an Email Blast with information as to the time and place of the funeral.

Meal of Condolence: The Mitzvah Corps will set up and clean up at the Temple or home of mourning. The Mitzvah Corps only provides paper goods, coffee, tea, water and desserts. However, they can suggest the amount of deli/dairy food to be ordered based on the number of mourners expected.

+++

Shiva: The Mitzvah Corps will provide the same service as above on the first night of Shiva at either the Temple or the home.

+++

 It is customary to send an honorarium to the Rabbi and Cantor (Discretionary Fund) and Mitzvah Corps (Sisterhood) for their services. **Customs and Jewish Traditions**

• <u>Sitting Shiva</u>: The practice of sitting shiva provides a time for mourning. A time where the mourners may dwell together and have friends and loved ones come to support them with short visits when they "make a *shiva call*." It is considered a great mitzvah (act of kindness) to visit someone "*sitting shiva*."

It is up to the family as to how many days they choose to "sit shiva."

 Meal of Condolence: Traditionally, the meal is dairy and would include such foods such as hard boiled eggs and bagels, which sy mbolize the cycle of life.

Today, many families choose to have the Meal of Condolence catered by a local Deli.

FAO:

A *benefit of Temple Beth David Membership is the use of the sanctuary and social hall
in time of need. Funeral services may be
conducted in the sanctuary before proceeding
to the burial site. The social hall may be used
for the Meal of Condolence. Shiva may also be
held at the Temple.

*Please note that these benefits are only available to Temple members and their immediate family: ie Parents, Spouse, Children.

Unveiling

Unveiling is the formal dedication of the monument/tombstone. At an unveiling, a veil, cloth, or even a handkerchief draped over the stone is removed. This serves as a completion of the erection of the stone.

While many families wait until almost a full year has passed, others schedule the unveiling sooner, at a time when family members are available. This provides another opportunity for family and friends to gather and remember their loved one.

Choosing a headstone is a very personal choice. The mortuary (Mount Olive) handles all details and has many designs and styles from which to choose.

The headstone/plaque should be ordered well in advance of the scheduled unveiling date.

Unveiling Ceremony: The unveiling ceremony can be officiated by the Rabbi, family member or close friend. The ceremony consists of the recitation of Psalms, a very brief eulogy encapsulating the most salient characteristics of the deceased, removing the cloth covering the headstone, the El Maleh Rahamim, and the Mourner's Kaddish


