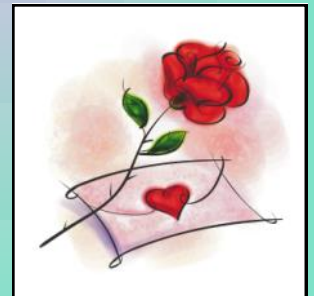

Reflecting on my 10 years at Temple Beth David

Ten years, a decade, is that a long time? When I was a child and a teenager, it was a big deal. Ten years covered such a great period of growth, change, and new experiences. I had a Bat Mitzvah, learned to drive, and went off to college. However, now that I'm in my 4th decade of life, ten years doesn't seem quite so long. A lot happens in ten years to be sure but time seems to move quicker the older I am.

Even though ten years may not be a lot given that I hope to live well into old age, ten years is a significant amount of time. In Judaism, the number ten comes to be connected with a minyan. This is the number of Jewish adults required to publicly read the Torah, recite a full service, and say the mourner's kaddish out loud. The number ten for Jews is the minimal number for community.

As I reflect on my ten years at Temple Beth David, I find myself marveling how I came to be part of our community. I arrived here with two toddlers. Gabriel was 3 and Shane was 1 ½. At services, Shane would race around the sanctuary, not able to sit for more than 3 minutes. My husband Paul would be sweating through his button down shirt from the exertion of preventing Shane from storming the bimah. We were new to California but it didn't take long for us to appreciate the closeness of the ocean, mountains, and desert and gratefully, the lack of mosquitoes. At our synagogue, we found ourselves quickly making friends, arranging play dates, and sharing laughs with congregants.

As I look back over the ten years at Temple Beth David, it's hard for me to recount all the experiences we have shared. We have learned words of Torah together in adult education classes, Torah studies, and Friday night discussions. We have experimented with novel ways to celebrate Shavuot, Selichot, Simchat Torah, Chanukah, and Purim. We have celebrated the birth of children, their Bnei Mitzvah, and weddings. And we have sought strength in times of loss.

Over the past decade, I have witnessed the growth of our music program with volunteers overfilling our choir loft, the sweetness of our junior choir, and the talented musicians in our community. I see wonderful lay leaders of good hearts and minds responsibly lead our congregation. I rejoice with the success of our ECLC, i.e., our preschool. I marvel at all those who help out with programs, assist those in need, and make our Temple into a community. And I love that our community is truly intergenerational with toddlers, school age children, teenagers, young adults, couples, singles, and those wise with age.

I feel so proud of our synagogue and where we are today. I hope to continue to work towards making our community a stronger one infused with *kedushah*, holiness, as we continue to build for our future. In retrospect, ten years is indeed significant and I hope to continue to count our blessings as a community for many years to come.

A TRIBUTE TO RABBI NANCY MYERS

In honor of her 10th Anniversary at Temple Beth David

The number 10 has special significance within our history, observances, and overall heritage – the 10 Commandments being the most prominent and then it takes 10 Jewish people to make a minyan for prayer – to name just a couple. It is this thought of “minyan” – of a communal group forming – that has special significance for Rabbi Nancy Rita Myers as she reflects on the past 10 years as Rabbi of Temple Beth David.

It's no surprise Rabbi Nancy loves being Jewish. During her childhood, it was a fun, creative, and meaningful experience. For example, seders with her parents and two siblings included an animated telling of the Israelites' exodus out of Egypt. It's a tradition that continues in Paul's and Rabbi Nancy's home with their own kids telling the Passover story in much the same joyful fashion. During her youth, Rabbi Nancy was actively involved in Jewish youth groups yet still fit in service groups and competing in school sports such as swimming, track, and softball.



In her college years, she seriously considered pursuing a career in either psychology or law. The latter would be following in her dad's footsteps. He had taken her to his law office many times during her childhood and realized early on she'd make a good attorney – with her analytical way of thinking, orator skills, and thirst for learning. Yet her career choice took a shift when she was inspired by some coursework and very thought provoking professors. She changed from psychology to philosophy enjoying the opportunity to question things more. This is an element in Judaism she so enjoys. She earned her Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy from State University of New York at Binghamton which included a semester in Jerusalem. She went on to complete her graduate work including a year of study in Israel through Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York. Her thesis was “A Socio Political Study of Elijah del Medigo's Examination of Faith” – about a Renaissance Jewish philosopher in Italy. Ordained as Rabbi in May 1997, she recalls feeling very humbled knowing there was so much more to learn that only time and experience as a Rabbi could give her.

Roles leading up to her ordination included being base person in Israel's Golan Heights for the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, a 5th and 6th grade teacher at a temple, student rabbi for congregations in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, and Rabbinic intern for Temple Israel in New York. After being ordained, she lead spirituality seminars on a Naval Base, taught conversion classes, and served as community coordinator for the Interfaith Collaboration of Emerging Leaders where she brought together Jewish, Muslim, Sikh, and Greek Orthodox youth to foster understanding and tolerance in the wake of September 11th.

Her first rabbinic role was at Temple Chai in Illinois where for six years she served as their Associate Rabbi. Coming from a very large congregation to the more intimate Temple Beth David was something she very much looked forward to. She loves how caring, committed, and connected our members are. Her favorite moments are when she sees our diverse group of members of all ages, ethnicities, and backgrounds engaged together in prayer, learning, and enjoying holiday observances and temple activities. It truly is this closeness we share with one another and how committed we are to our Temple that means the most to her as she reflects on her past decade with us.

Some special moments our members have of our Rabbi are her spirited rendition of the seder story and her energetic storytelling on Family Shabbat service night, how personable and knowledgeable she is as she answers congregants' questions on Ask the Rabbi Night (5th Friday), how she provides thoughtful comfort during difficult times, and her passion to teach us. Her creation of our Lasting Legacy Program and her term as President of the Orange County Board of Rabbis are among the many accomplishments she is well respected for. Most recently, she has become a regular columnist on Jewish topics for a variety of local media. Years before she wrote a chapter in The Women's Haftarah Commentary: New Insights from Women Rabbis.

During her rabbinical studies she was bestowed many awards from Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion. They include United Hospital Fund volunteer recognition, The Rabbi Hugo Hahn Memorial Prize for excelling in History, and The Dr. and Mrs. Henry Slonimsky Prize in Midrash.

Beyond her role at Temple Beth David, Rabbi Myers loves being a wife and mother. To see how supportive and involved her husband Paul and their children Gabriel and Shane are makes her rabbinic experience that much more enjoyable. She also loves the outdoors, hiking, doing karate, listening to rock 'n roll, and cooking with a zest for trying out new recipes. Before she leads our Friday night services, she and her family enjoy a homemade Shabbat dinner at home. This is a tradition she carries on from her own childhood days.

Speaking of tradition, in our faith it is a mitzvah to thank G-d for our many blessings. Thus, “Thank you G-d for Rabbi Nancy Myers” for all the ways she has and will continue to bring love, learning, and life to our precious Temple Beth David family tree!

Temple Member SPOTLIGHT:

The Grinberg-Smith Family

It was both a long and a short journey for the Grinberg-Smith family to arrive to Temple Beth David.....Let's meet Susan and David and follow them on their journey.

Susan's story begins far away. She was born in Odessa, Ukraine, which at the time was part of the Soviet Union. When Susan was only two years old, her parents fled the Soviet Union due to religious persecution. As Russian Jews in Ukraine, they were neither recognized as "Russians" nor as Jews." They were not allowed to practice their religion and like many Jews, they were shipped out of Russia. Relatives sponsored the Grinberg family to immigrate to the U.S. and become U.S. citizens. The Grinbergs left the Soviet Union to find a better life for their 2 daughters, and thankfully that is what happened.

When Susan's parents left the Soviet Union in the early 1970s and moved to New York City (Flushing, Queens), they did not have a Jewish identity because they had not been allowed to practice Judaism in Russia. The family had a difficult time finding an identity in America. As immigrants in the United States, they felt uncomfortable and different - they did not identify with "Russians" nor with "Jews" nor with "Americans." Susan felt that she had to hide her Russian and Jewish identity as a child, and her family did not regularly practice their faith because they felt they would not be accepted.

David had a shorter, yet also remarkable journey to Temple. David was born in Lynwood, California. His family came to California from Oklahoma and Texas to escape the "dust bowl." His parents are not Jewish and not religious. David grew up here in Westminister and attended some church but did not have any memorable experiences. He remembers driving by Temple Beth David as a child and wondering what it was.

Susan's struggle to find a Jewish identity continued for most of her young adult life. She finally made her journey from New York to California when her best friend moved here and met David, telling Susan that she thought she had found a match for her. Susan flew out here, met David, and decided to move to California to pursue her love interest. Two years later, in 2008, Susan and David were married.



David works from home in post-production in the film industry, and is a screenwriter as a hobby. Susan is a licensed social worker at College Medical Center in Long Beach. Their first daughter, Sophia, was born in 2009, and their second daughter, Emma, was born in 2011. Based on the recommendation of David's sister, both Sophia and Emma now attend the Temple Beth David pre-school, and they will attend Sunday School as well.

David feels welcome at Temple Beth David, and he plans to become more involved with the Brotherhood. Even though he is not officially Jewish, he is open-minded, appreciates Jewish values, and is happy to be raising his daughters in the Jewish faith.

Susan realizes that she missed so much growing up without her Jewish identity, and now she is grateful to have a place where her family feels welcome and is proud to be Jewish. David and Susan enjoy the many activities Temple Beth David has to offer, including the pre-school, the educational opportunities, the carnivals, Brotherhood and Sisterhood, their Chavurah, and the Family Fun activities. Their Chavurah had a mezuzah hanging ceremony at their house, so now Susan and David can celebrate Jewish holidays and occasions in their Jewish home and in a synagogue that they have made their home.

"Judaism is a journey," says Susan. We are happy that their long and short journeys brought the Grinberg-Smith family to join us here at Temple Beth David. ☆

What is a Chavurah?

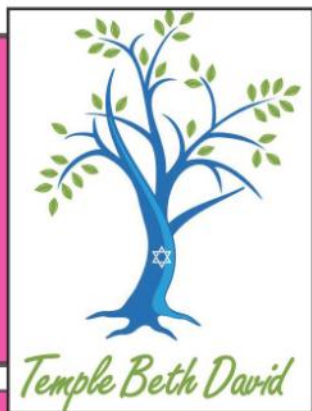
One of the many benefits of Temple membership is to be part of a Chavurah — a group of usually about 8 to 20 people with similar backgrounds or interests.

It is rare when something that you anticipate turns out to exceed your expectations in all respects, but the congregation trip to Israel did. Most of us who went would consider going again if the Rabbi used ARZA World Travel again and we had the same guide. As we anticipated last month we did visit the Western wall. There were no issues while we were there. All of us at the wall were absorbed in our prayers and placing our prayer notes. The area designated for egalitarian prayer is located at the Robinson arch on a wooden deck south of the Kotel, the present prayer area. The deck is built near, but not adjoining the wall or the Kotel. It was generally deserted and seeing it, I now understand why the Women of the Wall and associated groups were at first reluctant to accept it. There is no final determination of who will administer it or whether ultra-Orthodox groups will accept without demonstrations or violence any women singing there or praying with a torah scroll.

The peace process has come to a halt for now as the April 30 deadline has passed, and it appears that beyond both sides stating their positions little progress was made. "Both parties still indicate that they feel it's important to negotiate and want to find a way to negotiate," Secretary of State Kerry said during a trip to Ethiopia. "So we believe the best thing to do right now is pause, take a hard look at these things and find out what is possible and what is not possible in the days ahead."

The Israel Basic Law (the nearest thing Israel has to a constitution) is being developed and debated in the Knesset. While prime minister Netanyahu pushes for clear definition of Israel as a Jewish state, he also assures skeptics that the law will respect the rights of all Israelis, not just Jews. Voices on the left are skeptical that it will

promote super nationalism.

Price Tag issues are receiving attention by Israel's National Police although there has yet to be a significant breakthrough with important arrests. While I listed the desecration of the Reform synagogue in Raanana last month, the brunt of the attacks are in the occupied territories in the West Bank, primarily vandalism to mosques. The National Police Chief assured there would be arrests. In the last two years every region of the National Police has established a unit to fight these crimes. He also declared that there are leaders who need to do some soul searching because they have yet to condemn the attacks.

Professor David Barzali of UC San Diego, the West Coast Regional Director of ARZA, visited Temple Beth David, on April 11 and spoke about pluralism in Israel and ARZA's role in promoting it. To increase our congregation's awareness of the importance of Israel to us as Reform Jews I will be creating an Israel committee. If you are interested in joining, please let me know.

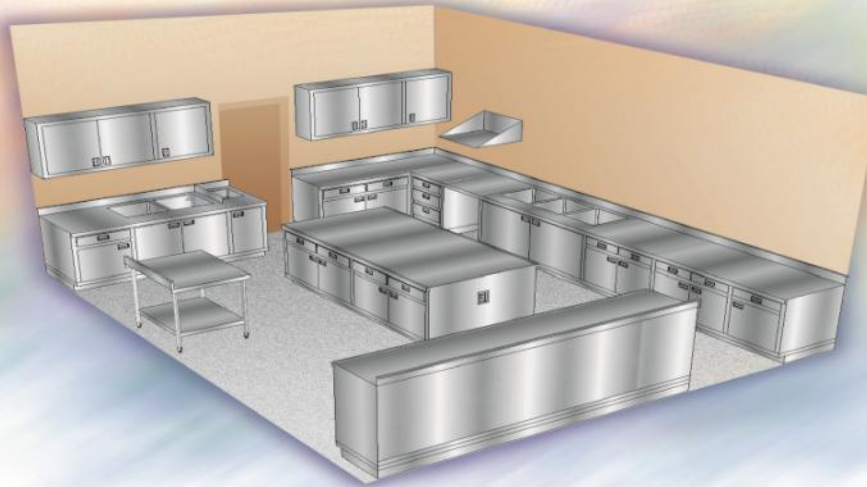

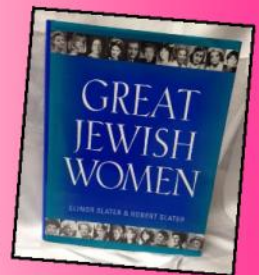
