Camp Newman is affordable and a great Jewish summer experience!

Great Jewish experience! Last summer, I attended the Union for Reform Judaism's Camp Newman as one of the rabbis on staff and came to appreciate what a valuable experience this is for our youth. I was impressed with the Jewish learning and teen bonding that occurs up there. From the first moment a new camper is welcomed into his/her bunk, there is the singing of "Haveinu Shalom Aleichem, we are so glad to see you!" Seeing the smile on a newcomer's face is heartening. Then every day in the morning, there's an outdoor assembly with morning prayers, songs, and some silliness. Meals in the dining hall have motzi and the birkat hamazon. There are services, Judaic programming, and lots of great energy.



Shabbat evening at Camp Newman is special. Everyone wears white as we gather outdoors for a beautiful and spirited service. Dinner is roast chicken, eggplant and tofu, rice, green beans, and brownies. And then after dinner, the fun really begins. Each unit comes dancing out of the dining hall with the CIT's singing in full force. Everyone meets up at the basketball courts and joins in traditional Israeli dancing followed by more current dances to "Golden Boy" and other favorite songs. Seeing over 500 hundred people dance with all their might including staff and faculty to these songs was exciting.

I intend on going back up to Camp Newman once again for hopefully the first two weeks of July. (yes, even during my sabbatical) Go to site for more information http://campnewman.org/ summer-camp It's affordable! Through the generosity of your fellow TBD congregants, it is my hope to provide as close as possible, for every one of our youth who needs it, a scholarship of \$400. This \$400 will be matched by Camp Newman for a total of \$800. In addition, if you sign up early enough you can request funds from the Peachy Levy fund. That ends up with \$400 more in assistance. So right off the bat, you could be looking at \$1200 off your tuition. But there even more help out there. If this is your first time going to Jewish overnight camp and you go for at least 12 consecutive days, you can apply for the One Happy Camper scholarship that will give you \$700. I also understand that through the Bureau for Jewish Life, they offer Passport to Jewish Life that can offer additional assistance. If you would like to take me up on the TBD scholarship, please contact me directly through email or phone and we can talk.





ARZA By Charlie Niederman Association of Reform Zionists of America

Last winter and spring we asked you to vote for the ARZA slate for delegates to the World Zionist Congress. The full US delegation is 145 delegates and based on the election results the ARZA slate was awarded 56 delegates. The 37th Congress was held last week and ARZA made a difference and achieved most of its goals in having progressive resolutions approved that guide the Congress and the state of Israel.

I had the privilege of being a delegate to the 36th Congress and have found the blogs about the latest Congress very similar to what happened 5 years ago. The Congress began with an opening plenary that elected the leadership of the World Zionist Organization and included the opening speeches followed by committee meetings. Rabbi Neal Gold who serves Temple Shir Tikva in Wayland, MA, blogged," Today we began the painstaking (painful?) process of considering more than 170 resolution proposals for the Congress. The delegates were divided into smaller committees, and each committee took up 10-20 of the proposals. Each committee was a proportional microcosm of the larger Congress, so in our room we had representatives from Reform, Conservative, Orthodox Ashkenazi, Orthodox Sefardi, Labor, Likud, Greens, the left-wing Meretz party, the right-wing Zionist Organization of America, youth movements, and more – all in one room, trying to reach consensus on some of the testiest and most controversial issues... And some, from the right-wing organizations, were on occasion subtly bigoted or unapologetically undemocratic. (Best/worst line: As our faction proudly endorsed a statement that promoted 'freedom for all the Jewish movements' in Israel, a rightwing participant proposed to amend that phrase with the words, '...that recognize the existence of a Supreme Being.' It got shot down.

Here's what your vote last year meant: Because of the size of our faction, we won far more often than we lost. We turned back some very closed-minded and even hateful statements. We successfully promoted many proudly expansive and progressive resolutions which will go to the floor of the entire Congress tomorrow, and if passed, will make the Zionist Movement and the State of Israel more tolerant, open, and pluralistic. And my colleagues in the eight other committees reported similar results."

Rabbi John Rosove, Senior Rabbi of Temple Israel of Hollywood, blogged," We of ARZENU (the world Reform Zionist movement) were warned that yelling and delaying tactics would be likely in committee meetings and in the plenary sessions, especially when discussing contentious resolutions. The warnings were prescient. Almost from the beginning of our committee meetings, one Mizrahi (the nationalist rightwing religious delegation) delegate started screaming from the moment the chair, Rabbi Lea Muehlstein of the United Kingdom (an ARZENU delegate), opened the session. The two most contentious resolutions were Establishment of an Egalitarian Prayer Space at the Western Wall and Recognition of Support for the LGBT Community, both introduced by ARZENU. After debate, the (*prayer space*) resolution passed with a substantial majority.

The LGBT resolution was the next especially contentious fight. The right-wing parties in our committee were strongly against this resolution and immediately began to challenge key elements of it. Some began a campaign of yelling and screaming to prevent us from having a reasoned debate ending in a vote. We refused to accept their most important amendment, however, because it gave license to Orthodox schools to choose to accept or to pass on tolerance education. All the while, the disruption did not stop for a moment. Finally, Rabbi Muehlstein ruled that anyone screaming would not have his/her votes counted. At last, a vote was taken; the resolution passed with 35 votes and 35 abstentions. In the end, those in the Mizrahi and Likud factions who negotiated with ARZENU on an amendment on which we found compromise language refused to vote "nay." Indeed, they never intended to vote for a resolution, no matter what it said. They only wanted to delay and water down the original resolution...

At one point, five of the most badly behaving delegates actually charged our table. I happened to be sitting two people away from Rabbi Muehlstein, and although I am not a violent person, I was prepared to jump between them and protect her from their physical assault. She was a paragon of patience and brought dignity to the proceedings and to the ARZENU delegation. I heard that other committee meetings went far more smoothly, with good behavior by all..."

Rabbi Sydney Mintz of Congregation Emanu-

El in San Francisco, CA, wrote: "On this final day of the 37th World Zionist Congress, it is clear that Israel continues to exist, in part, because of the vibrant and difficult tradition of *machloket* or debate, dissent, and disagreement at our center.

This final day proved challenging in many ways, but the *tikvah*, the feeling of hope, was palpable... we managed to vote on almost 2/3 of the 90 resolutions put forth by the disparate delegations of the WZC. The voting came with passion, anger, yelling, finger-pointing, and bureaucratic and technological challenges that threatened to derail us completely, but as one of our delegation aptly reminded us, 'Israel is a total *balagan* [mess], but everything still works.'

At the close of the voting session, it was clear that the majority of our resolutions had passed, including issues of the environment and water supply, the relationship between Israel and Diaspora Jewry, dealing with anti-Semitism, separation of religion and state, hate crimes, LGBT rights, and financial transparency in Is-

rael's national institutions.

The World Zionist Congress allows us to exercise our right and responsibility as Jews to support Israel. Israel can only be a better place, true to our own ideals when we as American Jews offer support that includes criticism, honesty, and a willingness to partner with our Israeli brothers and sisters, even through the darkest and most difficult times. And as always, Israel comforts and confuses me, challenges me to my core, and inspires me to come back for more."

TBD Club 55 & Adult Education Present Judaism & Christianity: A Tortured Journey to Harmony

A Unique 3 Session Class presented by Rabbi Michael Mayersohn



Tuesdays - 10:30am - 12:00pm November 10, December 1 Cost: \$18.00 (made payable to TBD)

During the three sessions, Rabbi Mayersohn will examine the beginnings of Christianity in the 1st century with the emergence of Jesus as a Jewish sage and the historical events that led to the traumatic and convulsive parting of the ways of early Christians and Jews. We will look at the place of Jesus in Jewish life and the theological and historical developments that led to animosity and separation by the end of the century. Rabbi Mayersohn will go on to look at the relations of Jews and Christians in the middle ages, looking honestly and clearly at the times of hurt and bitterness and the periods of cooperation. Finally, the class will study the current situation between Christians and Jews, focusing on the impact of the Catholic church's issuance of Vatican II and subsequent developments that led to Jewish-Christian relations today. Jewish and Christian students will come to realize that our stereotypes of each other and that our view of our history are always accurate constructive.

Rabbi Mayersohn has an extensive background on this subject. He was at Temple Beth David from 1990 until 2003. Since 2003 he has taught classes about the beginnings of Christianity and Bible studies in Orange County, San Diego and Arizona as well as well as in England and Scotland. He is the only rabbi who has taught workshops in the Religious Education Congress of the Los Angeles Archdiocese.


