Many of you are already aware that I'll be going on sabbatical February 1, 2016 - July 30, 2016. Rabbis generally are entitled to a sabbatical after 7 years. Sabbaticals are intended for rabbis "to seek spiritual and physical reinvigoration through a program of study and travel." Many rabbis use their sabbatical to "recharge their batteries" in order to stem burnout. Others have studied in Israel or worked on projects. I have been eligible for a number of years but have waited till this time to take a sabbatical because our congregation has been stable for quite some time with committed lay leaders and staff. I hope during this time to work on a novel on the judge Deborah from the Bible utilizing my knowledge of archeology and history. Truth be told, I don't know if I have any ability in writing but I've always wanted to try.

During my sabbatical, Cantor Nancy Linder will be covering pastoral emergencies and providing organizational leadership of our worship services. We are looking for lay leaders to lead worship with her, deliver a sermon, lead a discussion, or tell a story. Are you interested? I already have some names and will be leading some training workshops to those who will be assisting. I will cover basics such as organizational skills but also messaging and goals of worship. In Judaism, we are taught that we are all a 'holy people'. The Torah and its teachings are not just meant for Jewish professionals but are truly accessible to all our people. Even though I hope to be missed during my time away, I expect our Temple to be okay and for there to even be some pleasant surprises from those who lead our worship. I hope my sabbatical leads to a greater empowerment of our members and community.

Aside from Cantor Linder, we are of course very lucky to also have the support of Larry and Sharon Matalon during this time. In addition, we have wonderful lay leadership and staff who are responsible and care very deeply about our community. Area rabbis will be teaching the confirmation sessions that I'll be missing. During my sabbatical, I will still take care of our Bnei Mitzvah services and confirmation ceremony.

I want to thank you for this opportunity to 'recharge' my rabbinate because it's my intention to be a congregational rabbi for decades to come. So, do you want to 'play' at being rabbi? Let me know.

ARZA By Charlie Niederman Association of Reform Zionists of America

Last month the article covered our Reform Movement's response to the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) negotiated by the representatives of the P5+1 and Iran. It was a rare occasion when all five of the permanent members of the UN Security Council (US, China, France, Russia and the UK) plus Germany agreed to unite in negotiations with the Iranian regime. They achieved an agreement that should delay and possibly prevent Iran from gaining nuclear weapons. The Reform Movement took no position pro or con on the JCPOA but did present its concerns to our own government. The plan will remain controversial, but the purpose of these articles is to keep abreast of what the Union for Reform Judaism does through ARZA, the Association of Reform Zionists of America, to support Reform Judaism in Israel and the events and policies that effect Jews there and worldwide. So, here is an update on the progress of the Israel Movement for Reform and Progressive Judaism (IMPJ) for the last year. The IMPJ Executive Director, Rabbi Gilad Kariv, in his annual New Year greeting pointed out that there are now 45 Reform congregations spread out across the country, from Rosh Pina in the North to the Arava in the south. It achieved a doubling of total communities in less than a decade with three new ones last year. Also, two established congregations, Yedid Nefesh in Carmiel and Birkat Shalom in Kibbutz Gezer have finally secured permanent buildings, following extensive negotiation with municipal and national authorities.

A survey conducted by the Israel's Knesset Channel found that 12% of Israelis define themselves as Reform or Conservative. According to Rabbi Kariv, "... We are experiencing significant growth in activity. Every third Israeli has participated in an event led by a Reform rabbi. Maybe we're not the most significant stream of Judaism in Israel, but we are certainly not a marginal

phenomenon."

Other statements by the IMPJ point out that their policy of working in the education system has resulted in 8 schools and 60 preschools associated with the movement. Rabbi Kariv also wrote, "As tides of hateful incitement continue to rise in Israeli society, the IMPJ stands steadfast by its commitment to promoting a tolerant, shared society in Israel. Over the past six months, we have begun operating two new "Meeting Neighbors" Jewish-Arab dialogue groups and have developed a brand new educational curriculum program for the 9th and 10th grades on the promotion of a shared society through a Jewish lens. Both of these projects are expected to grow and expand over the coming year." Growth of the movement is not without its detractors. In the last few months, as Israel's new government takes hold, ministers from the religious parties have not missed the opportunity to attack Reform Judaism. Minister of Religious Services David Azoulay of the ultra-Orthodox Shas Party, said, "I cannot allow myself to say that [a Reform Jew] is Jewish." His July 7 words caused such an uproar in the United States, that Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu publicly renounced the statement.

The day after Azoulay spoke out, the chairman of the Knesset Finance Committee, Moshe Gafni of ultra-Orthodox Yahadut HaTorah, said that while the Reform Jews are Jews, they "stab the Torah in the back." Perhaps it is not all bad news, since the ultra-Orthodox now feel the Reform movement important enough that they must increase their denunciations.



Judaism & Christianity: A Tortured Journey to Harmony

A Unique 3 Session Class presented by Rabbi Michael Mayersohn



Tuesdays - 10:30am - 12:00pm October 27, November 10, December 1 Cost: \$18.00 (made payable to TBD)

During the three sessions, Rabbi Mayersohn will examine the beginnings of Christianity in the 1st century with the emergence of Jesus as a Jewish sage and the historical events that led to the traumatic and convulsive parting of the ways of early Christians and Jews. We will look at the place of Jesus in Jewish life and the theological and historical developments that led to animosity and separation by the end of the century. Rabbi Mayersohn will go on to look at the relations of Jews and Christians in the middle ages, looking honestly and clearly at the times of hurt and bitterness and the periods of cooperation. Finally, the class will study the current situation between Christians and Jews, focusing on the impact of the Catholic church's issuance of Vatican II and subsequent developments that led to Jewish-Christian relations today. Jewish and Christian students will come to realize that our stereotypes of each other and that our view of our history are always accurate constructive.

Rabbi Mayersohn has an extensive background on this subject. He was at Temple Beth David from 1990 until 2003. Since 2003 he has taught classes about the beginnings of Christianity and Bible studies in Orange County, San Diego and Arizona as well as well as in England and Scotland. He is the only rabbi who has taught workshops in the Religious Education Congress of the Los Angeles Archdiocese.




