Jill has just started at Temple Beth David as our new Jewish school director. She comes in with a fresh perspective and many wonderful ideas on how to reinvigorate our school. She initially suggested instead of calling our sessions on Sunday, “Religious school” and on Tuesday, “Hebrew school” to call it all by the same name, “Jewish school.” Personally, I like the Jew pride feeling I get when I say the name of our wonderful school.

Already, Jill has reviewed our curriculum and has proposed innovative changes and additions to more readily engage our students whether they are starting out in Kindergarten or ready to be engaged in ninth grade. We are bringing in new resources for our committed teachers, new books and interactive learning for our students, and, in essence, reinvigorating our school experience.

Our new director is a second generation Californian who grew up in the San Francisco Bay area. She spent a decade on the east coast in Boston and lived in Israel for three years. You will enjoy meeting Jill and marvel at her knowledge about Jewish education. We are looking forward to a good year of learning at our Jewish school at Temple Beth David.

ARZA By Charlie Niederman

Along the Gaza border there was a demonstration today including an incendiary balloon incident and a hand grenade attack against IDF forces. The Times of Israel reported that 5,000 demonstrated and 180 were injured. The clash came amid reports that Israel is involved in indirect talks with Hamas, via UN and Egyptian mediation for a long term truce.

As for the peace proposal reportedly in preparation by the US administration, there has been a leak that the proposal will reject the Palestinian position to allow their refugees to return to Israel. As I write this it is reported that US has announced that it is cutting all funding to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees (UNRWA). Currently the US provides 30% of the budget. It has been reported that Germany may provide the funding. While refugees right of return to Israel was destined to be a non-starter, removing it from the negotiations leaves the Palestinians one less negotiating point. It will be one more reason for them not to participate. But that pales in comparison to the withdrawal of UNRWA funding. From the PLO vantage point the US can no longer be a neutral party and may have lost most of its clout if the Germans do cover the US funding withdrawal. I won't go into the reasons the PLO refugee position is probably flawed, but that makes little difference in what is now the reduced chance to bring Palestinians and Israelis to the negotiating table. Peace seems even further off.

The Nation State Law passed by the Knesset in July remains a serious concern, as its effect is felt. By far the objection that has drawn the most attention in Israel and worldwide is that of the Israeli Druze. They held a demonstration on August 4th in Tel Aviv's Rabin Square that drew 50,000. Because the rights of Jews in Israel are given priority, it means that the Druze citizens, who voluntarily serve in the Israel Defense Force, are now denied equal rights. At this time the ruling coalition is in no mood to concede any changes to the law. "Despite our unlimited loyalty to the state, the state does not consider us equals," was included in a statement by Sheik Maufak, the Druze religious leader in Israel. Senior IDF leaders have

spoken in support of their Druze comrades in arms. Druze officers have risen to senior IDF positions and their loyalty is unquestioned. It is interesting that during the Temple's recent Israel trip we met and had lunch with a Druze guide who actively supported Israel.

The following Sunday Israeli Arabs demonstrated, drawing 30,000 participants who decried the Nation State Law. The Arab Israelis disappointment and frustration became very obvious. While asked by the organizers not to bring flags, there were PLO flags at the event. It may have shown their frustration, but it met strong objections from some Israelis, and did not help their cause with other Israelis.

To highlight a long standing issue, Rabbi Josh Weinberg, Executive Director of The Association of Reform Zionists of America, ARZA, in his weekly email pointed out the disproportionate power of the small far right religious parties in the governing coalition. There was a decision by Transportation Minister Yisrael Katz to cease construction on a badly needed pedestrian bridge over the large central artery of Tel Aviv, the Ayalon highway. The ultra-Orthodox protested this as a violation of a governing coalition agreement to refrain from work on Shabbat, compelling Katz to halt work on the bridge, yet after the decision they claimed that [they would not have left the coalition](#) over Shabbat construction. The problem of the Tel Aviv bridge is merely the latest story highlighting a fundamental issue that prevails seven decades after the founding of the State. What is the place of Jewish public ritual observance in the Jewish state, and should a tiny minority be allowed to make the decision?

Except for the ARZA comments most of the material was taken from The Times of Israel.

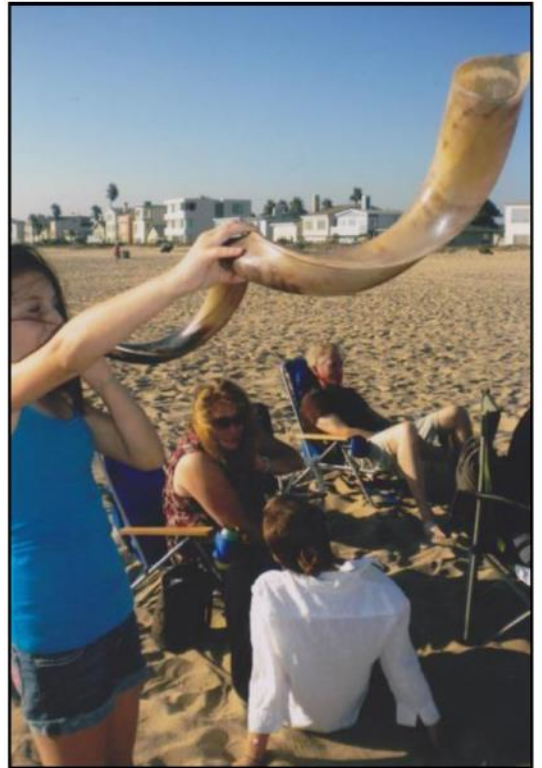

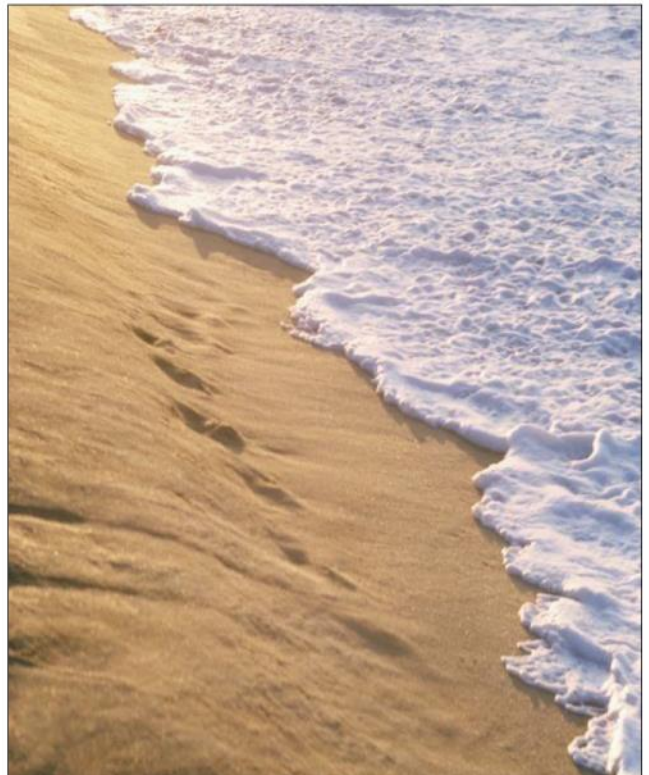

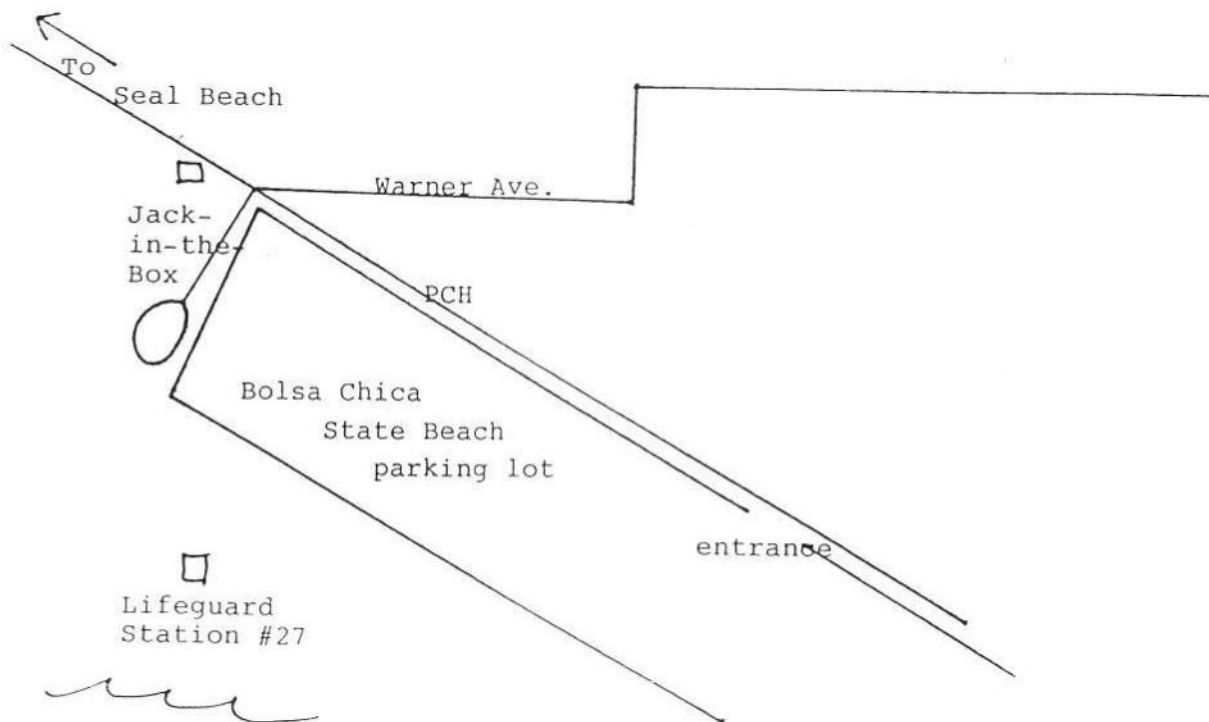
Bolsa Chica State Beach

Multiply that by our 300 families and we will raise more than \$100,000 per year for the Temple! This program really works. Goodshop has raised more than \$11 million for charitable organizations with this program.

Likewise, we are also rolling out Goodsearch. By doing your internet searches through Goodsearch.com, which links with Yahoo, the Temple will receive a penny for every internet search. If you can imagine how many internet searches you do, and your families do, this will also add up to real money for the Temple.

We encourage all of you to participate and to help strengthen our Temple for all of us and for the generations to come.
