Only in recent months did I hear the phrase, FOMO, i.e., fear of missing out. I was relating at Camp Newman that I missed the field trip of my eighth and ninth graders to a high ropes course. It was the first day and I was acclimating to my

new responsibilities. I was bummed to miss out on this activity. One faculty member told me that it was FOMO. In general, I find that I don't like to miss out on anything fun, novel, or unique.

On the other hand, I recognize, sometimes doing too much can be overwhelming. Our lives are too fast paced. There are too many things to do. We are over programmed and running frantically from place to place. Even when we sit still, our electronic leashes via our devices pull us back in. Sometimes, perhaps we need to joyfully sit one out, unplug, and recharge our own spiritual batteries. Just recently I heard of the phrase, JOMO, the joy of missing out. Quite a concept isn't it? Some months there is a chance to spend some time looking into Israeli institutions, and election procedures. This month is not one of them. The military situation is still an issue as Hamas in Gaza continues to provoke border incidents, including sniper fire, and to inflict damage in the local area. In the north as the Syrian Civil War fighting nears Israel and the Golan Heights more provocative incidents occur. Two rockets land in the Sea of Galilee, as did mortar shells. The Russians were quick to claim that the rockets were fired by the Islamic State and thanked Israel for not responding. The situation on the border is still tense

On a humanitarian note, Israel sent busses into Syria to rescue the White Helmets. They are local volunteers who rescue and transport civilians caught in the fighting, often in the rubble of their own homes. Western Nations called for the rescue, because the white helmets who remain in locations taken by the government and Russian forces are brutally treated as terrorists. Three hundred including families who could make it to the rescue point were safely transported.

If this were the only news we could think that life for all in Israel continues as it has for all its citizens. Would that this were the case, but last week the current coalition government, at the insistence of its far right, and ultra-religious minority parties passed landmark legislation called the Nation-State Law. It takes Israel farther from the pluralistic democracy that so many of us in the Diaspora hope the Jewish homeland will become, as it fulfills the promise of its Declaration of Independence to be a pluralistic, democratic nation for all its population. The Executive Director of the Association of Reform Zionists in America (ARZA) Rabbi Josh Weinberg wrote. "Looking at recent events in Israel. I do indeed feel heart-broken. The passage of the Nation-State Bill significantly undermines the strength of Israel's democracy, changing the nature of the country I love."

As so many declarations that weaken democracy do, the bill appeals to patriotism by statements such as: Hattikva is the national anthem; the flag and the menorah are the national symbols. These statements serve to make anyone that opposes the main purpose of the bill appear to be unpatriotic. The nation-state law also includes clauses stating that a "united Jerusalem" is the capital of Israel and that Hebrew is the country's official language, downgrading Arabic to a special status. Another section says that "the state sees the development of Jewish settlement as a national value

and will act to encourage and promote its establishment and consolidation." A further controversial clause stipulates that the state will invest resources in preserving Israel's affiliation to world Jewry, but not in Israel. This wording was demanded by the ultra-Orthodox parties to prevent the state from linking up with the Reform and Conservative communities in Israel.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. Celebrating the passage of the bill stated "This is a defining moment — long live the State of Israel." Netanyahu further said that "122 years after Herzl made his vision known, with this law we determined the founding principle of our existence. Israel is the nation state of the Jewish people, and respects the rights of all of its citizens." The prime minister also said that "in the Middle East, only Israel respects [rights]. This is our country, the Jewish state. In recent years there have been those who have tried to undermine that and question the principles of our existence. Today we made it into law: This is the country, the language, the anthem and flag." He made no mention of democracy.

Opposition head Isaac Herzog also spoke up at the plenum, saying that "it's a little sad to me that the last speech I make will be against this kind of backdrop. The question is whether the law will harm or benefit Israel. History will determine. I really hope that we won't find the fine balance between a Jewish and democratic state to be hurt."

The Arab Knesset members were not so circumspect and protested the passage of the law, and lawmaker Ayman Odeh, chairman of the Arab Joint List, released a statement saying that Israel "declared it does not want us here" and that it had "passed a law of Jewish supremacy and told us that we will always be second-class citizens." Another Arab MK confronted Netanyahu with, "Why do you fear the Arabic language?"

Much of the information about the Nation-State Law was taken from the Times of Israel. I know that the law evokes strong emotions on both sides and I welcome comments from anyone who does not agree with the opinion of the minority in the Knesset, and the opinion of those in the Diaspora who hope Israel will become a democratic and pluralistic Jewish homeland that can serve as a model for other democracies.







Tashlich at the Beach



Bolsa Chica State Beach (see map on reverse side)


