There is no doubt that of all our festivals, Purim is the most joyous. What other holiday can kids, as well as adults, dress up in costume, act irreverently, laugh, get a little wild, and for adults to have the Mitzvah of drinking alcohol? I'm not joking; it is literally a Mitzvah, a commandment, to drink on Purim so much that one doesn't know the difference between "Blessed Mordecai" or "Cursed be Haman." In all fairness, though, the rabbis did try to moderate the drinking part and lessen the amount one must or should drink on this jubilant holiday.

The essence of Purim is to be joyful, silly, and celebrate our people's survival from those who wished to destroy us. On this day we read the story of Esther, eat Hamentaschen, give *Shlach Manot*, "portions of food" to friends, charity to the poor, drink and be merry. The rabbis stated: *Mi shenikhas adar marbim be-simcha*, "with the start of the month of Adar we greatly increase joy." Well the Hebrew month of Adar is upon us and so is Purim. At Beth David, we take celebrating very seriously!

First, the US Administration's peace proposal will be revealed after the Israeli election on April 9th. Jared Kushner has been touring Arab nations revealing concepts in the plan. The much touted plan will focus on economic issues and apparently move away from the past land-forpeace approach. Kushner appeared to have ignored Arab leaders' demands that a peace initiative must address settlements, the rights of Palestinian refugees, and Jerusalem. It is said the plan will include tens of billions of dollars for Israel's immediate neighbors. While some of the funds will come from the US, the richer Arab states are expected to provide the larger portion.

This has been a very busy month in Israel. The electioneering for the April 9 nationwide election is well underway with the more than usual bickering and name calling, coalition building and combining political parties into a single party to try for a plurality of the votes.

Here are some of the basics for understanding how Israel's election system works. The election is nationwide and the 120 Knesset seats are allocated to political parties by the percentage of the total vote that each receives. The threshold for a party to receive a single seat is 3.25%. The parties prepare a list of candidates in the order that they will be appointed after the election. The president of Israel, whose post is largely ceremonial, has one very important political function. It's his job to select one of the elected candidates to form a new government that can command at least the needed 61 seat majority of the 120 Knesset seats. If that candidate succeeds, he or she becomes prime minister. It is notable that in Israel's history no party has received enough votes to earn an outright majority, thus every administration has consisted of a coalition.

A game changer in the current race is the formation of Blue and White party which will consist of the main centrist party led by Benny Gantz, ex-chief of staff of the IDF. who is seen

to be less hawkish and right-wing than the incumbent Netanyahu, and Yair Lapid, a former journalist turned head of Yesh Atid party which seeks changes to the dominance of religion in the public and private lives of Israelis. This is a strong challenge to Netanyahu and his Likud Party.

While the new party claims to be centrist it is not a peace party and is short on women in its candidate list, 2 in the top 10 positions. The coalition also includes 3 of the current coalition drop outs in top positions on its list.

As if this were not enough, Attorney General Avichai Mandelblit this week announced that he intends to press charges against Netanyahu in three separate cases; three times for fraud and breach of trust, and once for bribery. This is the beginning of what promises to be a long, drawn out process that is likely to dominate the headlines for years. Netanyahu has vowed not to step down and is widely expected to try to further drag the legal process out for as long as possible.

The attorney general's decision to press charges, pending a hearing, in the criminal investigations against Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu could also be a game-changer on April 9. A new Times of Israel poll published Thursday shows that the ruling Likud party would lose both a significant chunk of support, as well as its ability to form a coalition after the election.


