Vote Reform in the World Zionist Elections

Even from America's shores, we can impact Israel by voting for the 38th congress in the World Zionist election. The World Zionist Congress (WZC) is the governing body of the World Zionist Organization (WZO), Jewish National Fund (JNF), and the Jewish Agency for Israel. The First Zionist Congress, convened by Theodor Herzl in 1897, began the Zionist movement stating that the Jewish people should have a state of their own. The WZC meets every five years to discuss policy and funding for Jewish institutions in Israel and across the world.

With more slates than ever before representing the diversity of thought, opinion and cultural identity of the American Jewish community, we have a rare opportunity to make a direct impact on the future direction of Israel and diaspora affairs. Decisions will be made regarding the priorities of the key National Institutions of Israel – World Zionist Organization (WZO), Jewish National Fund (JNF) and the Jewish Agency for Israel (JNF) – and the allocation of nearly \$1 billion in funding in support of Israel and world Jewry.

This is an opportunity to connect with the land of Israel, support Reform Judaism, and strengthen the Jewish state. By voting Reform, you are investing in an Israel that is both Jewish and democratic and is a free society that upholds equality of religion, gender, race, and ethnicity. Our Reform vote will advocate for government recognition of the many diverse expressions of Jewish religious identity and support of a democratic civil society in Israel. It will work so that liberal streams of Judaism are provided equal financial support and resources in the Jewish State. And will advocate for a long-term peace between Israelis and Palestinians.

Be 18 years of age or above (as of June 30, 2020)

Be a permanent resident of the United States

Be Jewish

Have not voted and will not vote in the March 2, 2020 Knesset election

Affirm your commitment to the <u>Jerusalem Program</u> (asserts the unity of the Jewish people and bond to Israel, immigration and integration of immigrants in Israel, strengthening Israel's morality and spirituality, Jewish education, responsibility, and rights of individuals)

Registration and voting will open on January 21, 2020. To register, visit azm.org/elections after that date. The fee to register and vote is \$7.50, which covers the administrative costs of running the election (anyone age 25 and under pay \$5.00). For more information: <u>https://azm.org/elections</u>

For this issue I'll cover some Israeli politics, the current status of Israel's government and that of the Israel Movement for Reform and Progressive Judaism (IMPJ) and conclude with a way that we can get involved to promote Reform Judaism and democracy in Israel, North America, and worldwide.

Once again nobody could form a government based on the September election results. So, Israel will be holding its third election to form a new government in March. As an Israeli Rabbi put it. "Welcome to the Israeli political reality. Where now we go to elections one time, then another, and an unresolved political deadlock may take us to hope that the third time's the charm. The political impasse that we have been facing for most of 2019, and are likely to face well into 2020 is both debilitating and exasperating. A third election in the span of 10 or 11 months, I fear, would see not only similar electoral results but could cause many citizens to lose faith and potentially just sit this one out. Worse than that, the country simply cannot afford it. A Knesset finance official interviewed on Israeli public radio this week, plainly explained that it's not an issue of wasting taxpayer shekels – which is bad enough – it's that the electoral coffers simply do not have the funds to cover the expense of another election... This impasse has resulted in over 300 days during which Israel has been led by a series of caretaker governments... countless projects have been frozen and public sector workers remain in a kind of indefinite hiatus, never quite sure who will remain at the titular helm of their department — or from which party, or for how long. Full ministries are going bankrupt and diplomatic missions around the world can't afford to function or send their emissaries to do their jobs. Leadership disputes are not new to us and can have long-lasting consequences. We have a long tradition of leaders not being able to vacate their thrones, which could give us insight as to how to overcome today's political pickle."

In a rare challenge to his leadership of the Likud Party, Prime Minister Netanyahu won the party primary with more than 70% of the vote. He announced his hard right agenda, declaring "We will set our final borders, bring about American recognition for Israeli control over Jordan Valley, the Dead Sea and our sovereignty over every settlement in Judea and Samaria (and)...obtain a defense pact with U.S. that will ensure Israeli freedom to act, we will defeat Iran and achieve a peace pact with Arab

countries." He did this while his three indictments on charges of bribery and fraud proceed toward a trial.

On a far more upbeat note the IMPJ in a Chanukah message from its Executive Director, Rabbi Gilad Kariv, announced "... we can feel a deep sense of pride in the way we are bringing "light" to Israel and the Jewish people-through the work in our congregations- where we have more than doubled our presence over the last decade from 23 to 52- through our growing youth and young adult movementsthrough our work in interfaith relations and shared society, through our efforts in making our congregations accessible to all..."

In the first decade of the Twenty First Century the IMPJ was struggling to reach 20 congregations. Now, not only has it impressively grown its religious facilities, but it has become an important force for the realization of the of the goals of social justice and religious pluralism espoused in Israel's Declaration of Independence with the work of its Israel Religious Action Center (IRAC).

We now all have a chance to have a voice in supporting Reform Judaism in Israel and worldwide well into the 2020's. In January voting will begin for the American delegation to the upcoming World Zionist Congress. The Congress is the only body in which all of World Jewry is represented democratically. It determines policy, designates its course of action, chooses the leadership of the World Zionist Organization, as well as the Jewish National Fund (JNF). These decisions influence hundreds of millions of dollars in funding. Importantly, the Congress makes decisions that affect the status of Reform Jews in Israel and across the world. It allocates considerable funding to Progressive Jews in Israel. Voting takes place online from January 21, to March 11, 2020 and it will take less than 90 seconds to participate. 
