FROM THE RABBI

What makes this night different?



A highlight of the Passover Sedar is when the youngest child present, sings, "Ma Nishtana ha layla hazeh..." "Why is this night different from all other night?"

It's heart-warming to see the next generation actively participating in one of our most beloved holidays. When I was young, my mother and grandmother taught me to do the first line in Yiddish. And so, I started, "Tati, Ikh Vil Dir Fregn Di Fir Kashes." My father just looked at me in amusement. Today, my kids, and they aren't even children anymore, still regale us with their full throated rendition of this Passover classic.

Back almost two thousand years ago, the Mishneh tells us that **an adult** asks this question. According to this third century Jewish work, if the son doesn't know what to ask, the father will say, "Ma Nishtana..." and teaches him that this night is different because we eat unleavened bread, i.e., matza, and bitter herbs. This night we eat roasted meat and dip our vegetables twice. And then according to the knowledge of the child, the father teaches him how we came out of slavery. And so, the first mention of the four questions features the father instructing his son on our history.

The rituals of the Passover sedar are meant to be engaging, interactive, as we bring our past to life and celebrate Judaism. However, we aren't limited to just "four" questions. Sitting around the table with the parsley, matza, roasted egg, haroset, and salty water, we are inspired to ask and discuss many things. Many of us have our own creative ways to celebrate Passover. Some of us use new Haggadahs, integrate novel songs, and even props.

As I'm pondering the sedar, I would like to ask, what four questions do you think would be pertinent for us as Jews today around the sedar? Can you come up with your own? What about the following?

- 1. Why do we still observe Passover especially since it happened thousands of years ago?
- 2. If you were to add a food item to the Passover sedar plate. What would it be and why?
- 3. What are the blessings and challenges of being a Jew in America today?
- 4. What are our values and traditions that we believe are worthy of passing down to the next generation?

I especially like to invite people around the table to share their own immigrant/exodus story. It's fascinating to hear why one's ancestors left Poland, Germany, or South America to come to the U.S. I find it helps to appreciate the journey of our relatives and to feel thankful for their sacrifices.

We have many wonderful ways to celebrate and learn about Passover. I invite you to consider coming to any or all of the following:

a. **Tot Shabbat Passover:** Saturday, March 25 at 10:30 a.m. this is for our little ones to have a holiday experience followed by a wonderful oneg. b. **2nd night Congregational sedar** - Thursday, April 6 at 6:00 p.m. Food is good, service is engaging and musical. All are welcome. If you want to help plan it, let me know.

In the meantime, wishing you and your family a Chag Sameach!

BOARD UPDATE



In October 2021, my usual route to Beth David was closed when the Springdale bridge over the 405 was shut down and eventually dismantled as part of the State's and the County's I-405 Improvement Project. That bridge is one of 22 bridges that are being strengthened and expanded, and when it is finished it will also include pedestrian walkways and bike lanes. For over a year I have driven on the 405 through Westminster and Garden Grove, looking up wistfully at the empty skies where the bridge

once stood. The Springdale bridge had generally given me my most efficient route to Beth David, and I can't tell you how many times since it was dismantled that I have felt a tinge of anxiety on the way to a service or a meeting, remembering I have to go a longer way, and cannot take my old route. And then, just a few weeks ago, I looked up to see this:



It was almost as if overnight my bridge was being rebuilt. And while it will be nice to have the bridge back, this whole experience got me thinking that since the pandemic started, we have all been finding "ways around" in order to stay connected to Beth David and to our Judaism. As part of my own journey, I have been making the drive to attend some recent Friday night services — which have been so deeply meaningful as we've put our arms around each other to sing our closing prayers. And I count myself one of the lucky ones who attended the Comedy Extravaganza in January, enjoying an evening full of laughter with friends and family, and also recognizing Rabbi Myers in reaching her 20th year with Beth David.

I am so grateful that we are able to hold services and other activities in-person again, and I encourage each of you, at a pace that feels right to you, to come back and share in the warmth and kinship that are hallmarks of our Beth David community.

As the winter winds down and spring approaches, the Brotherhood is planning a multitude of activities for you to enjoy. We certainly have been busy the past few months, with an enjoyable and well attended Chanukah Carnival in December. The Brotherhood provided food and entertainment,

An interactive program," and a Foundation brunch on January 29, that was attended by approximately 100 people. Dear Beth David Members:

Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial Day) for Hebrew Year 5783 begins at sundown on Monday, April 17, 2023, and ends at nightfall on Tuesday, April 18, 2023. We hope that you will once again join with other members of Beth David and your family on the evening of Monday, April 17, 2022, and light this candle at your home in memory of the victims of the Holocaust. The act of kindling this flame, and reading the enclosed poem and blessing, can be a moving ritual to remind us of what happened to our people not so long ago. This moment might also be an appropriate opportunity to discuss the Holocaust with your children. We are having our Holocaust commemoration service on Tuesday night, April 18, starting at 6:30 p.m. Stella Ungar, a Holocaust survivor, will share her experiences growing up in Germany under the Nazis.

This will be the 25th year that our congregation has participated in this joint project of the Men of Reform Judaism (MRJ) and the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs. We hope that the observance of Yom HaShoah, centered on the lighting of a Yellow Candle, will become an annual event in your home and an important day on your Jewish calendar.

The Brotherhood will be taking the following steps to make it easier for you to receive your Yom HaShoah candle. Beginning in March 2023, we plan to distribute the candles to parents at the Religious School and Preschool, through Chavurah groups, at inperson Board meetings, at the March 5 Purim Carnival, and at the Brotherhood's brunch on March 19. The candles will also be available for pickup at onegs following most Shabbat services, and at the Temple office. If you have a special need and are unable to pick up your candle, please email the Brotherhood at bethdavidbrotherhood@gmail.com, or call Lee Netzer at (714) 317-7413, to make arrangements to have your candle delivered.

As in the past, we hope that you will help underwrite the cost of this project. Funds received over and above the cost will sustain our programs, our support for our Temple and the observance of Yom HaShoah. Page four of this document contains a donation form for your use in contributing. We ask that you consider gifts in multiples of 18, since chai symbolizes life. By remembering and doing your part to ensure our future, we celebrate the ongoing life of our people, even as we memorialize those who perished.

At no time in the 75 - year history of the nation of Israel has there been such a threat to its principles of democracy and its Declaration of Independence that proclaims those principles. In this crucial moment our Rabbi and most of her colleagues in the Central Conference of

America Rabbis (CCAR) are meeting in Israel. They are not only witnesses to the nightly demonstrations, but have become part of the news as some were attacked at the Kotel (Western Wall) for having women carry the Torah. Rabbi Myers should have a lot more to say about this when she returns.

The voting taking place now in the newly formed Knesset is changing the nation's judicial system. As the government was originally formed, the Supreme Court had the power of judicial review and could declare a law invalid. It is equivalent to the US Supreme Court declaring a law unconstitutional, but Israel has no constitution. Israel also had an independent judiciary and law enforcement, so that crimes committed by anyone could be tried in accordance with the law without any political influence. It is now doing so in the ongoing corruption trial of Prime Minister Netanyahu. All this will be changed so that the Knesset, even if it had only a 61 to 59 majority could override the court, control the selection of judges, and control the Attorney General, and law enforcement agencies. There would be no check to balance its political power. Thus, the majority, no matter how small or unrepresentative, in the Knesset could eliminate any rights of the minority, abolishing that basic tenet of democracy.

The reaction in Israel by Prime Minister Netanyahu on Twitter was "A great night and a great day." While opposition leader Yair Lapid says, "Coalition members — history will judge you for tonight. For the damage to democracy, for the damage to the economy, for the damage to security, for you tearing apart the nation of Israel and that you just don't care."

I have been on two conference calls from Israel this week that went into the details of the legal changes and the large nightly demonstrations nationwide. My point is not to burden you with the details, but to let you know about the changes that the new government with its ultra nationalist and ultra Orthodox parties is making that are having far reaching consequences for the Jews of Israel and us in the diaspora.

It has united Jewish organizations worldwide that rarely agree and they are denouncing the laws and calling for a halt to the assault on democracy. In North America most organizations, except the most ultra Orthodox have expressed their deep concern. After Shabbat the leader of our Union for Reform Judaism, Rabbi Rick Jacobs, is planning to deliver a speech about these concerns.

One more area of concern is a law being proposed that would make the Kotel an entirely Orthodox complex removing the women's section and the egalitarian section where families can pray together and conduct B'nei Mitzvahs. Prime Minister Netanyahu has had it put on hold for the time being.

SO, WHAT CAN WE DO? Before the Rabbi left, I raised the idea of forming a committee to follow and respond to what is happening in Israel and how we can make some difference. Certainly, we want to support organizations like the Israel Movement for Reform and Progressive Judaism (IMPJ) and possibly look at adopting a sister congregation in Israel. After the Rabbi returns and catches her breath, we will call together everyone who wants to be involved.
