FROM THE RABBI

Feeling moments of awe and inspiration

It is so easy to be overwhelmed by the countless tasks that confronts us every day. In the face of too many things to do and too little time, it can feel like an insurmountable challenge to stop, sense, breathe and live if only for a moment. How to create space or an opportunity to appreciate the world around us, the gift of life and its sacredness is one of the gifts that Abraham Joshua Heschel, a great Jewish theologian of the 20th century, gives us in his work, "God in search for man. "

He writes: *"Ultimate meaning and ultimate wisdom are not found within the world but in God, and the only way to wisdom is, as said above, through our relationship to God. That relationship is awe. Awe, in this sense, is more than an emotion; it is a way of understanding. Awe is itself an act of insight into a meaning greater than ourselves... The beginning of awe is wonder, and the beginning of wisdom is awe."*

Who has not had a moment of awe before a towering mountain, the swells of the ocean, the smile of a grandchild, or the love of another? These are times when thought ceases and we intuit that there is more than the schedule of our days, the chores of our home, and the work of the office. Awe, for Heschel, is the gateway to the divine and the beginning of wisdom. With awe and wisdom our sacred teachings come to life and teach us that there is meaning to our days and that there is something greater than ourselves.

Heschel continues: *"The meaning of awe is to realize that life takes place under wide horizons, horizons that range beyond the span of an individual life or even the life of a nation, a generation, or an era. Awe enables us to perceive in the world intimations of the divine, to sense in small things the beginning of infinite significance, to sense the ultimate in the common and the simple; to feel in the rush of the passing the stillness of the eternal."*

Heschel's words "to feel the rush of the passing the stillness of the eternal" is poetic and alluring. Even though time goes by seemingly hurriedly, there is an oasis to be experienced anywhere and at any instance. This sacred respite gives us a glimpse of eternity and even allows us to sense the holiness even in ordinary moments. Heschel's words appear to invite us to open our minds, to sense the breath of our *neshamot* (our souls), and to understand we are part of the glory of creation with sparks of God everywhere to be discovered. If the years go by too fast, perhaps there are still seconds if not minutes, that we can unlock doors rusted with too many burdens and fears. We can push them open if only to glimpse at the stillness and beauty of life and of God. With receptiveness to the possibilities beyond our senses, we begin to experience awe and with awe comes wisdom and with wisdom comes God.

And so let us pray for many awe inspiring moments, for wisdom, for meaning and holiness during these summer months and beyond.

BOARD UPDATE



Temple Beth David Members & Friends,

On behalf of the Temple Beth David Board of Trustees, it is my great pleasure to introduce you to our exciting new sanctuary renovation project. Our Sanctuary was designed over 40 years ago, and the passion, dedication and inspiration of those who led that project has served us well. It is now time for a major reimagining and redesign to ensure that our sanctuary remains relevant and inspiring for years to come. This will enable us to grow and serve our community well into the future.

The Board has secured the services of a highly respected architectural firm, Berliner Architects, to help us design and develop our future sanctuary. This will modernize our current facility and install changes to help us better serve our congregational needs. The firm is well-known for its successes in designing and remodeling houses of worship, having done remodels of Temple Beth Shalom in Santa Ana, Adat Shalom in West LA, and University Synagogue in Brentwood. To spearhead this project, Temple Beth David has secured the commitment of the largest single donation in our temple's history: \$500,000 graciously provided by the Ruby family. Additionally, even at this early stage, we have a 100% commitment from our Board of Trustee members to financially support the project, as well as full support from the Temple Beth David Foundation, Women of Beth David, the Jack Broscow Brotherhood, and our Choir organization.



The renovation will include a redesign of the choir facilities, installation of an ADA-approved ramp, interior design modernization, bimah modifications, and beautification of the entire sanctuary. Reconfiguring the bimah enables us to bring the choir closer to the congregation, improving sight lines and acoustics. It is estimated that the entire project will cost approximately \$1.0-\$1.2 million, including contingencies.

Our goal to complete the endeavor is to raise an additional \$500,000-\$700,000 from our donors and friends to augment our first \$500,000 gift. The construction will likely take place from February to August 2024. We hope to obtain donations and pledges over a two-year period, partially in 2023 and another portion in 2024. Some members may find it easier to spread out their commitment in this way.

Beth David cannot survive on our members' dues alone. We rely on the philanthropy of our membership to meet our future needs. This fundraising challenge can only achieve our goals with the help of all of us. We are grateful to our members who have supported needs like this in the past; it has been quite a while since our last capital campaign. Your participation in this campaign will enable Beth David to better provide community services and host special events for many years to come.

It is hoped that you will join us in strengthening our community through this initiative. For those in a position to help, we have established categories of support: \$250,000 and

up, \$100,000, \$50,000, \$25,000, \$10,000, \$5,000, \$1,000, and any lesser donation. Again, should you choose, your donation can be payable over two years.



We hope that we can count on your support. Your charitable dollars will be used to provide the greatest impact possible for our sanctuary – the physical home for our vibrant community. Please plan on attending one of several upcoming information sessions to learn about and better understand the project and its goals for our community. While a committee has been working diligently on the design and planning, everyone's input is welcome.

If you have any questions, please attend one of our upcoming information sessions once we finalize the dates, or feel free to contact any member of the Capital Committee: Alan Jarrick, Aaron Kern, Richard Ruby, Rabbi Myers and me.

Please join us as we create a beautiful future for Temple Beth David. The ever-present strength of our community is our beacon and our greatest support as we pursue this mission now and for future generations, l'dor v'dor.

On March 19, Bryan Palbaum, President and COO of Trader Joe's, gave a presentation on the history of the popular retail grocery chain; on April 16, Sharon Kohn described how her father-in-law transformed a unique Jewish post World War II Displaced Persons Camp in Deggendorf, Germany, from a near prison condition to a model self-governing camp; and on May 14, we honored mothers by holding our annual Mother's Day Brunch, free for Temple mothers, where mimosas were served, the Junior Choir performed, and every mother received a rose. Many thanks to Brotherhood and other volunteers, to my wife, Elaine, for baking desserts, and to Katella Deli for donating bagels and cream cheese for the brunches.

On May 21, the Brotherhood held its annual last day of school barbecue for Jewish School students, their teachers, and their families. My appreciation goes to the Brotherhood volunteers who helped with the barbecue. In recognizing the important function the teachers serve in providing a Jewish education to our congregation's children, the Brotherhood will give them free admission to all future Brotherhood events.

On June 11, we will be supporting the Young Professionals by sponsoring dessert at its Summer Kickoff Barbecue. The Brotherhood views the Young Professionals as the future of our congregation, and is intent on fostering a relationship with them and supporting them in every way we can. Charlie Niederman and I will be speaking to the group about the Brotherhood, and to ascertain their interests, with the goal of planning activities that they would want to attend.

Plans are underway for our Annual Membership Barbecue. At press time, a date for the barbecue had not yet been set, but it is generally held on the third or fourth Sunday in August, so please stay tuned for more information.

Please join us for an evening of baseball at Dodgers Stadium on Wednesday, September 13, when the Dodgers take on their main rivals, the San Diego Padres. 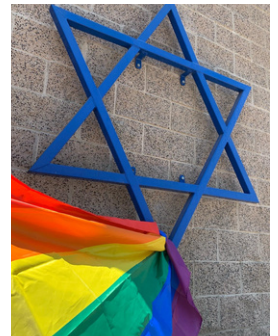

We can refresh our connections with the fresh air of lovingkindness, use our breath to say words, look at things with a different attitude of discovery, express care in caring for the person in their situation, and grow our sense of self-love.
