

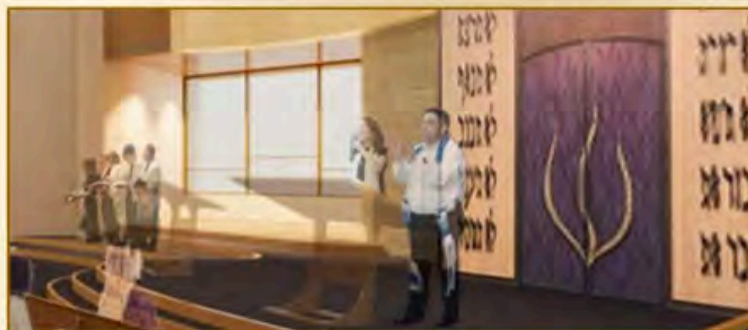

Rabbi's Message



In Pirkei Avot, Chapters of our Fathers, it is written in 4:14, "Rabbi Nehorai said, "Leave home and go to a place of Torah." It's hard to believe that people have been leaving their homes to pray, learn, and celebrate at Temple Beth David for over sixty years. Yes, over six decades where we began in a sanctuary. We have done much over the years and especially in this past one.

I am amazed by the work and investments of our staff, lay leaders, and volunteers. So many good people give of their time and resources to support our synagogue. And we have a lot to show for it. Our preschool, ECLC, has a waiting list. Our Jewish school continues to offer the best Jewish education that we can, in the hours that we have. We have a youth program for our 6th-12th graders. There's been a dynamic Young Professional group that involves young adults from Orange County, Long Beach, and even parts of Los Angeles. Our adult education continues to offer many areas of enrichment and learning. Social action inspires us with themed services based on kindness and understanding. And our Women of Beth David and Brotherhood do an outstanding job offering programs, service to the community, and fun social events for all. In addition, Programs has put on a wonderful second night seder, Pride Shabbat and enhanced themed Friday nights and Hanukkah.

Oh, I would be remiss if I didn't mention the music at Beth David. Our choir is very talented and committed to singing. We have a number of musicians who play on Choir night, Shabbat Alive, and at other gatherings. It is nice to see our children sing in the Junior choir. The Cantor's concert is always a highlight.

And sometimes we get creative with Shabbat and holidays. For a number of years, we continue to offer Body, Mind, and Spirit Shabbatot on select Saturday mornings as we walk and hike our way to celebrate our day of rest. Oh, and then there are our holiday celebrations. We are on a high during our High Holy Days with our music and prayers. Celebrating Sukkot outside in our sukkah sipping scotch is delightful. We love dancing with the Torahs during Simchat Torah. And the latkes at Hanukkah are delicious. Purim is creative fun every year. Passover is meaningful and then we count the days till Shavuot.

And so, people have been leaving their homes to come to our place of Torah for decades and it is here they have found a second home. Beth David is place for learning, community, and most of all, we are a family united throughout the years and generations. As we say when we conclude a book of Torah, Chazak, chazak, v'nitchazek; (strength, strength, we will be strengthened); may we go forth in our new sanctuary with our wonderful community, strongly, boldly into a great future.

BOARD UPDATE

President's Message Reflections...



As our 2023/2024 year comes to a close, so does my time as President of Beth David. It is hard to believe that my 4 years as President is coming to an end. It has been an incredible journey and we have accomplished so much together. This year, like the last three, our community has continued to operate at full steam, offering a broad range of activities and events that have deepened our connection with our Judaism and broadened our kinship throughout our community. In addition to our traditional events including the Hanukah and Purim carnivals and our Purim Shpiel, the Brotherhood and Women of Beth David organized many exciting events from "Two Jewish Dads and their Daughters," to speakers on health and the environment. The Cantor's concert was a roaring success. Beth David turned 60! The Rabbi held a series on Jewish Views on God. Once again, our Second Night Passover Seder was sold out, and in addition we had 25 members of Congregation B'nei Tzedek join us. I love that we open our hearts and include our neighbors.

This year we have also undertaken the huge project of renovating our sanctuary. Our community has come together and raised almost 90% of our goal. As I stand back and look at all the names of members and non-members who have donated, I am truly humbled by the generosity and commitment of our community. We have also faced significant hardships as Jews in the world this year. The attack by Hamas on Israel was nothing less than horrific, and the bonds of our community have provided much solace and support during this time. I was particularly humbled by the Compassion and Unity event spearheaded by Charlie Niederman, which pulled together psychologists, theologians and historians to help our community not only understand the historic significance of the war, but also help process the pain and fear that so many of us experience. This event was particularly special in that it drew strong attendance from our Beth David congregational community and also our extended Young Professional community.

This year, sadly, we lost Lois and Herb Abrams, the last of the original founders of Beth David. Our founders have given us so much to be grateful for – these losses are hugely significant and the vision and inspiration of Lois and Herb lives on in all that we do.

Looking back on 2023-2024, and indeed on all four years of my Beth David presidency, I owe immense gratitude to so many people. First, I have received incredible support and guidance from Beth David board members over the last four years. It has been an honor to serve on the board with each of you; thank you for supporting me, and for your commitment to Beth David. During my time as President, I often turned to Rabbi Myers for guidance. I continually valued her counsel, and through our conversations I consistently saw her unwavering commitment to our community. Thank you to each of you, for your commitment to our community, and for your willingness to share your thoughts and perspectives with me throughout my two terms. And last but not least, thank you to Edie Mino, who truly looks after the heart of Beth David.



As my second two-year term comes to an end, it has truly been an honor serving the Congregation as Brotherhood President the past four years. Ordinarily, I would be preparing to hand the reins to my successor, but we've been unable to find someone to replace me as President. In the interim, we will be

rotating the duties of President, with Jeff LeBoff serving as acting President in June and July, followed by Charlie Niederman in August and September. I will be the acting President in October and November, followed by Elliot Semmelman in December and January. We will work to ensure continuity, and I'm confident that the absence of a permanent President will not impact the programs and services the Brotherhood provides.

The Brotherhood has had another very productive year. We conducted five educational brunches, plus our annual Mother's Day brunch (more about that later). In addition, we organized a bowling event that included two other Brotherhoods, sponsored two baseball games, and put on a very entertaining fundraiser, Perry Goldstein's production of *Two Jewish Dads and Their Daughters*, among other things. My gratitude goes to the many volunteers who have helped make the Brotherhood successful.

Our two most recent brunches took place in March. On March 3, Meredith Burke, Community Security Director at Secure Community Network (SCN), gave a presentation on personal awareness, specifically how to recognize suspicious or potentially dangerous behavior and threats, and what to do about it. On March 31, award winning Los Angeles Times columnist Bill Shaikin, gave a very engaging presentation on all things baseball.

On March 24, we supported the Temple's Purim Carnival by barbecuing and serving food, including hamburgers, veggie burgers, chips, drinks, and Chinese chicken salad.

Our annual Mother's Day brunch took place on May 12, and it was attended by close to 60 people, the largest gathering for Mother's Day since before the pandemic. The Cantor and the Junior Choir gave a very entertaining performance, mimosas were served, and every Mother received a Rose. The following Sunday, May 19, we provided Jewish school students, their teachers and their parents with a last day of school barbecue.

Our next event will be a baseball game on August 3, when the Angels host the New York Mets. Please look for a flyer elsewhere in this Megillah. Tickets for the game are available on the Temple website.

There's a Goblin on the Ark by Susan Tarcov and illustrated by Mackinzie Rekers.

Behrman House, 2023.

The picture book is a story about animals forming friendships on the ark. It is also about conquering fear.

The Boy on the Wooden Box by Leon Leyson Antheneum books for Young Readers, 2013.

This book is a memoir by Leon Leyson about his childhood Krakow Poland. Then he goes on to talk about being one of Schindler's List people and being able to survive the Holocaust. This is a legacy of hope and a call for all of us to remember those who did not survive. This book won an award.

On the Doorposts of Your House edited by Chaim Stern. Central Conference of American Rabbis, 1994. A book of Reform Jewish prayers and blessings for all occasions. There is also a section of psalms, poems, and readings. There is a list of all the 54 sidrot into which the Torah is divided and for the corresponding haftaroth. This is a good book for home reference. There was a revised edition which came out in 2010. This book is now also available as an E-Book.

The Beth David Library now has about 1,520 books.

275 Middle Grade and Young Adult books are in the Youth Lounge

300 Adult Fiction and Nonfiction books are in the Youth Lounge.

94 Reference books are in the Rabbi's Office.



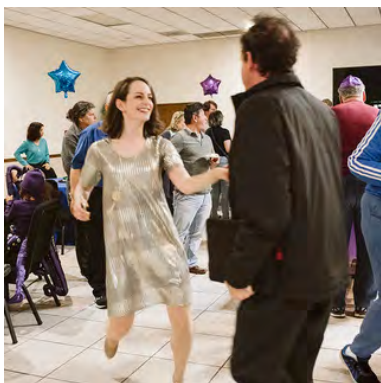
