FROM THE RABBI

Apples more important than you realize

Rabbi Myers' fall bulletin 2024



Oooh, there are so many varieties of apples from Honey Crisp, Delicious. Gala, Granny Smith, and Pink Lady, to name a few. They come different shades of green and red with tastes ranging from sweet to a touch of sour. Apples ripen in the fall and are the star accompaniment for the honey of our New Year. Dipping apples into this syrupy sweetness brings joy and an instant smile. Apples and honey remind us of our hopes for a sweet upcoming year. This time of new beginning brings our family, friends and community together for the sacred holiday of Rosh Hashanah.

Apples are mentioned many times in our tradition beyond the High Holy Days. In Song of Songs from the Bible, we see that it is under the apple tree that love and life blossoms. It is written, "Under the apple tree I roused you; It was there your mother conceived you, There she who bore you conceived you." (Chapter 8:5) And it states, "Let me lean against the stout trunks, let me couch among the apple trees: for I am sick with love." (Chapter 2:5)

Oh, this makes me want to take a big bite out of an apple but not like Eve did in the Garden of Eden. While many Renaissance paintings and frescos in Europe depict Eve succumbing to temptation and lustfully eating an apple, this was likely not the fruit mentioned in Genesis. The Hebrew in the Torah is, "peri haetz, fruit of the tree." It doesn't say apple, just 'fruit.' I think it was likely a fig because no one can resist a ripe juicy fig but anyways back to my topic of apples.

Fascinating, in the Talmud, our acceptance of Torah is compared to an apple tree. We learn that, "Rabbi Hama, son of Rabbi Hanina, said: What is the meaning of, "As an apple tree among the trees of the wood, so is my beloved among the sons. Under its shadow I delighted to sit and its fruit was sweet to my taste" (Song of Songs 2:3)? Why were the Jewish people likened to an apple tree? It is to tell you that just as this apple tree, its fruit grows before its leaves, so too, the Jewish people accorded precedence to "We will do" over "We will hear." (Shabbat 88a)

And so, because in our tradition we promised to follow God's commandments before they were revealed, we are like the fruit of an apple tree. The fruit of our acceptance comes first and it is because of our willingness to follow God, the Torah was given to our people in Sinai years ago. And how lucky we are for that. We have a precious tradition and heritage with meaningful holidays such as Rosh Hashanah that connect us with family, community, our history, and with God. And we get to eat tasty foods such as apples and honey.

And so, as I make my multi grain apple butter cake for our Jewish New Year, I will think about love, apples, family, and Torah. Hmmm... I can taste the crispness of apples right now. Wishing you all a very sweet new year.

President's Comments

High Holy Days 2024



There's a lot going on at this time of year. Our High Holy days usher in a time of prayer, introspection, renewal, and forgiveness and call for us to be even better people in the year ahead. Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur together comprise the Yomim Nora'im - the Days of Awe, during which our fates in the year ahead are decided on by God.

As a people we recognize that this past year has been one of unspeakable grief and sorrow. We will never forget the tragedies that occurred on October 7th, and the months since.

It does mean that we must push back against those that traffic in harsh words and even harsher deeds. I hope all of us find renewal of spirit in the weeks to come.

This has also been a time of renewal for Beth David. During the High Holy Days, come see our beautiful sanctuary, which while not complete yet, has been made new again, with the efforts of our entire congregation. There are so many exciting things happening here—Lunch and Learn with the Rabbi, you can study for your Bar or Bat Mitzvah through the Adult Bnei Mitzvah classes, Brotherhood is hosting a Billy Joel Tribute Band on October 27th, on November 16th we'll celebrate Rabbi Myers' 20th year as our rabbi, and there will be a Re-dedication event for our Sanctuary on January 29th. There will be many opportunities for adult learning, just look at the temple calendar on the website. Sukkot is coming and we'll celebrate with "Scotch and Schnapps" in the Sukkah on October 18th. Join us for "Shabbat ALIVE" on the third Friday of each month, and our Lay-Lead Minyan each Shabbat morning at 9:00 am in the Sanctuary. Max and the Not-So-Perfect Apology by Carl Harris Shuman published by Behrman House in 2024. This book travels back in time to the biblical story of Jacob and Esau. Years later Jacob apologizes to Esau. Max the storyteller then starts his own apologies to people he has hurt in his life. This is a perfect book for the High Holidays. This is a great book for younger children.

Maybe it Happened This Way: Bible Stories Reimagined by Leah Rachel Berkowitz and Erica Wovsaniker published by Apples and Honey Press in 2022. The authors used their imagination to make up new stories for familiar characters. This is to find new meaning in a very old book. This book is great for the Middle Grades.

Salt & Honey: Jewish Teens on Feminism, Creativity, & Tradition edited by Elizabeth Mandel with jGirls Magazine published by Behrman House in 2022. This book is a snapshot of lived experiences of Jewish teens. Each entry is from a different Jewish teen. Recipes, poems, and stories by teens. This book is great for Young Adults.

Anti-Semitism in America by Leonard Dinnerstein published by Oxford University Press in 1994. This is an independent scholarly study of antisemitism in the United States. This book represents an American history of antisemitism from the beginnings of Jewish people in this country until 1992. This is a great book for adults.

I went to the Association of Jewish Libraries annual convention in San Diego California the end of June. Being in the right place at the right time I came home with 14 free Jewish books from Behrman House and Apples and Honey Press. This publishing house was one of the exhibitors at the convention. Most of the books are picture books. There were also a few middle grade books and one teen book. I think there might have been one adult book in the take home.

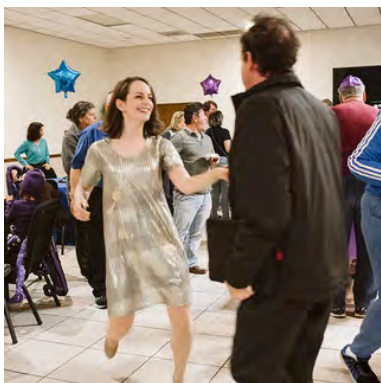
