FROM THE RABBI

The Beauty of Sukkot!



"A season is set for everything, a time for every experience under heaven."
Ecclesiastes 3:1

It is traditional during the holiday of Sukkot to read from the book of Ecclesiastes and ponder the significance of our lives. There are so many interesting sayings such as, "There is nothing new under the sun." (Eccl 1:9) We study this book of the

Bible as we lounge in our outdoor sukkahs (huts). Sukkot is such a beautiful holiday with the fragrance of the leemony etrog and the myrtle. Eating and studying in our sukkahs give us a chance to feel the breeze, admire the shapes of the clouds, and view some of the fruits and vegetables of the late harvest. Sukkot, coming five days after Yom Kippur, offers a reprieve from the formality of the sanctuary where we come outdoors and celebrate our history and connection to the environment.

For me as a rabbi, Sukkot is one of my favorite holidays. It's delightful to eat meals in the sukkah and enjoy the many decorations that adore it. Living in Southern California really allows one to truly enjoy this special holiday that lasts a week. The mitzvot, or commandments, connected with Sukkot include living in the succah, shaking the lulav and etrog, and enjoying our holiday. Sukkot is called 'Z'man simchateinu" a time of our rejoicing; this is why if it were to rain, we are not supposed to remain in the sukkah. Sitting outside in this temporary dwelling is supposed to be enjoyable. This is why the rabbis in the Talmud discuss at length that when the rain comes and "spoils one's soup," one should come inside in order to finish the meal.

At Beth David, we have a sukkah that is put up by the men of our Brotherhood every year. We encourage you to come and enjoy the beauty of this holiday. Sukkot begins on Monday night, October 6. Starting at six p.m., people bring their own dinners to enjoy eating in and around the sukkah. Then at 7:00 p.m., we have short yet meaningful Sukkot service followed by an oneg outside. The Friday night Shabbat service during Sukkot will feature a, "Scotch and Schapps in the Sukkah," immediately following the service. On Saturday morning, October 11, we will have a Torah study at 9:00 a.m. where we will read the book of Ecclesiastes and discuss its message for today. All are welcome!

During the week of Sukkot, I encourage you to come by, sip a cup of coffee in our sukkah, shake the lulav, and experience the tranquility and beauty of this wonderful holiday. There is indeed a set time for every experience under heaven. The second week of October is our set time to rejoice and celebrate Sukkot.



In my year as president of our congregation's Board of Trustees, I can see ways in which we can better serve our community. I look at Keri Gee Semmelman and Anne Katz's work on "re-JEW-venating" our "Caring Community Initiative", and I think the work they and their committee are doing, working to help our members in need with a ride, a meal, or a phone call, and see a way in which we ALL can make our world a better place.

There is so much we can do to improve the world we live in, and it all starts with us. I'm not going to recite the usual list of things we need to fix, you probably know those already. We just need to remember to share a kind word with another, make connections with others, assume innocence in our conversations and work for a kinder world.

One great opportunity is coming very soon. Our pending merger with Congregation B'nai Tzedek will bring us together with many new families, ideas, and give us a chance to be better together than we've ever been. As a bigger, blended congregation, we can do so many things that weren't possible before. There will be more members for the Choir, Brotherhood, Women of Beth David, more kids in the Jewish School, more volunteers and more friends to meet and build relationships with.

Our Merger Steering Committee is working through the issues that arise from coming together. We will continue as one congregation, here at the Beth David campus. CBT's building will be sold. Cantor Jenna Sagan, who grew up here at Beth David will join Rabbi Nancy Myers and Cantorial Soloist Nancy Linder on our bimah. Edie Mino, Larry Matalon, Robin Harrison will stay on in their current capacities. We will work on new name for our congregation. I know that will be hard for some folks, but I see a chance in it to reinvent and reinvigorate ourselves for a changing world in which we all thrive.

We plan to have a congregation to vote on the merger and new constitution in November. Presuming the vote passes, we will merge in a legal sense on July 1, 2026. There are decisions still to be made after November, as well as legal matters to handle. Hopefully, in about a year, we will celebrate the High Holy Days with a larger congregation, and a bright future. Let's all get ready for the new year of 5786.



As the summer winds down, the Brotherhood will be gearing up for an eventful fall season. We had a very successful membership barbecue on August 17. Attendance was close to 70 people, the largest crowd to attend in my recollection, and it included members of Congregation B'nai Tzedek. We provided the delicious entrées of tri-tip, chicken, and veggie burgers, beverages, and garlic bread, and congregants brought salads, side dishes, and desserts to share. Many thanks to the many Brotherhood volunteers who assisted in this effort, including Jerryold Korn, Leonard Silberman, Robert Laham, Greg Korduner, Dan Gary, Jeff LeBoff, Howard Tobey, Jim Michaeloff, Rick Katz, Charlie Niederman, new member Josh Ehrlich, and Mulu Harrison.

The first day of Jewish School is September 7, which is just around the corner, and the Brotherhood, as is its custom, will be commemorating the day with a barbecue for the students, their teachers, and their families.

Erev Sukkot is on October 6, and the Brotherhood will once again be supporting the Temple by erecting the Sukkah, which will be the site of the Temple's annual potluck dinner, and a Scotch and Schnapps event with the Rabbi following a Shabbat service. We will be assembling the Sukkah on the afternoon of October 4, and are seeking volunteers to help with this effort. Please let me know if you have a truck to help us transport the palm fronds from the home of Gail and Ian Chait in Seal Beach to the Temple on Friday, October 3.

Please mark your calendars! On Sunday, October 26, the Brotherhood is sponsoring a tribute band concert and barbecue that you don't want to miss. The barbecue includes a choice of a hot dog, hamburger, or veggie burger, plus coleslaw and dessert, for \$15. It will start at 12:30 p.m. and the concert begins at 2 p.m. The concert will include two tribute bands rolled into one. "Woodie and the Longboards" will perform as the Beach Boys, and following an intermission, "Heartache Tonight" will perform as the Eagles. Tickets are \$40 for general admission and \$60 for reserved seating. There will also be three sponsorships available that include food, and group discounts are also available. Details are in the flyer available in the Shavua Tov and elsewhere in this edition of the Megillah.

Plans are already underway for our annual Chanukah Carnival, which will take place on November 16. Look for information about it in the coming weeks in the Shavua Tov.

The Brotherhood is the proud recipient of three MRJ awards this year: the Irving Richman Award in recognition of outstanding Adult Jewish Educational Programming, the Stuart Aaronson Award in recognition of Outstanding General Programming, and the J. Jacques Stone Award for Service to the Temple.




