

FROM THE RABBI

Thank you for my sabbatical



Sabbaticals for congregational rabbis are, first and foremost, to stave off burnout. Doing congregational work is, indeed, very rewarding but can also be very stressful. For rabbis like myself, who intend to continue many years in this role, a sabbatical is crucial for mental and physical well-being. I recall, ten years ago, when I came back from my first sabbatical is to get my neck and back to relax and to release the stress that I have been holding on to for so long.

Secondly, I never like to waste time, as many of you know, and so I intend to write another novel. I really want to be a good writer and the only way to do so, is well, to write. I learned a lot about the process of writing ten years ago in my first attempt at creative writing. I now know the steps I need to take and I'm excited to give it another go. Hopefully, this next one will come to fruition quicker than the last one. During my six months, I hope to get the story 'out' of me and integrate my brother's initial critique. And then when I am back, I hope to use my day off to continue the editorial process with both volunteer and professional assistance.

I realize the timing of my sabbatical isn't ideal with a merger on the horizon, however, afterwards it will be impossible for me to take any substantial time off for many years. In the meantime, while I am away, Rabbinical student Robin Harrison and Cantor Linder will cover my primary responsibilities. They will lead holiday and Shabbat services with the support of volunteers. Both Cantor and Robin are deeply caring and committed to the well-being of our community. They will provide excellent pastoral care to you in times of hardship and loss. We also have amazing lay leaders who will assist and continue to ensure that the Temple is there for you in every way.

And so, I just want to say, "Thank you." Thank you for giving me this needed time away. I am so proud of our synagogue and I look forward to serving our community for many, many years to come.



Live Your Dreams: the story of a Jewish Basketball all star by Tamir Goodman PJ Publishing 2025.


One Little Goat: a Passover catastrophe by Dara Horn Norton Young Readers 2025 Middle Grades

Finding Forgiveness: a Slichot story by Rebecca Gardyn Lexington Farrar, Straus, Giroux 2025.


And Eddie had an egg by Dina Leifer Green Bean Books 2025.
