



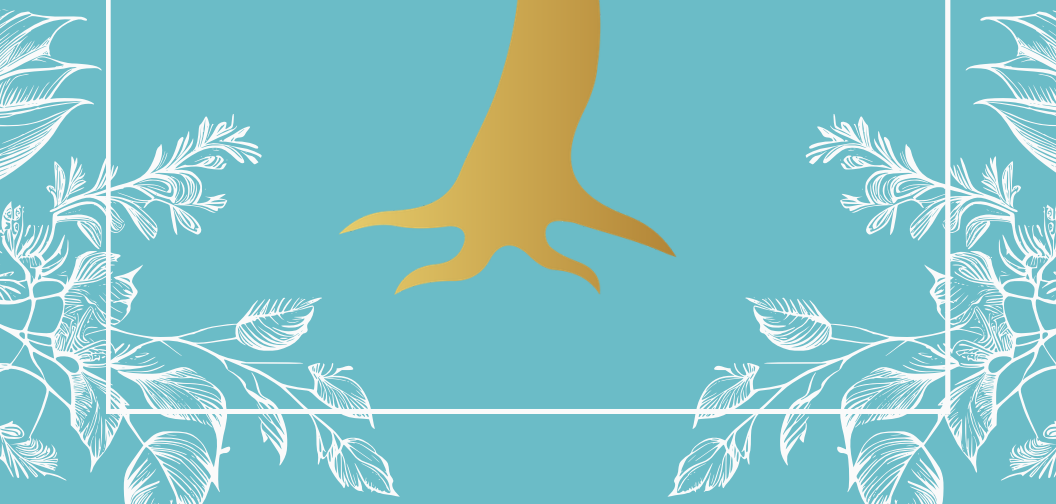
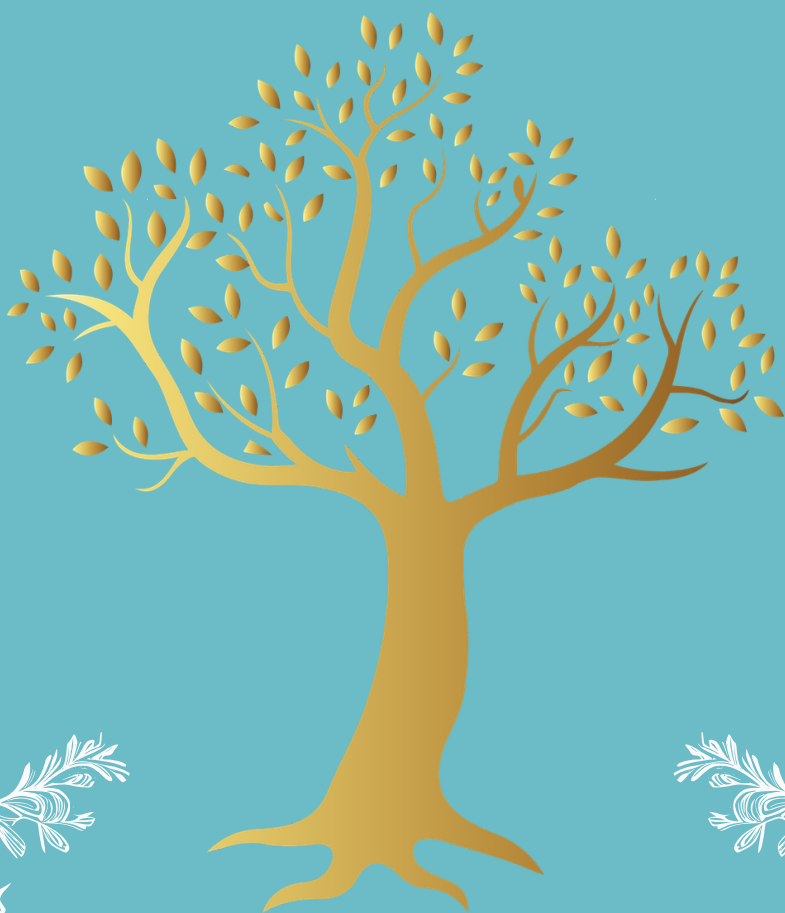

Meet at the north end of Bolsa Chica State Beach

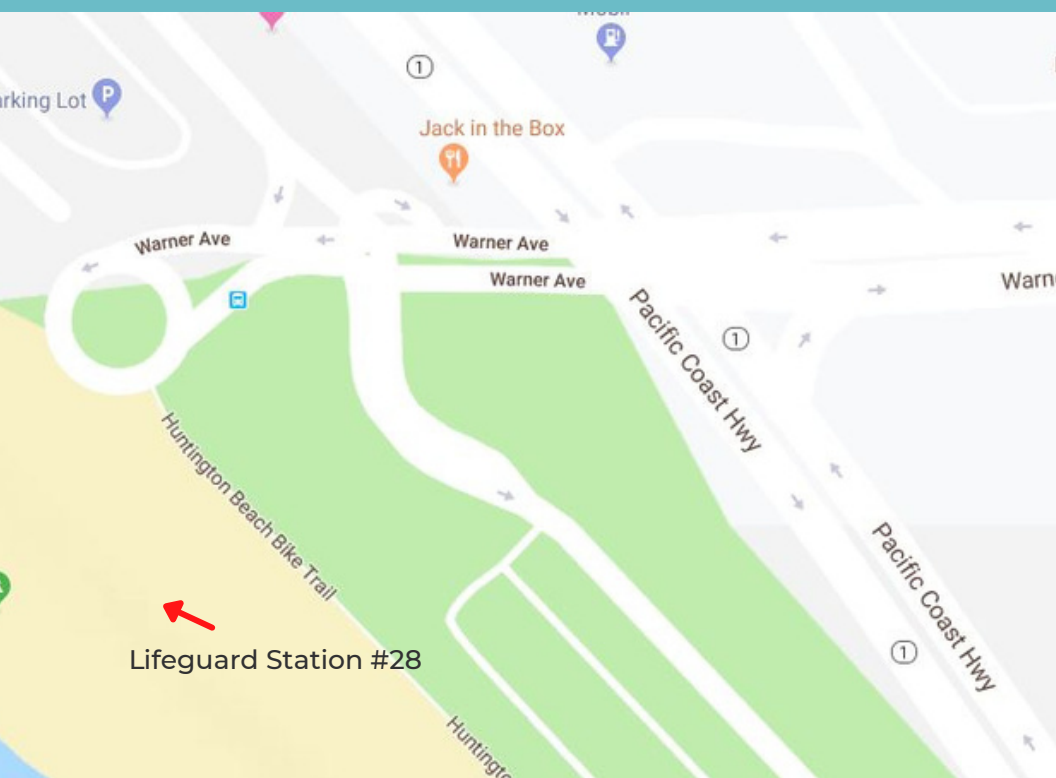

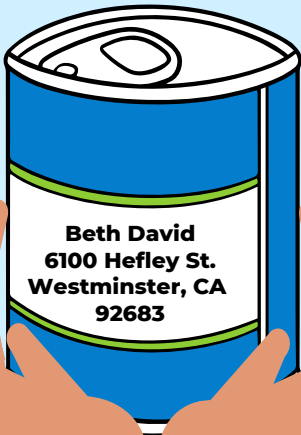
LETS FEED THE HUNGRY

MORE INFORMATION

Name Badges / High Holy Day Tickets

A name badge will be here for each adult family member and child over the age of 13 living at home and listed on your High Holy Day Ticket Form. Please be prepared to show your name badge to the usher when entering the Sanctuary. Name badges for other non-member families may be purchased prior to the holidays for \$175 per adult and \$85 per child (ages 13-21). Non-member name badges are available for \$350/adult and \$150/child (ages 13-21).

Parking

Safety is a serious issue when we have so many people coming and going during High Holy Days. Please park head-in in all stalls. Also, please respect the designated parking spaces, including disabled spaces in both the Temple and church parking lot. Do not park in areas blocked by orange cones and please do not park at the condos across the street.

Seating

Seating is on a first come basis other than our Circle of Honor Reserved seating. We respectfully request that you not save seats, as this puts the ushers in a difficult position. They are requested to fill all seats as the congregation arrives.

If you wish to worship in a Reform Synagogue in the USA or Canada, and are a member in good standing, we encourage you to call the Temple office at (714) 892-6623, and request an "Out of Town Courtesy Form," so that arrangements can be made for you to worship at another Reform congregation. 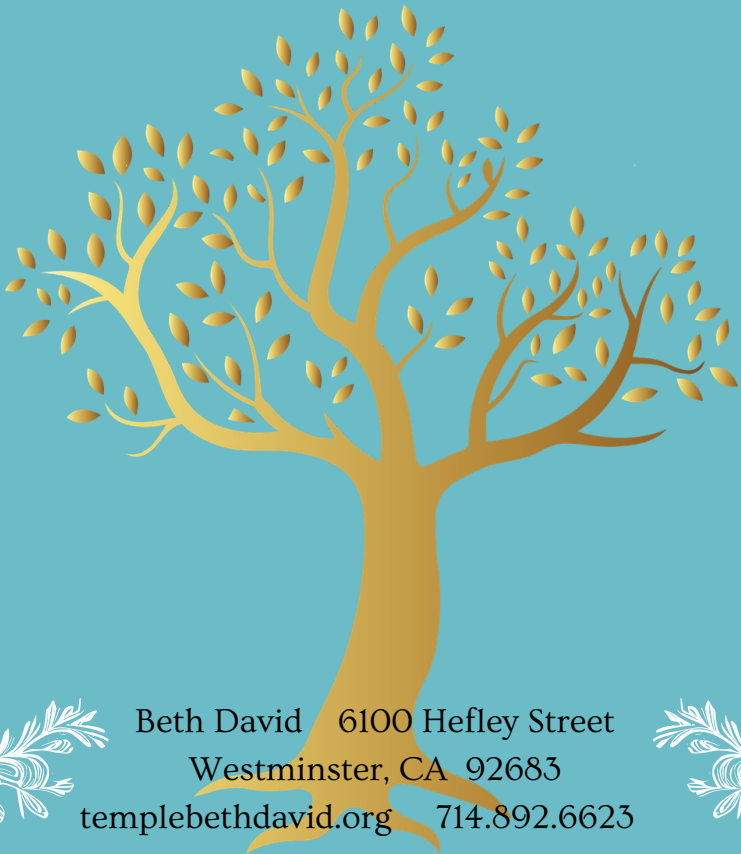
